

The PDMP program continues to increase the number of users and number of queries submitted. PDMP staff conducted PDMP outreach at numerous events in the last quarter. Additionally, the program is using CDC and Bureau of Justice Assistance Harold Rogers grant funds to support PDMP enrollment in selected counties. Program staff conducted PDMP trainings for prescriber groups, counties, and associations, including creating a 0.5 CME course for the Board of Nursing.

In the last legislative session, the legislature passed HB 4124 which authorizes the PDMP to connect to health information exchanges (HIEs). PDMP staff are working with the PDMP vendor and stakeholder groups to begin establishing this connection.
