Directions

We are located next to OYA's Tillamook Youth Correctional Facility and near the Blimp Hangar Air Museum.

From Portland

- Head west on Hwy. 26 for about 20 miles.
- Merge onto Hwy. 6 West and go about 50 miles.
- Turn left onto Hwy. 101.
- Go through Tillamook on Hwy. 101.
- Turn left at the flashing light onto Long Prairie Road.
- Turn right onto Blimp Boulevard.
- Turn left onto Officer Row.
- Turn left onto Barracks Circle, the driveway for Camp Tillamook.

From Salem

- Head west on Hwy. 22 for about 29 miles.
- Merge onto Hwy. 18 West and go about 4 miles.
- Turn right to get back onto Hwy. 22 West and go about 25 miles.
- Turn right onto Hwy. 101 North and go about 17 miles.
- Turn right at the flashing light onto Long Prairie Road.
- Turn right onto Blimp Boulevard.
- Turn left onto Officer Row.
- Turn left onto Barracks Circle, the driveway for Camp Tillamook.

ABOUT US





General Information

The purpose of Camp Tillamook's program is to provide treatment, education, and other skills for youth who are preparing to transition back into the community. Part of this process includes increasing contact with youths' family members or with their community resources.

Even though youth may have more access to the outside community while at Camp, they are still in "close custody," which means that many of the rules are similar to what they were at the youth's previous OYA youth correctional facility.

Treatment Programs

This includes daily responsibilities, staff and peer interactions, and participation in the therapy process. You will be invited to attend and participate in your youth's Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) meeting with your youth, their juvenile parole and probation officer (JPPO), the assistant camp director, and a treatment provider. We also offer some family sessions with our contracted therapist — to learn more, call 503-842-4243, Ext. 352.

Education and Vocational Programs

Camp Tillamook has an accredited school, Trask River High School, with opportunities to earn a high school diploma and take college courses. We also have vocational training programs, including a woodshop, a tree farm, and dog training.

Work Crew

If your youth is meeting behavioral and educational goals, they may have the chance to participate in supervised work crews in the community and earn money for this work. This includes park stream and trail maintenance, work at the Tillamook fairgrounds, and assistance for community businesses and homeowners. Work crews are an important step in helping youth develop their judgment and problem-solving skills, which are vital to successfully transitioning into the community.

HOW TO CONTACT YOUTH

Visiting

All visitors first must go through the OYA visitor approval process and be on their youth's OYA Approved Visitors List. Learn more in our Visiting Information brochure.

Phone Calls

- Youth may make phone calls to people on their authorized call list. The number and length of their calls depend on their privilege level.
- Incoming calls are allowed if the callers are identified and approved by the youth's treatment team.
- All calls (except to attorneys) are in the presence of a staff members. Youth must speak only with the person being called.
- If staff feel the call is inappropriate, they can end the call.

Mail

- You may send your youth postage stamps, phone cards, appropriate clothing, hygiene products (no alcohol, aerosol, or glass containers), and store-bought (non-refrigerated) packaged food.
- You may also bring some of the above items during visitation time see our Visiting Information brochure for details.
- Each youth has one storage box that is about the size of a large shoe box for holding their snacks or drinks. The overall storage space at Camp is limited. Please keep this in mind when deciding how many items to send to your youth.
- You may mail in checks or money orders to add to your youth's account. Staff will write a receipt and give the receipt to the youth.
- All mail coming in will be opened and inspected for contraband. The mail will be scanned for any content that is prohibited by the facility.
- Prohibited mail will be sent back to the sender with the reasons why. The youth will also be notified that they received mail, who it was from, and why it was returned.
