

Oregon Rental Home Heat Pump Program



The Oregon Rental Home Heat Pump Program provides rebates and grants for the installation of heat pumps and related upgrades in dwellings used as residential tenancy (rentals) and in manufactured homes or recreational vehicles located in a rented space.

Heat pumps must be installed by ODOE-approved contractors who will reserve and receive rebates for eligible heat pump projects. The full rebate savings must be passed on to the dwelling owner.

Incentive Amounts

Rebate amounts vary depending on the efficiency of the heat pump installed and the income level of the tenant. Low- to moderate-income households are eligible for higher incentives.

Additional grants are available for upgrades that facilitate the installation of the heat pump. (Cannot exceed 100% of the cost of the upgrade.)

Community Heat Pump Deployment Program



The Community Heat Pump Deployment Program provides grants to eligible regional entities and Tribes that then design and implement programs to support the purchase and installation of heat pumps and related upgrades for homeowners living in the region or who are members of a Tribe.

The program is open to Oregon Tribes, local governments, local housing authorities, nonprofit organizations, coordinated care organizations, community action agencies, manufactured dwelling park nonprofits, and electric utilities. The grants may be allocated to one eligible entity for each region and one eligible entity for each federally recognized Tribe in Oregon.

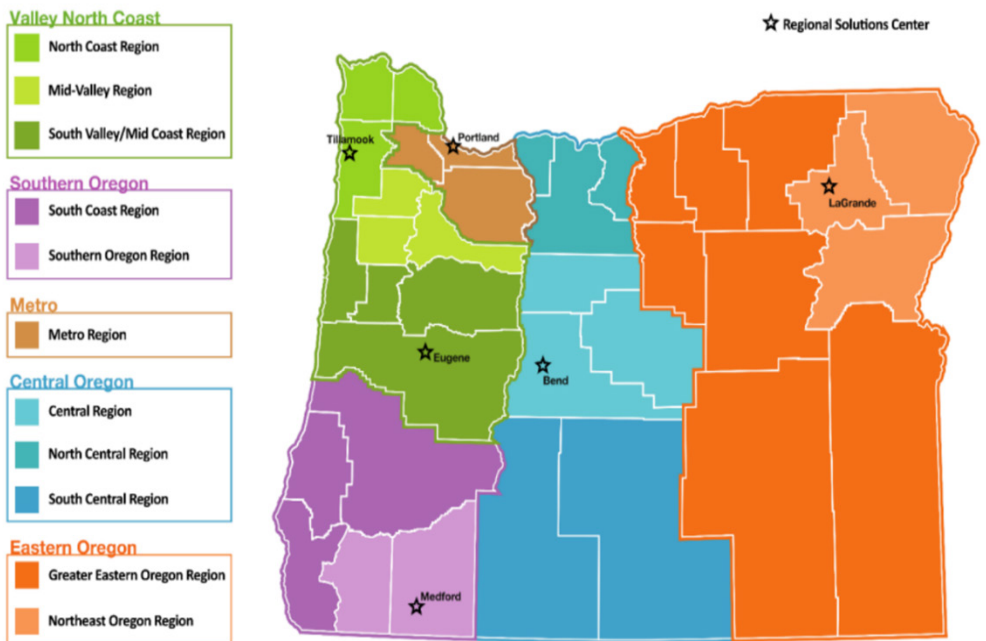
