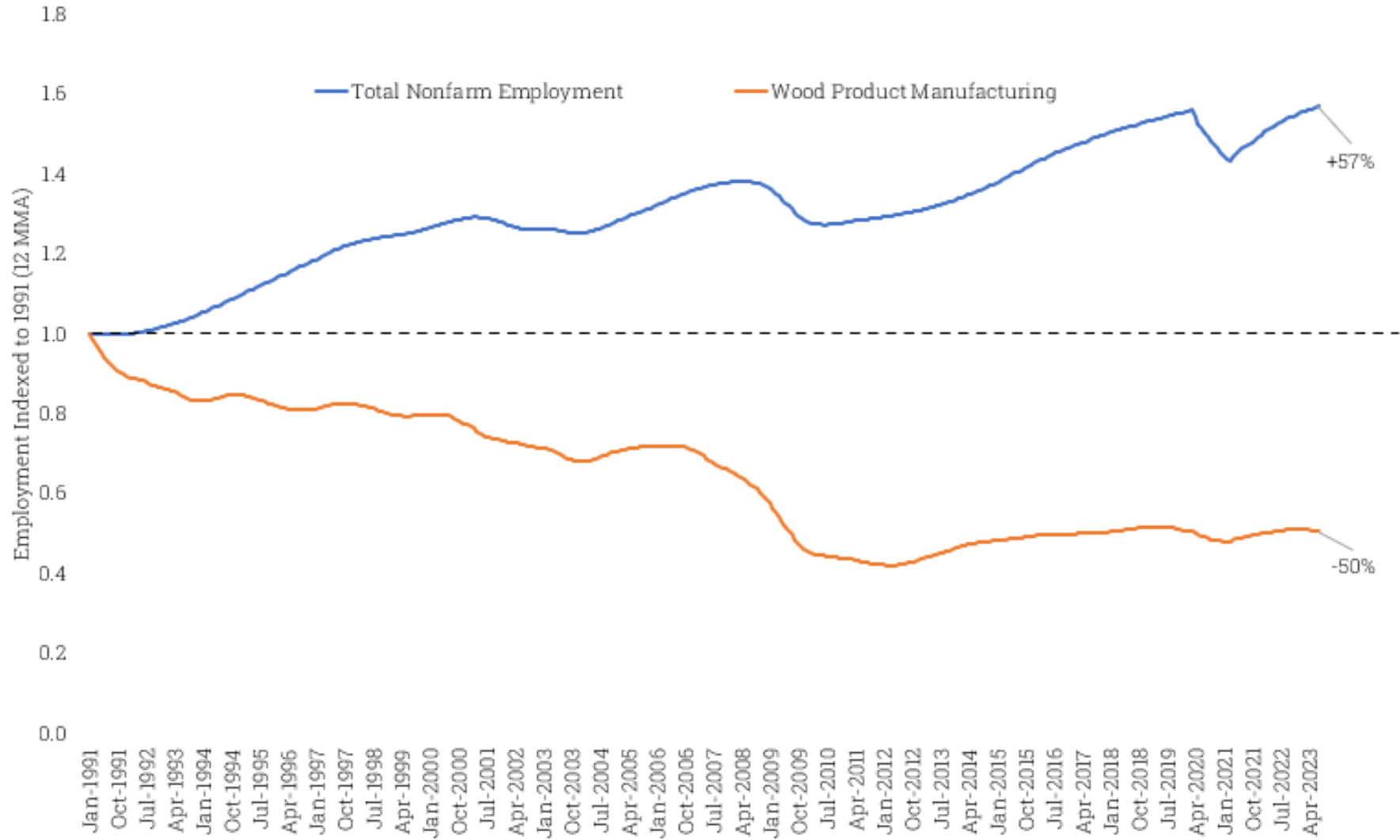

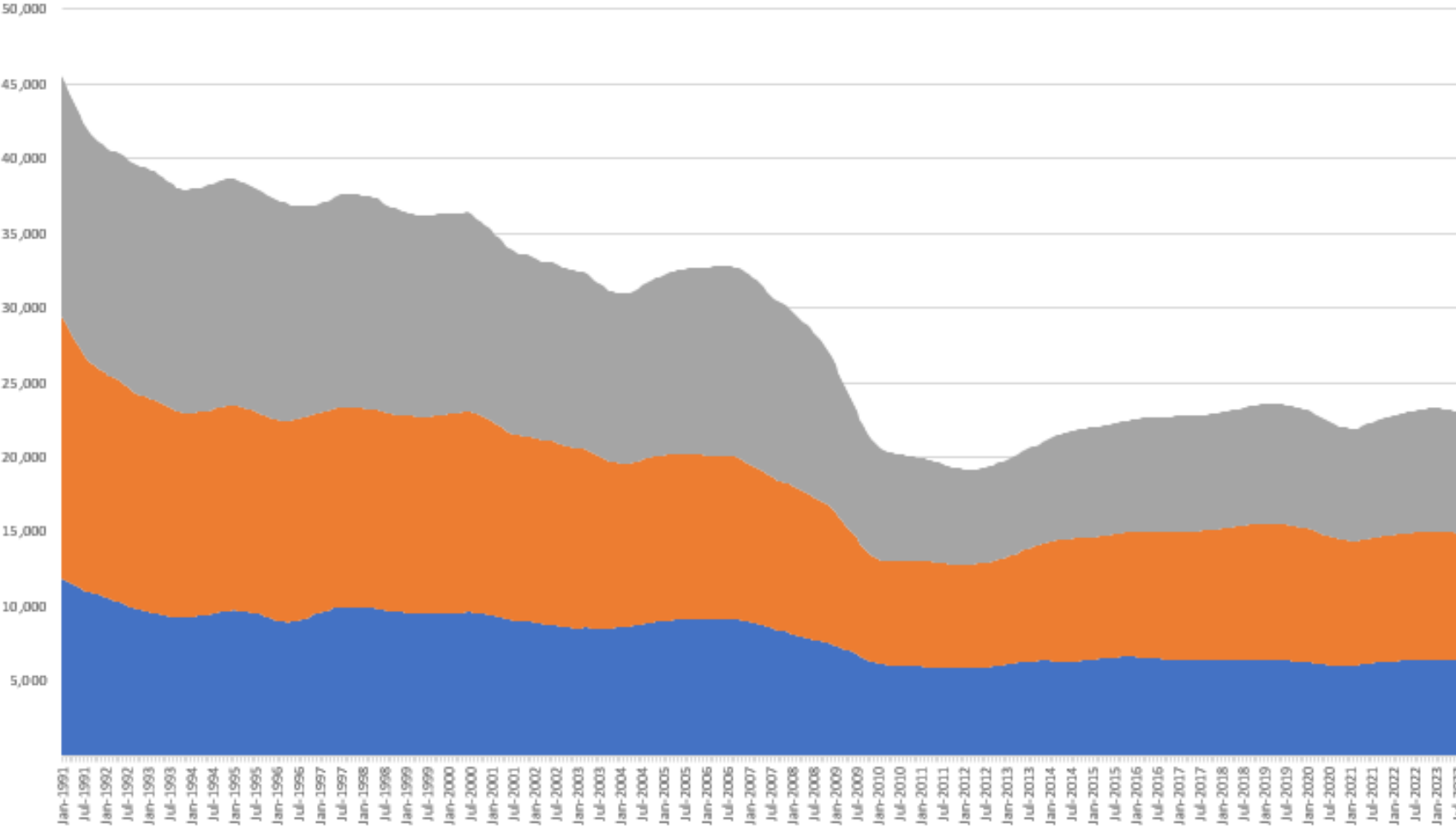
# **HISTORICAL TRENDS**

## Employment in the wood product sector is down 50% from the early 1990s

Employment in Oregon's Wood Product sectors largely flat over the past 8 years



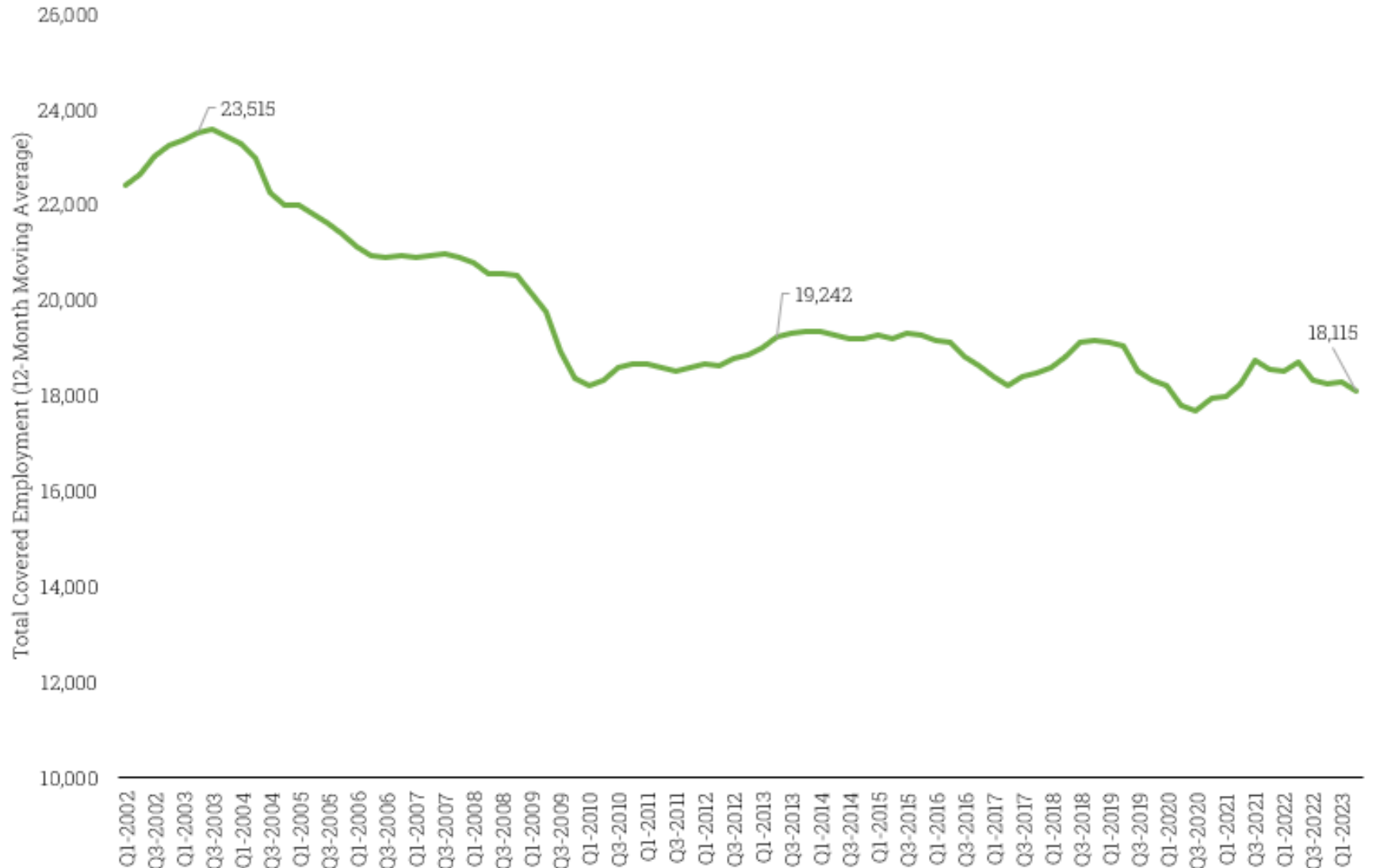

# Looking Forward

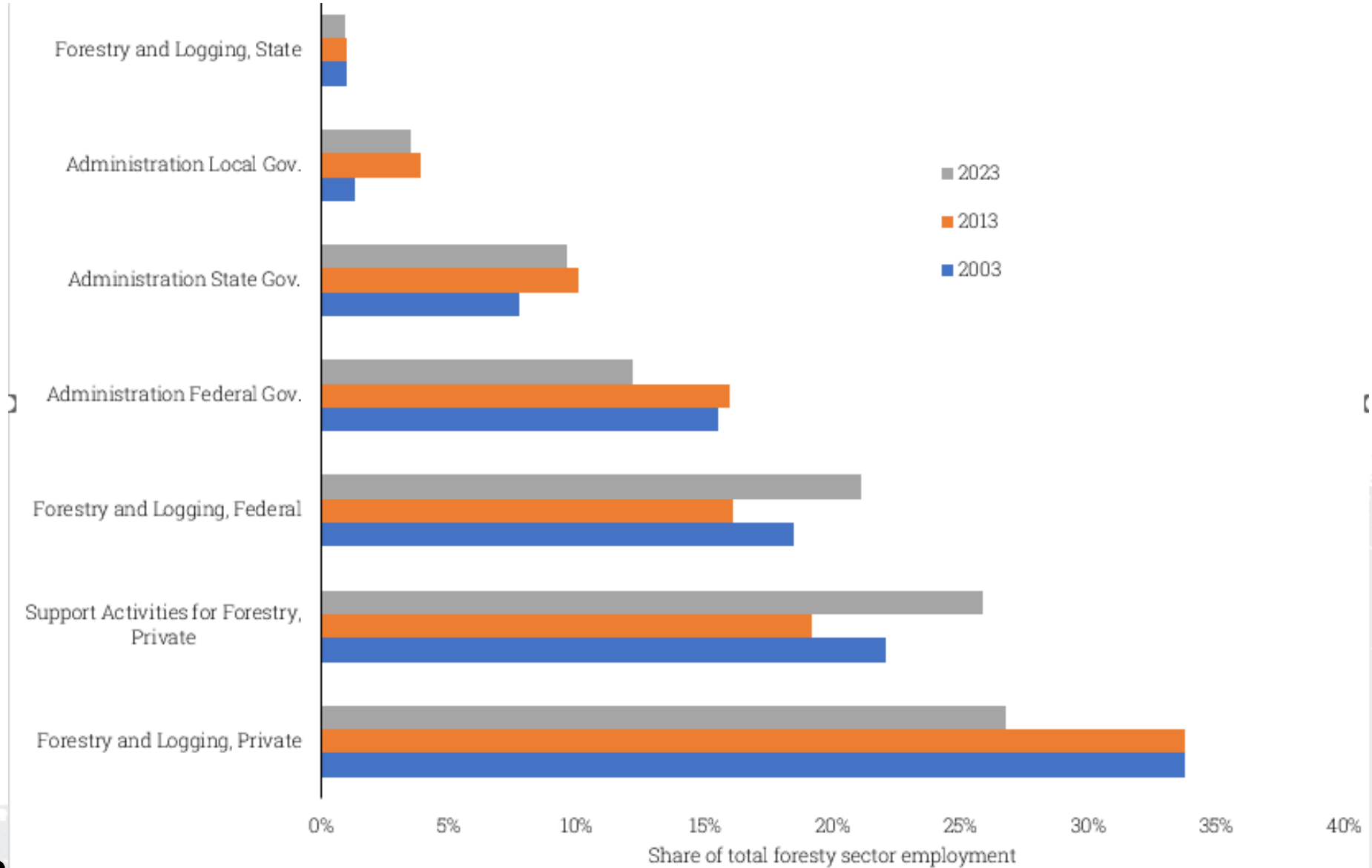
- **Wood Products Manufacturing growth = 4% over the decade**
  - Sawmills and Wood preservation = -2%
  - Plywood and engineered wood products = 7%
  - Other Wood Products = 6%

# Forestry, Logging, & Administrative of Conservation Programs



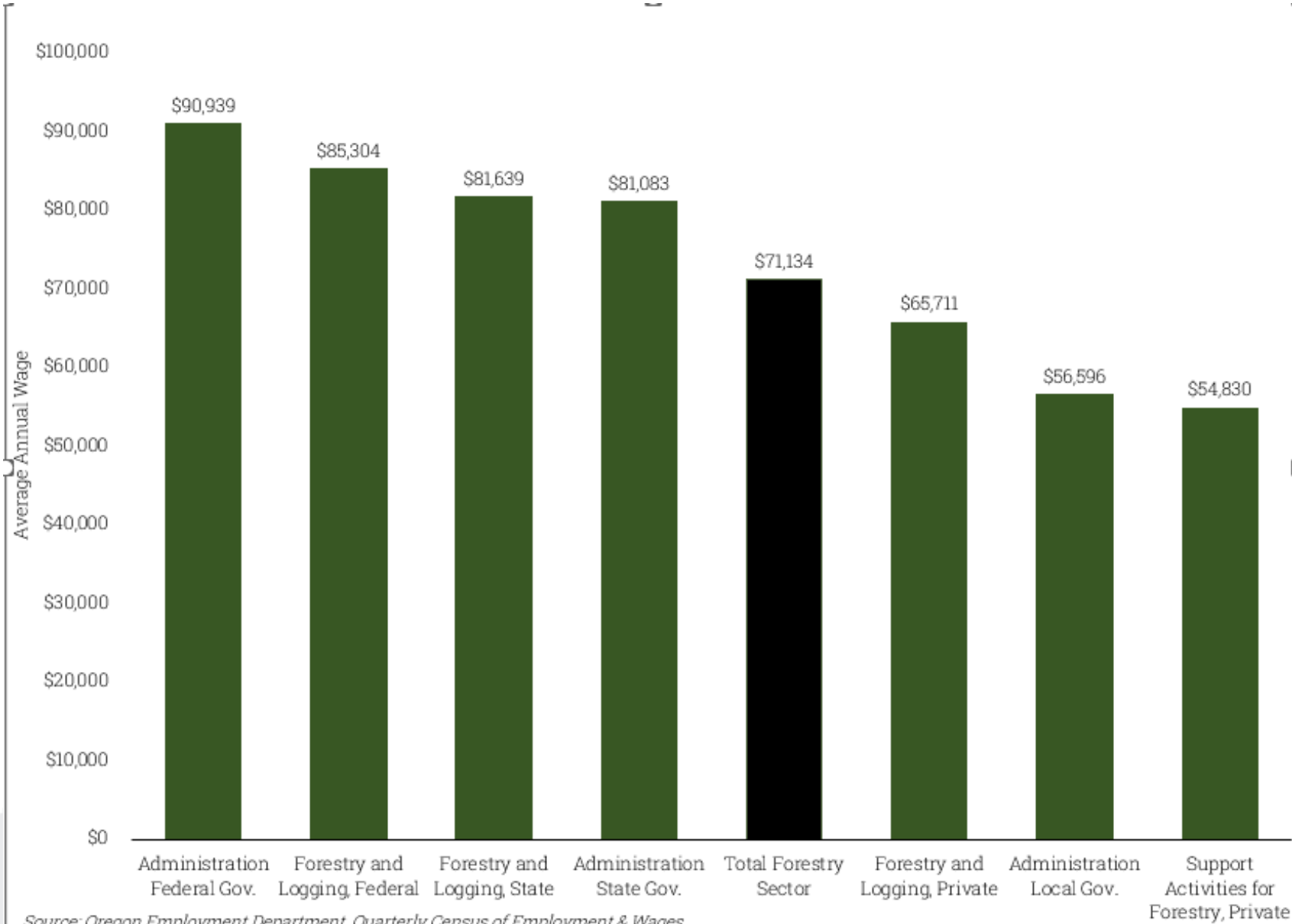
