## Pesticide Advisory:

## All Remaining Chlorpyrifos Special Local Need Registrations Have Been Voluntarily Cancelled

On October 31, 2023, the seven (7) remaining FIFRA Section 24(c) Special Local Need (SLN) registrations for Lorsban Advanced (EPA Reg. No. 62719-591, chlorpyrifos) have been voluntarily cancelled by Corteva Agriscience, LLC (formerly Dow AgroSciences, LLC).

Under Section 24(c) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), ODA may grant a Special Local Need (SLN) registration when there is not an appropriate federally registered pesticide to control a pest problem in our state. An SLN adds a state-specific use to a federal pesticide registration. SLNs are commonly used by specialty crop growers, who typically have fewer pest control options than growers of high-acreage crops.

These seven Lorsban Advanced SLNs were non-food/non-feed uses. They were not affected by EPA's February 28, 2022 decision to revoke food and feed uses of chlorpyrifos.

The federal registration for Lorsban Advanced was cancelled on May 4, 2023. The associated Oregon SLN registrations can no longer be maintained. As of October 31, 2023, the following SLNs are now cancelled, and Lorsban Advanced may <u>not</u> be used in Oregon under any of these labels:

OR-090007	Table beets grown for seed, sugar beets grown for seed, and Swiss chard grown for

OR-090008	Christmas tree plantations (Aerial application by helicopter only. Allowed April 1
	through June 15 only)
OR-090009	Perennial grasses grown for seed
OR-090010	Clover grown for seed
OR-090011	Carrots grown for seed
OR-090012	Radishes grown for seed
OR-090013	Cottonwood/poplar trees grown for pulp or wood

The federal cancellation of Lorsban Advanced supersedes ODA's rule limiting the use of chlorpyrifos, under which these SLNs would have been cancelled no later than December 31, 2023.
