



# Environmental threat rating





### **National Response Center**

The National Response Center (NRC) [2] is a part of the federally established National Response System and staffed 24 hours a day by the U.S. Coast Guard. It is the designated federal point of contact for reporting all oil, chemical, radiological, biological and etiological discharges into the environment, anywhere in the United States and its territories. The NRC also takes maritime reports of suspicious activity and security breaches within the waters of the United States and its territories.

#### Report an Oil or Chemical Spill

Contact the National Response Center at: 800-424-8802.

Reports to the NRC activate the <u>National Contingency Plan</u> and the federal government's response capabilities. It is the responsibility of the NRC staff to notify the pre-designated <u>On-Scene Coordinator</u> assigned to the area of the incident and to collect available information on the size and nature of the release, the facility or vessel involved, and the party(ies) responsible for the release. The NRC maintains reports of all releases and spills in a national database.

# Community impact rating


- Poses a threat to indigenous cultural resources
- Disproportionately impacts disadvantaged communities
- Has a severe impact on a local economy





## **Volatility rating**

The instability of a vessel's situation and the tendency for it to change for the worse




# **Nuisance rating**



# Compounding factors

Unique characteristics that intensify existing concern



# DSL-specific considerations

Is the vessel located on an Oregon-owned waterway?

Is the vessel trespassing against the state and the people of Oregon?

Is the vessel inhibiting the Department's ability to fulfill its management obligations?
