It's my honor and privilege to welcome you to the 2024 Oregon Prepared Workshop. As it is my first time at this event, I'm excited to attend the incredible lineup of learning sessions developed and presented by a collaborative team of our local, county, tribal, state and federal partners.

This week allows us to gather with colleagues and collectively discuss all that's happened over the last year, share lessons learned, and collaborate on ways to move forward. Since last year's conference, we've experienced a broad range of incidents and events, including January 2024's deadly ice storm that led to the request for a presidentially declared major disaster declaration; widespread flooding due to an atmospheric river in December; yet another long, though thankfully unremarkable, wildfire season; and several cyber incidents that impacted jurisdictions.

After my senate confirmation last September, one of my first actions was to lead a 90-day assessment to review the operational effectiveness of ODEM, both as an organization and as a team, and to document areas of growth and improvement. Our executive leadership team then held listening sessions and gathered insights from staff and external partners. Building on this assessment, we are now developing our Strategic Plan to strengthen the foundation of ODEM and the entire Oregon emergency management enterprise.

Additional priorities for this year include preparing a plan for the disaster preparedness stockpile; working on the coordination of cybersecurity grants; upgrading our incident management software; building on the State Preparedness Incident Response Equipment grant program; updating our state Emergency Operation Plan and annexes; and holding the IronOR 24 federal exercise in the fall to further prepare for a Cascadia event.

Emergency management is all about partnerships, and this conference allows us to establish, build and maintain strong relationships. Prioritizing our discipline ensures our communities will be better prepared and ready for emergencies and disasters. The foundation has been laid for future success in coordinating statewide emergency preparedness, mitigation, response and recovery. Let's work together and build upon our vision of an established, equitable culture of preparedness that empowers Oregonians to thrive in times of crisis.
