Rosanne Haggerty founds Common Ground Community.* Over the next 20 years, the organization creates nearly 3,000 more homes, assisting more than 4,500 people. But despite the success of these buildings in ending homelessness for their residents, overall homelessness continued to rise in New

York City.

The group that would become the Community Solutions team launches the **Street to Home Initiative** in NYC, rallying organizations to reduce street homelessness in the 20-block Times Square area by 87% in two years.

The 100,000 Homes
Campaign, (2010-2014)
was launched to help
U.S. communities find
homes for 100,000 of the
most vulnerable people
experiencing
homelessness. 186
communities helped
105,580 Americans find
housing. Yet, at the
Campaign's end, no
community has ended
homelessness.

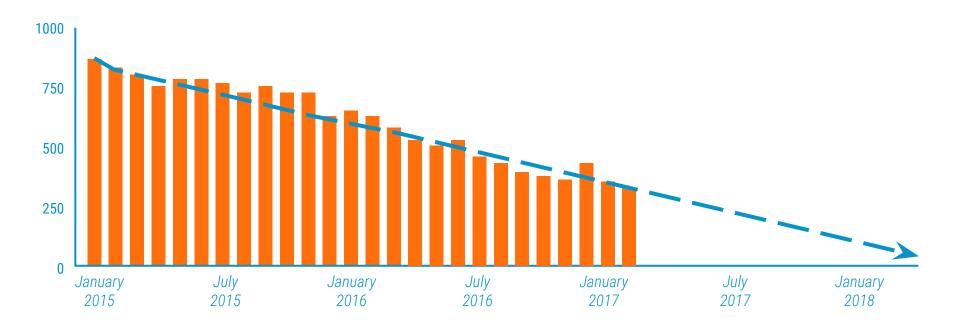
Creation of **Community Solutions.**

*Community Solutions is not affiliated with Common Ground, which now operates under the name "Breaking Ground." Launch of **Built for Zero**, that asks a new question: what does it take to count down to zero people experiencing homelessness?

12 communities have reached milestone for ending homelessness known as functional zero.

The Challenge of Counting Down

Built for Zero is designed to help communities **count down to zero** — a more complex challenge that requires a clearly defined end state for communities to shoot for.

Healthcare x Homelessness Pilot

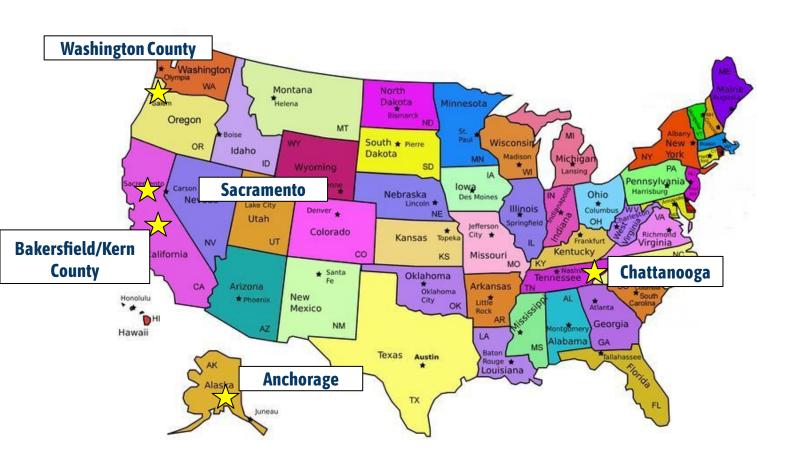
What is the Pilot?

In December 2020, <u>Community Solutions</u> and the <u>Institute for Healthcare Improvement</u> launched a pilot seeking to answer this question and lay the groundwork for spread and scale of solutions nationally. Building on an increasing awareness by health systems that they have an "anchor mission" to better support and invest in the overall health of communities they serve, this pilot brings together local health systems and homeless response systems from 5 communities involved in the <u>Built for Zero</u> initiative.

Pilot Initiative Aim

Over the course of the 2 year initiative, Pilot Teams will have made <u>measurable progress toward ending chronic homelessness</u>, with a focus on building racially equitable systems.

COMMUNITY

PURPOSE: Health care organizations will make a meaningful, measurable, and transformative contribution to end chronic homelessness across a community with a focus on building racially equitable systems.

COMMITMENT

Build Sustained Belief in and Commitment to Ending Chronic Homelessness at the Population Level

GOVERNANCE

Establish shared language and mechanisms for collaboration, measurement and governance

HOUSING PLACEMENTS

Increase housing placements and retention rates for those experiencing chronic homelessness

INFLOW

Prevent the inflow of individuals into chronic homelessness

FINANCING

Establish and build upon financial mechanisms aligned to reducing and ending chronic homelessness
