Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS

Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS will extend invitations to apply for the four rounds of their National Grants Programs in 2019 only to those organizations that were awarded grants previously. At this time, they are unable to extend invitations to apply to any organizations that have not received grants from Broadway Cares in the past. Comer Family Foundation

Since 1992, the Comer Family Foundation has offered a grant making program to harm reduction-centered syringe access programs (SAP) to improve the health and wellness of people affected by drug use. These programs provide free sterile syringes, education and community wraparound services to reduce transmission of HIV, hepatitis C and opioid overdose.

Drug Policy Alliance

The Drug Policy Alliance (DPA) offers two grants programs. Promoting Policy Change is an annual cycle that supports proven drug policy reform organizations. Special Opportunities is a revolving fund that supports cutting-edge drug policy reform opportunities that arise throughout the year.

MAC AIDS

North American Syringe Exchange Network (NASEN)

NASEN's services include the Buyers Club; U.S. Syringe Exchange Directory; Program Support Packages & fiscal sponsorship for small and emerging SEPs; Loan Assistance; Dave Purchase Memorial Syringe Exchange Survey. The Buyers Club is a purchasing network that uses cooperative buying power to acquire the lowest syringe prices for SEPs. Through Program Support Packages, NASEN provides syringe exchange start-up assistance for new programs with little or no operational history.

AIDS United

AIDS United's mission is to end the AIDS epidemic in the United States. They fulfill their mission through <u>strategic grantmaking</u>, <u>capacity building</u>, <u>policy/advocacy</u>, technical assistance and formative research.

HepConnect

HepConnect was launched in 2019. It is a five-year, multi-million-dollar initiative which will support community partnerships to combat the growing HCV infection rates in Indiana, Kentucky, North Carolina, Tennessee and West Virginia. The initiative has three areas of focus: 1) Expanding screening and linkage to care; 2) Supporting harm reduction and community education; and 3) Activate healthcare infrastructure.
