Overview of Temporary Rulemaking

- On May 19, 2022, the Environmental Quality Commission adopted the fee increases proposed in the 2022 Asbestos Fee Rulemaking.
- While the fee tables presented to EQC were correct, and the narrative reflected four types of fee increases, the redline document for the rules placed on public notice, approved by the commission and filed with Secretary of State omitted two types of fees: asbestos worker and supervisor certifications, and abatement contractor licensing.
- DEQ proposes a temporary rulemaking to implement the intended, but accidentally omitted, fee increases for these categories
