
What We Do On behalf of Oregonians across the state, the Oregon Department of Energy achieves its mission by providing:

- Energy Programs and Activities



- 21 fires
- 1.07 million acres burned
- More than 5,000 structures destroyed

RULE AMENDMENTS

- 330-260-0050(2)(c)
 - If manufactured before January 1, 2023, the heat pump system must have a baseline efficiency of 9.0 HSPF, SEER of 14, and be properly sized to the structure.
 - If manufactured on or after January 1, 2023, the heat pump system must have a baseline efficiency of 7.6 HSPF2, SEER2 of 14.3, and be properly sized to the structure.
- Extension of application submission deadline to June 1, 2025.
- Extension of project completion deadline to June 30, 2025.
