## Cohort Transfers and Outcomes

There were a little over 50,000 students in the 2011-12 cohort enrolled in Oregon schools. Of those, 10.4\% transferred into the cohort after their freshman year, and $10.1 \%$ transferred out before the end of their senior year.
13.8\% were ultimately non-completers, a category which includes all students who did not earn a credential or transfer out, and are no longer enrolled.

## Entire 2011-12 Cohort



Rather than leaving prematurely, the majority of non-completers were last enrolled in their fourth year of high school. Nearly $10 \%$ of students who were enrolled in their fourth year of high school neither completed nor reenrolled for a fifth year.

Non-Completers were more likely than completers, and than the cohort as a whole, to have transferred in after their freshman year, or to have a gap of at least one school year in their Oregon high school enrollment.
