Climate Pollution Reduction Grants

- \$5 billion from federal Inflation Reduction Act of 2022
- “Grants to states, local governments, tribes, and territories to develop and implement plans for reducing greenhouse gas emissions” –EPA
- Phase 1: \$250 million for developing CPRG planning grants
- Phase 2: \$4.6B for implementing those plans



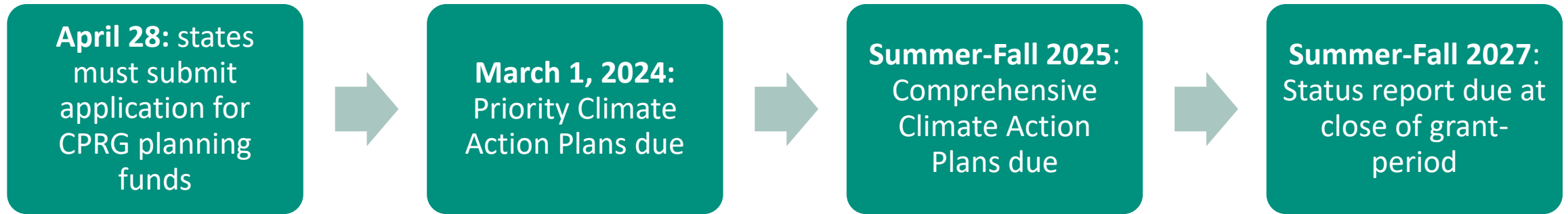
Funding for CPRG Planning

- \$3 million for each state
- \$1 million for large metropolitan areas
 - Portland/Hillsboro/Vancouver only large enough in Oregon
- \$TBD for tribal governments



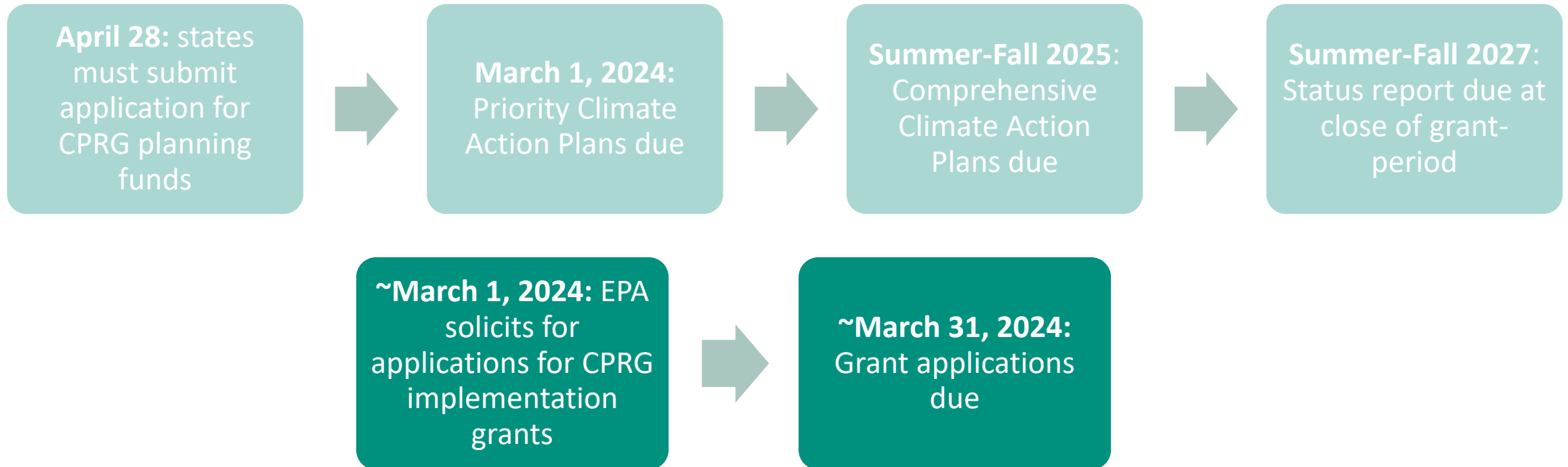
States' CPRG Planning & Timeline

Oregon's Priority Climate Action Plan



- Start from existing Oregon climate plans, such as Global Warming Commission's recent Roadmap to 2030
- Build upon that with input from across state government, local governments, community organizations, and Oregon Tribes
 - Coordinate with Metro to align with their Portland metropolitan PCAP



Oregon's Comprehensive Climate Action Plan

Comprised of 4 elements:

- Oregon Statewide Energy Strategy
- Gap analysis
- Natural & working lands carbon inventory
- Continued community engagement to identify barriers for EJ communities in accessing clean energy
