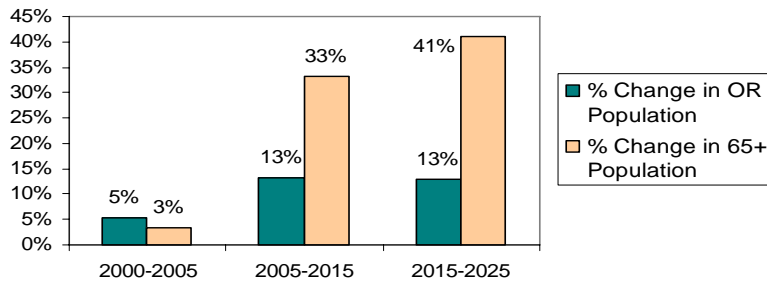

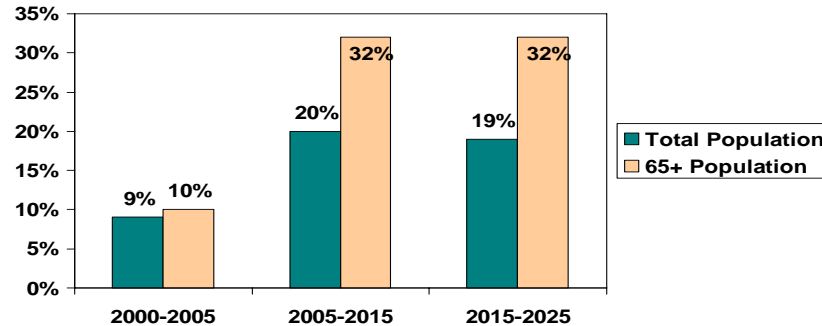

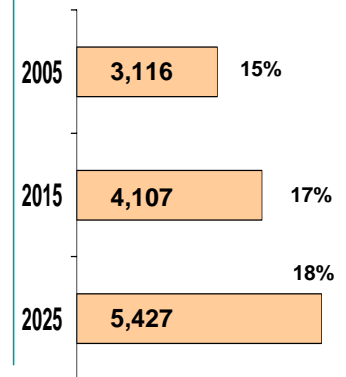
### Growth Rate of Oregon's Aging Population



### Growth Rate Of Crook County's Aging Population

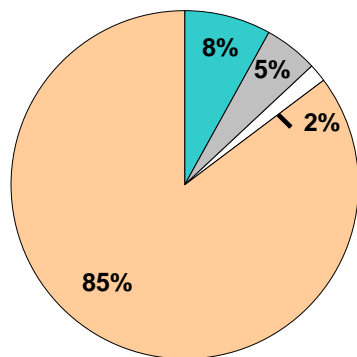


### Crook County Projected 65+ Population and % of general population

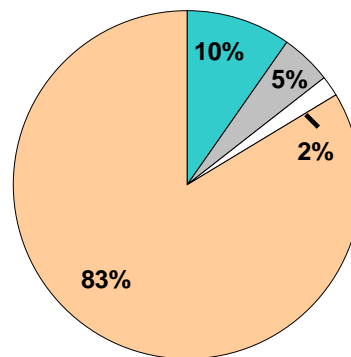

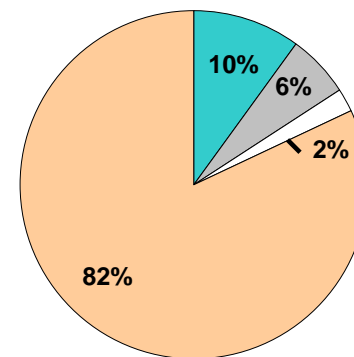

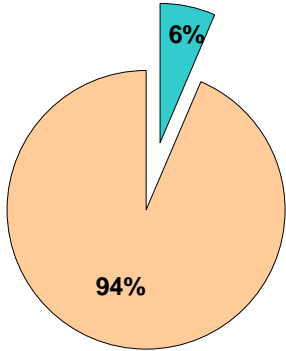

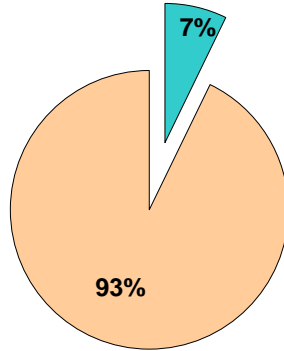

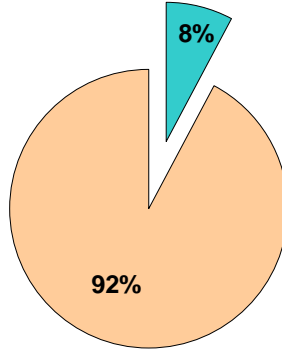

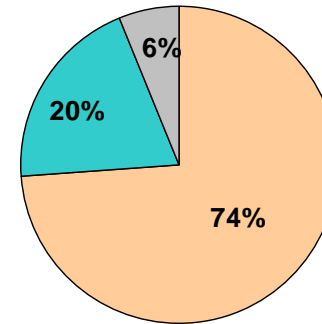

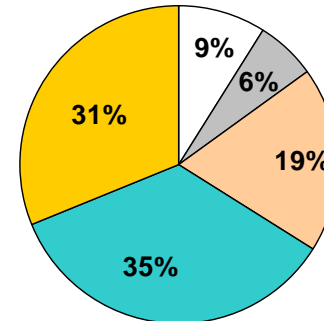
### National % of Seniors Needing Assistance Due to Disability

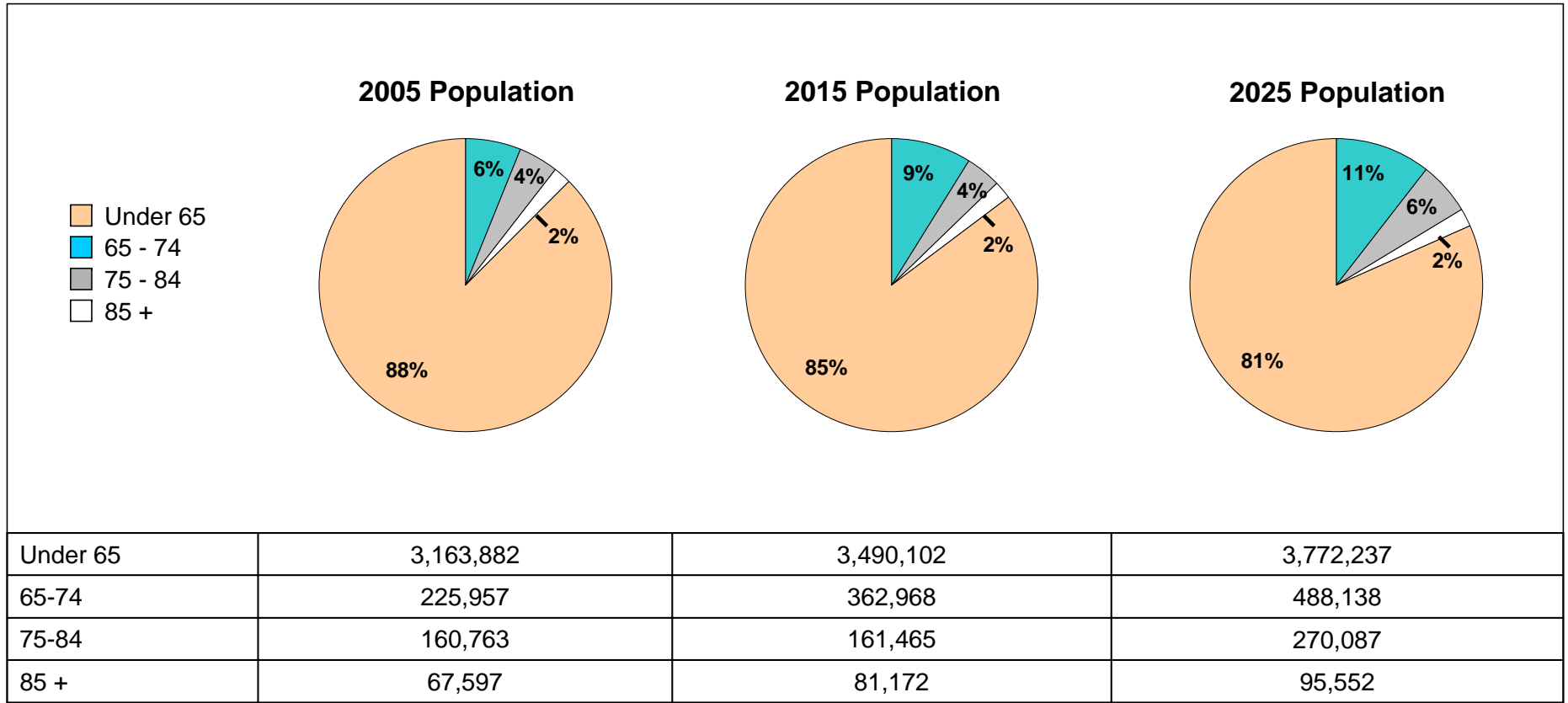
### National % of Seniors and Federal Poverty Level (Monthly Income)
