Overview: TRACK 1. EXTRICATION – Instructed by members of Dallas Oregon Fire Department. This course will include classroom and various techniques for practical extrication. This class meets Rescue and Extrication Tools and Vehicle Extrication and Special Rescue of NFPA FF II, and some components of NFPA Vehicle and Rescue Tech. Full PPE is required.

TRACK 2. LIVE FIRE – This class is intended for newer firefighters with little or no time in live fire conditions.

The class will use one of Baker City's Mobile Fire Training Units (MFTU) MFTUs were acquired using AFG grant funding and are a great resource for training operations using multiple props in safe environments. At Fall Fire School, we will concentrate on low heat entry, room and contents involvement, concealed space recognition, door entry techniques, nozzle control, and other initial hose line evolutions. Instructed by D. Blair and R. Desimini Prerequisites: Entry level FF or FFI (this will satisfy the live fire requirement of FFI) PPE must be in serviceable condition, and all DPSST requirements for live fire training must be maintained (i.e. facial hair) NFPA 1403 will be in effect. Students are required to bring PPE, SCBA, and one spare bottle. Knee pads are suggested.

TRACK 3. LEADERSHIP AND COMMAND – A GUIDE TO A SUCCESSFUL INCIDENT – This course is designed to help the firefighter or company officer confidently set up and lead an emergency incident. The student will learn and develop the skills necessary to step into the initial Incident Commander's position. Through both classroom material and practical exercises the student will learn and use the basic skills required of the initial IC. The practical exercises will challenge the student and build the skills needed to concentrate on the "big picture". Your instructors, Captain Emmitt Cornford and Firefighter Chancy Ferguson from LaGrande City Fire Department will be bringing 40 years of both rural and suburban experience to this course.
