CONTINUING EDUCATION GUIDELINES

The Board does not pre-approve continuing education courses at this time. Here are guidelines to help you decide whether a particular course will meet the Board's administrative rules. Your course will likely be approved if you can answer 'yes' to these questions.

Does the course increase your skills in one or more of the following areas?

- * Theory and techniques of counseling or marriage and family therapy
- * Human development and family studies
- * Social and cultural foundations in counseling or marriage and family therapy
- * The helping relationship
- * Group dynamics in counseling
- * Lifestyle and career development
- * Diagnostic appraisal/assessment of individuals
- * Research and evaluation
- * Professional orientation and ethics
- * Professional supervision training
- * Disability and life transitions
- * Ethics and professional orientation

Does the course fit with the needs of your clients?

Is the course at least one clock hour?

If it is not a distance learning course, is the class offered in a place which is accessible to persons with disabilities?

If it is a distance learning course, can the course include mechanism for evaluation, measurement, or confirmation of exchange of information

Will you have documentation of your attendance, participation, certification, or completion as well as content, duration with:

- * Academic transcripts;
- * Dated certificates (originals or copies) of completion of training;
- * Program/activity descriptions, including (but not limited to) written verification of professional services, copies of published works or other proof of publication, letter from president/director of organization in which professional activity was conducted.

- * Signed statement of professional supervision by the individual providing the supervision.

If you attend a conference, does the conference sponsor provide continuing education credits?
