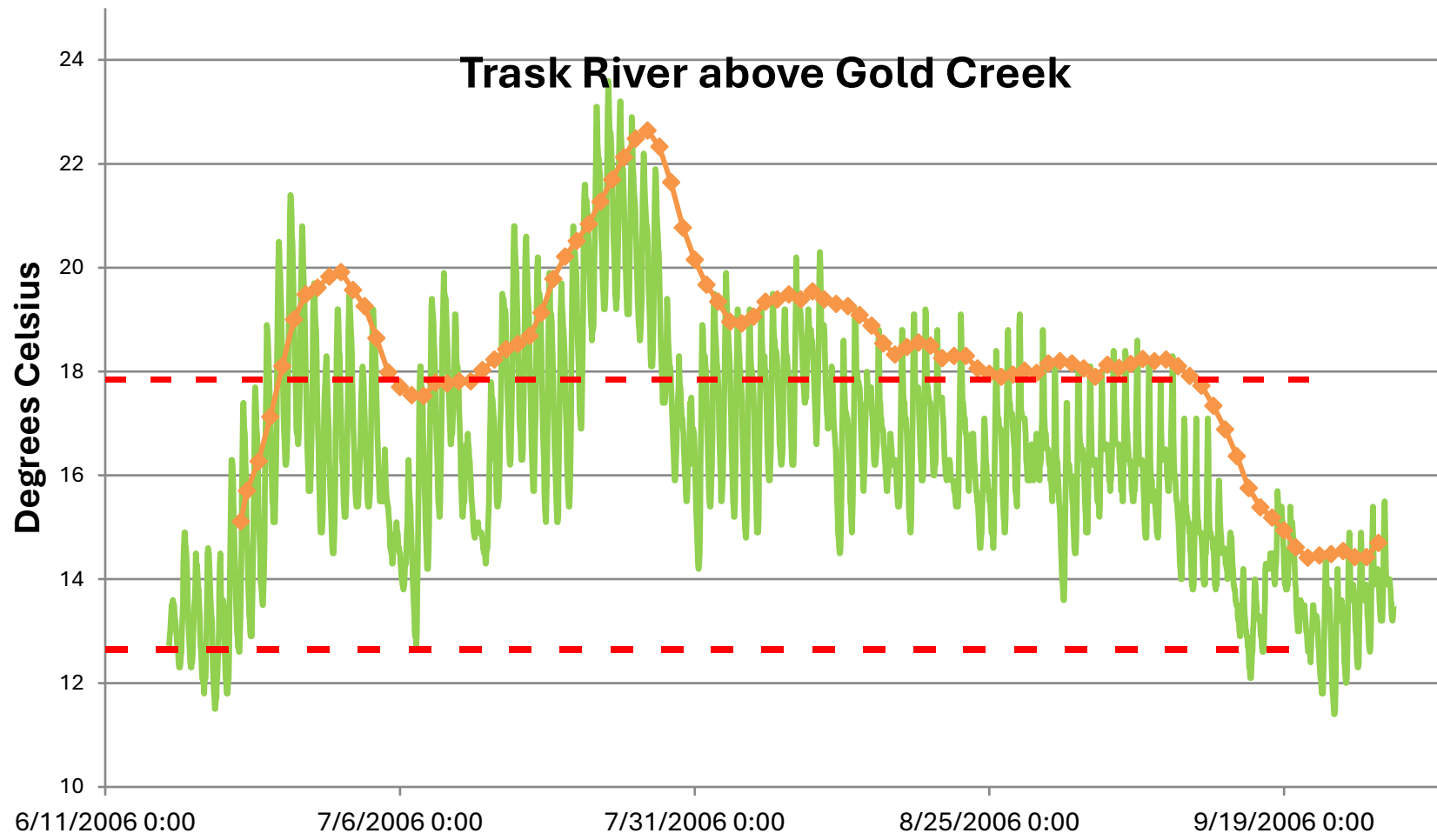


Anglers lost “consumptive access” to 5 of the 6 wild runs of salmonids in 10 short years in the late 90’s.

Closed to harvest:

- Wild Steelhead.....1992
- Wild Chum salmon.....1992
- Wild Coho salmon.....1994
- Wild Cutthroat trout.....1997
- Wild spring Chinook.....2002
- Wild fall Chinook.....2022 Cryptobia brood

Red denotes species that have long periods of time in freshwater (over-summer)



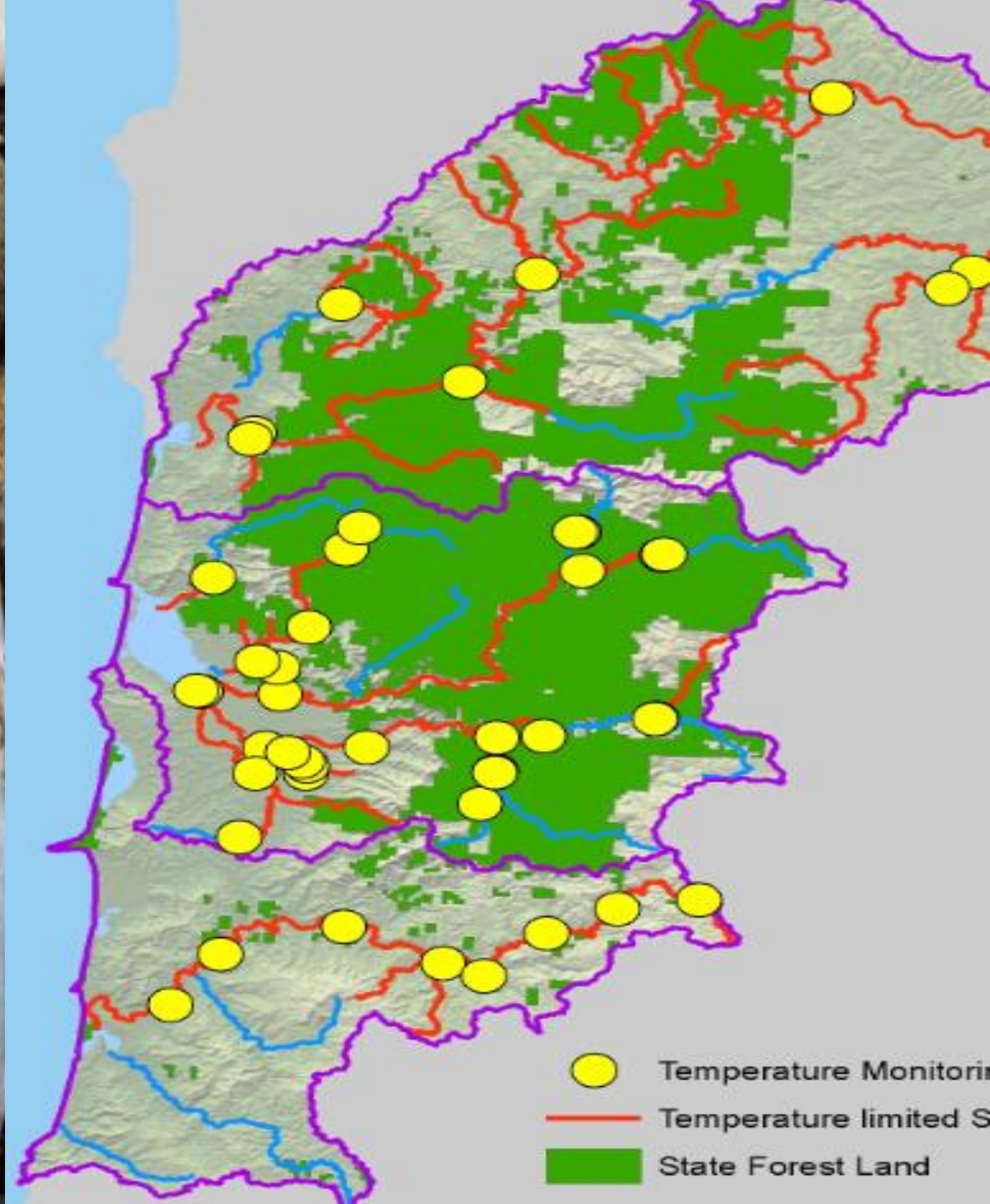
The seven day moving average of the daily maximum shall not exceed the following values unless specifically allowed under a Department-approved basin surface water management plan:

**64°F (17.8°C) June 1 – Sept. 30**

-or-

**55°F (12.8°C), October 1 – May 31**

Where **55°F (12.8°C)** applies during times and in waters that support salmon spawning, egg incubation and fry emergence from the egg and from the gravel.
