- Introductions completed and signature sheet distributed.
- Agenda reviewed and minutes approved.
- Bob Miller announced he would meet with the State Hospital Directors to discuss the development of a work plan. (Jan. 26th)
- Bob Miller announced that Mike Morris, Mike Moore and Margaret Thiele will do the initial work for the revisions of the MH rule. They are forming workgroups and making staff assignments.
- Bob Miller distributed a draft of the Administrative Rule Changes Project Plan, committee members reviewed and discussed.
 - Discussion regarding the elimination of the prevention rule included concerns that no rule may imply lack of importance and reduction in or elimination of funding. Statues would remain in place and may protect against decreases in funding.
 - There will be an advisory committee of stakeholders and consumers for each rule change.
 - Incorporation of other accrediting agencies/organizations requirements into State rules will reduce redundancy.
 - If anyone has an interest in a particular rule and/or advisory committee, contact the responsible person listed on the project plan.
- OMHAS has contracted with NFATTC (Northwest Frontier Addiction Technology and Transfer Center) to provide internal and external trainings for Technical Assistance. One training is in January and another in Feb.
- Bob Miller distributed a copy of the GOI. It is posted on the DHS/OMHAS/EBP website.
- Kathy Tomlin presented on implementing best practices based on Everett Rogers “Diffusion of Innovations: Sample Implementation Ideas” book.
- C.J. Reid presented on the development of the new corrections rule.

- This rule will be for correction facilities that are licensed by the state.
- Clients in correction facilities are assessed by placement criteria based on the six components of the Oregon Accountability Model (DOC). The higher the risk of these components the more potential they have to be in treatment.
- Treatment requirements in institutional setting may be 6-20 hours of clinical work.
- OMHAS may look at developing a rule for the adolescent criminal justice area. The rule would incorporate and address staff qualifications.
- C.J. Reid is developing a co-occurring rule. She is meeting with past task force members and others in the community. She has written a discussion paper which will be presented to management staff .
- **Action Recommended:**
 - Bob Miller to meet with State Hospital Directors to develop project plan. (Jan.26)
 - Add contact numbers of responsible person on administrative rule project plan.
 - Provide OMHAS program contact list at next meeting and post on the web.
 - CJ Reid to meet with internal stakeholders workgroup to discuss Co-occurring rule.
