## Public Safety Officer Exemption From Record Disclosure F-2724

In 2005 and 2008, the Oregon Legislative Assembly passed legislation making a change to Oregon’s public records law. These changes have provided the opportunity for Oregon’s public safety officers to request that their personal information be protected from public disclosure.

Effective March 11, 2008, ORS 192.501 includes the following:

**“The following public records are exempt from disclosure under ORS 192.410 to 192.505 unless the public interest requires disclosure in the particular instance. . . (31)(b) If requested by a public safety officer, as defined in ORS 181.610, the home address and home telephone number of the public safety officer contained in records of the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training.”**

This law allows public safety officers to protect the above information from disclosure if a public agency such as DPSST receives a public records request. However, each officer who wishes the exemption to apply must specifically request it. DPSST has created this form for that purpose.

According to the provisions of ORS 192.501(31)(b):

I request that my home address and home telephone number be exempt from disclosure by the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training.
