- Call to order and note of attendance

    Chairperson's comments: Hsu, M.
- Discussion of rules regarding SB1008 division 33 rules as it correlates to ORS144397 "we had a public hearing on these rules already and got feedback by a Variety of stakeholders, and the public, and after considering all of the statements that were made, these are the rules that I am proposing we make amendments to."
- 255.033.0020 subsection 2 Changed verbiage of last sentence from "For scheduling purposes the Board will add time" to "Board may add time" citing only to the juvenile 144397 statute and not the other statutes that relate to other types of hearings for ordering psychological evaluations
- Technical fix 255.033.0030 subsection 5 we are making it more explicit that these factors corelate with ORS144397 subsection 7 as to what we are considering these factors for. We are adding criteria L (suggestion made by ODAA) "The person in parole would not be a threat to the safety of the victim, the victim's family, or the community, and would comply with release conditions." These are the same standards that would be applied for a second look hearing.
- Technical fix After consulting with DOJ –255.033.0040 we are listing each cross referenced rule by the totality of the citation number- we did decide it would be appropriate to list

provisions about victims' rights in subsection b. Subsection c to this match the statute for **ORS**144397 — this language is listed now. Under subsection D we are making sure that the language is the same for the statute for an appointment of attorney — specifically that we are removing criteria that the Board may only appoint if an AIC is without sufficient funds.

 No comments from board – board moved to unanimously adopt these rules and concluded the public meeting.
