Reporting Hours for Community College and University Academic Staff

January 2024

This employer announcement explains how to report **hours worked** by college and public university academic staff on and after January 1, 2024. To read the guidelines for reporting community college hours before that date, see employer announcement 93 (2015), "Community Colleges: Eligibility and Use of FTE from 2011–2023."

Calculating hours

Before 2024, hours worked by community college academic employees were converted from full-time equivalent (FTE) to hours for PERS reporting.

House Bill 2740 (2023) removed the FTE conversion and replaced it with a new calculation method:

- Each hour of lecture time or classroom instruction is reported to PERS as 2.67 hours.
- All other work is reported as actual time worked.

The college or university is responsible for determining what is considered classroom time and what is considered other work.

Earning PERS benefits

A PERS member must work at least 600 hours/calendar year to qualify to earn PERS benefits. To learn more, read employer reporting guide 1, *Overview of PERS*, "PERS membership" section.
