Sex Offender Treatment Board: Member Biographies

Dr. William W. Davis, Chair – Dr. Davis has been in private practice as a counselor since 1976, as a psychologist since 1998, and has been working in the evaluation and treatment of sex offenders since 1985. He is currently the past president of the Oregon Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers and remains on that organization's Board of Trustees. He currently practices in Salem, Oregon at Mid-Valley Counseling Center. Dr. Davis holds a Master's degree in Counseling Psychology from Chapman University, as well as Master's and Doctor of Psychology (Psy.D) degrees in Clinical Psychology from Western Conservative Baptist Seminary.

Donald Didier, Vice Chair – Mr. Didier currently is licensed in the State of Oregon as a Clinical Social Worker. He is founder and previous director of the alternative school, Lents Education Center, before working for the Morrison Center for Youth and Family Services as a family therapist and program director for delinquency, sex offender and alcohol and drug programs. Mr. Didier has served since 1988 as executive director of the Youth Progress Association (YPA), a residential care program for young adults. He has served on the boards of the Institute of Addiction Studies, the Oregon Adolescent Sex Offender Treatment Network and currently serves on the State National Association of Social Workers board and is an alternative on the National Ethics Committee of the National Association of Social Workers. Didier received his Master's of Social Work in 1980.

Dr. Jane Allen – Since 2001, Dr. Allen has worked at Linn County Mental Health in the Children's Outpatient Program and the Juvenile Sex Offender Treatment Program. She has worked closely with both juvenile departments and the Oregon Youth Authority, in addition to consultation and planning with therapeutic foster care provider (s). Dr. Allen is a member of the American Psychological Association, Oregon Psychological Association, and Oregon Adolescent Sex Offender Treatment Network. She holds a Bachelor's of Arts degree from Washington College in Maryland with a dual degree, as a Humanities major, and Education minor; a Master's of Arts (M.A.) in School Guidance from the University of Central Florida; and an M.A. in Psychology and a Psy.D. in Clinical Psychology from Florida Institute of Technology.

Dr. Steven E. Mussack – Dr. Mussack has assessed and treated sex offenders since 1980 and has served in a wide range of positions, including Co-Founder, Eugene Family Institute and Eugene Center for Family Development; and founder and Director of CHOICES Sexual Offender Treatment Program in Eugene in 1984, and since 2002, Director of CHOICES in Salem. He has also been a consultant and expert witness, published numerous professional articles and has been a member of several professional associations. He co-founded the Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers (ASTA) and served on the ATSA's board of directors for 14 years. Dr. Mussack has provided training to therapy interns in sex offender treatment since 1988 and has been licensed as a psychologist since 1989. He received a Bachelor's of Arts in Psychology from the University of Nebraska in 1975; an M.A. in Counseling Psychology, University of Oregon, 1983; and a Doctor of Philosophy, Counseling Psychology, University of Oregon, 1988.

Debra Patterson – Ms. Patterson has worked in the juvenile justice field for 30 years. The first 10 years she served as a probation counselor, carrying a caseload of felony and misdemeanor probationers, as well as assisting in protective service investigations and handling dependency cases. Since 1987, Ms. Patterson has served as the director of the Crook County Juvenile Department. In 2003, Oregon received two Juvenile Sex Offender Management grants for which Ms. Patterson participated on the steering committees for both the Oregon Youth Authority/ODDA grant and the Crook, Deschutes, Jefferson counties grant. She is a member of the Crook County Commission on Children and Family; Oregon Juvenile Department Director's Association Treasurer; Past Chair of The Central and Eastern Oregon Juvenile Justice Consortium; member of the Governor's Public Safety Committee; and a board member of Juvenile Court Resources. She received her Bachelor's degree from the University of Oregon.

Patrick Schreiner – Mr. Schreiner has served as a Sex Offender Probation and Parole Officer and helped establish the Statewide Sex Offender Supervision Network (SOSN), for which he chaired the SOSN's first Risk Assessment Committee. Since 2003, he has served as statewide liaison for the Oregon Association of Community Corrections Directors with the SOSN workgroup. Mr. Schreiner received a Bachelor's of Science in Criminology from Southern Oregon University in 1978.

Brie Akins – Ms. Akins has worked in the victim's advocacy and prevention services fields, serving as the Prevention Program Coordinator for the Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force since 2005. She previously worked as Interim Crisis Services Coordinator and Crisis Support Worker at Wellington Sexual Abuse Help Foundation in Wellington, New Zealand; Tutor, Criminology 318: Special Topic – Sexual Violence, Victoria University of Wellington; Volunteer Coordinator, Domestic Violence Services and Sexual Assault Program Coordinator, Portland Women's Crisis Line; and Coordinator of Sexual Assault Services, Alternatives to Violence of the Palouse, Pullman, WA, and Moscow, ID. Ms. Akins also served as a Crisis Line Volunteer, Wellington Women's Refuge; and on the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Funding Advisory Board, Oregon Department of Justice, Crime Victims Assistance Section, among other related experience. She received a Bachelor's of Arts in Sociology, Washington State University, Pullman, WA; and a Master's of Arts in Sociology from Victoria University in Wellington.
