

Instructions: As required by Oregon Senate Bill 710, adopted during in the 2021 regular session, quarterly reports must be completed and submitted to the Children's Care Licensing Program (CCLP) regarding restraints and involuntary seclusions of children in care. Reports must also be posted on the Child Caring Agency's website, if applicable, and must be provided to any member of the public upon request.

Site or Program Name	Complete a separate report for each program location that serves 5 or more children in care. For locations that serve 4 or less children (i.e., proctor foster homes) only one report has to be completed for the entire foster care program.
Reporting time frame (indicate which quarter in months and year).	Example: Q2, 2021
Total number of children served by CCA during reporting time frame	Count every child that was in the program during the reporting time frame.
