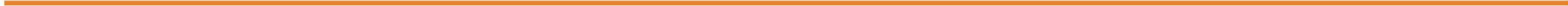

BACKGROUND

History of Oregon's ICAA

1998-2001: 12 Oregon communities pass smoke-free workplace laws

2001: Statewide



2007: Expansion



2011: Smoke shops



2015: Inhalant delivery systems



ATTITUDES AND PERCEPTIONS IN OREGON

Nearly 9 out of 10 Oregon adults support the ICAA

Prohibits the use of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, cannabis and other inhalant delivery systems in workplaces, restaurants, bars and other indoor public places.

Believe secondhand exposure **is harmful**, outdoors
