Passage of House Bill 3233 in the 2007 Oregon Legislative Session established the **Sex Offender Treatment Board (SOTB)** within the **Oregon Health Licensing Agency (OHLA)**. HB 3233 was signed into law by Governor Ted Kulongoski on July 27, 2007. Oregon Law 2007, Chapter 841, Sections 1-12 (formerly HB 3233) will be compiled into Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) in 2008.

This is an overview of the Sex Offender Treatment Board's goals, schedule and membership for 2008.

SOTB Information: Initial Meeting

The SOTB held its first meeting on Friday, November 30, 2007. Oregon Health Licensing Agency (OHLA) staff provided an overview of the agency during a new board member orientation that included a viewing of OHLA's board member orientation video and a review of the member handbook, which describe the roles and responsibilities of volunteer citizen board and council membership.

OHLA Director Susan K. Wilson noted that the SOTB is a high profile statewide program supported by both the Governor and Attorney General. OHLA was selected as the regulatory authority because the agency offers an existing infrastructure and professional staff to respond, develop and coordinate treatment roles with county and statewide criminal and juvenile justice organizations while maintaining a regulatory process that is cost-effective and accountable.

Sex Offender Treatment Board: Rulemaking & Schedule

Administrative Rulemaking

OHLA will be consulting with the SOTB to develop administrative Rules (OARs) specific to the sex offender therapist profession.

OHLA's overarching administrative rules related to general administrative, licensing and enforcement matters will apply to the SOTB and the sex offender therapist profession – as these same overarching rules apply to all other OHLA volunteer citizen boards and councils and OHLA-regulated professions.

In 2008, the SOTB will be working with OHLA to determine specific regulatory requirements in the following areas:

- **General Administration** – Definitions, fees, administration of program
- **Qualifications & Training**
- **Licensing and Renewal Requirements**
- **Continuing Education**
- **Code of Professional Conduct** – Practice standards, right to practice, client confidentiality
- **Model Treatment Plan** – For adults, juveniles and developmentally disabled
- **Discipline & Enforcement** – Violations of standards, civil penalties for violations of rules and laws

Board Meetings, Rulemaking Schedule

Administrative rulemaking is a public process and all stakeholders and interested parties are invited to participate. Following is a schedule of public rulemaking fact-finding meetings in 2008:

Licensing Information

Until OHLA, in consultation with the SOTB, adopts initial administrative rules, individuals interested in applying for licensure should familiarize themselves with the general requirements specified in Oregon Laws 2007, Chapter 841, Sections 1-12 (formerly HB 3233).

Clinical sex offender therapists must have a minimum of a master's degree in the behavioral sciences and an active Oregon mental health professional license, or equivalent, to be certified in Oregon.

They are also required to have had a minimum of 2,000 hours of direct clinical contact with sex offenders within not less than three years nor more than six years prior to application. Clinical contact includes:

- 1,000 hours of direct treatment services
- 500 hours of evaluations
- A minimum of 60 hours of formal training applicable to sex offender treatment and evaluation, achieved within the three years prior to application

Associate sex offender therapists must have a minimum of a bachelor's degree in the behavioral sciences and be under the direct supervision of a clinical sex offender therapist to be certified in Oregon. They are also required to have had:

- A minimum of 1,000 hours of direct clinical contact with sex offenders
- A minimum of 30 hours of formal training applicable to sex offender treatment, achieved within the three years prior to application

Continuing Education

The following continuing education requirements must be completed as a condition of license renewal:

- Have a minimum of 100 hours of clinical experience during the preceding year, 50 of which shall be direct clinical contact with sex offenders
- Have completed a minimum of 15 hours continuing education in the field of sex offender treatment during the preceding year

Authorizing Laws & Rules

This program exists under the regulatory oversight of the Oregon Health Licensing Agency (OHLA). Sex Offender Treatment Board (SOTB) profession-specific regulations are currently in Oregon Laws 2007, Chapters 1-12 (formerly House Bill 3233 and to be compiled into Oregon Revised Statutes, or ORS, in 2008) and link to OHLA's overarching statutes (ORS 676.605-676.625, 679.992) and rules (OAR 331, Divisions 1-30) for all OHLA-regulated professions.
