Title: Early Densification in an Urban Center: Portland, Oregon and the War Code Housing Program

In order to house the thousands of workers migrating to Portland, Oregon to fill jobs in war-related industries during World War II, Portland's government relaxed building code standards to allow temporary housing through internal conversions and accessory dwelling units such as garages, outbuildings, and trailers. This terminal project examines Portland's War Code Housing Program as a historical example of rapid densification in an urban center. Using a database of property information and GIS shapefiles, this terminal project assesses the relaxation of the City's building code to determine whether a similar relaxation of certain aspects of today's building code could safely and effectively further encourage dense and affordable housing in Portland. The model of internal conversions and accessory dwelling units to create housing is not radical and is already in discussion among Portland's urban planners. This is the first published record of the sites associated with the War Code Housing Program and the accompanying data will be valuable to future researchers, city officials, and Portland's residents.

INTRODUCTION

Portland continues to be one of the top five fastest growing cities in the United States.¹ City officials predict that Portland will increase by 123,000 households by 2035.² Portland is certainly not alone in its predicted population increase. Census data confirms the continued accelerated growth of metropolitan areas and a staggering average of a 30% increase in educated millennials living in the core of the thirty-three most populous cities in the United States.³ Rapidly growing urban centers like Portland face an immediate housing issue: density and affordability.

In 1973, Oregon adopted statewide legislation establishing an Urban Growth Boundary for all metropolitan areas to prevent suburban sprawl and prohibit encroachment of housing on surrounding farmlands. The Urban Growth Boundary is evaluated on a regular basis with population forecasts and developable land summaries. For Portland, this requires accommodating an ever-increasing population with diverse needs within the boundary limits.⁴ Many prefer to live in the downtown core rather than the suburbs within the Urban Growth Boundary such as Beaverton or Milwaukie.⁵ There is very little vacant land left in the

core of Portland and increasing land prices create challenges to develop land at an affordable rate.

Portland needs to increase its stock of urban, low- and mid-range housing to meet the growing demand. Many developers look to demolish small existing structures on valuable urban land in order to build new large complexes encompassing up to an entire city block. Such actions diminish the unique character of Portland's neighborhoods, increase environmental costs, and destroy historic fabric. In searching for options to increase housing within city limits, planners and developers might examine a historical example of rapid densification in an urban center for guidance.

Portland's War Code Housing Program of 1942-1956 created nearly immediate housing for the influx of war industry workers by promoting internal conversions and accessory dwelling units such as garages, outbuildings, and trailers. Portland's population increased by almost twenty-five percent, or about 100,000 people, during World War II through immigration.⁶ Defense industries such as the Kaiser Shipyards and Portland Steel were integral to the war effort, with the shipyards launching a new ship every other day.⁷ The federal government

needed Portland to keep producing war materials, and this meant Portland's local government needed to recruit, house, and retain workers.⁸

The housing of war workers and their families was critical to successful production. Newspaper articles and letters between Mayor Earl Riley and Defense Housing officials in Washington, DC demonstrate this emphasis on getting in-migrant workers off the street and out of the rain.⁹ Planned housing projects could not meet immediate demands as construction took time and used resources needed for war production.

A legislative solution known as Article 13 of the War Code, enacted in July of 1942, relaxed building code requirements to promote small internal conversions of the existing building stock and the use of accessory dwelling units such as garages, outbuildings, and trailers. Citizens were asked to "do their part" for the war effort and open their homes and commercial space to newcomers flooding in to work in war-related industries.¹⁰ War Code Housing Program units were issued permits for residential use, thus creating a record of each project. War Code Housing succeeded because it created housing using minimal materials, minimal manpower, and minimum expense to owners. The newly-created units were usually located within a half mile of

public transit and cost renters little as the federal government imposed rent control in war-industry cities.¹¹

This terminal project creates invaluable data for future researchers to assess Portland's War Code Housing Program and begins analysis of historical housing legislation to increase density. The scope of the project is limited to the City of Portland, Oregon and the surrounding metro area. The primary years of analysis are those in which the War Code Housing Program was in effect, 1942-1956. The intended audience of this terminal project is Portland's city planners, development services workers, preservationists, public transit designers, and anyone else interested in finding solutions to housing issues. It will also be of interest to Portland residents, homeowners of properties associated with the program, families of the owners, and others interested in the history of Portland's neighborhoods. The collected data and analysis are useful to all mentioned parties and cities outside of Portland as well. The methodology used is an example for future researchers working on other cities' housing solutions during times of war or other emergencies.

This terminal project synthesizes and comprehensively analyzes the multiple sources of War Code Housing Program permit data, creating a Geographical Information Systems (GIS) map that delineates the various characteristics of War Code Housing. Records are located at the Portland Archives and Records Center (PARC) and at the Bureau of Development Services (BDS). No work has been done to integrate this information. This project creates a database from the sources and interprets it geospatially. This project looks at various characteristics of the War Code Housing Program permits such as location, proximity to public transit, and the prior

function of the site. A small sample of addresses is also assessed for their current function today and retention as dense housing.

As Portland tries to prevent its current housing shortage from becoming a full-blown crisis, it is good practice to look at solutions that succeeded in the past. The model of internal conversions and accessory dwelling units to create additional housing is not radical and is, in fact, currently proposed in drafted zoning code amendments. City planners are aware of the need to expand housing options in the Portland metropolitan area to increase availability and affordability; in order to convert older buildings into more residences, the building code also needs to be altered. This terminal project assesses the relaxation of the building code in the 1940s to determine whether a similar relaxation could safely and effectively increase dense and affordable housing in Portland. This terminal project briefly examines the four proposed zoning code amendments for their effectiveness to densify Portland while preserving historic resources and the unique characteristics of the city.

This project is a culmination of my many preservation passions including internal conversions, GIS, and smartly managing growth. I stumbled upon this project while doing research on a specific property at 2734-2738 NE Alberta Street in March 2018 at Portland Archives and Records Center (PARC). The Historic Resource Inventory form for the Alberta Street property lists multiple alterations to the building in 1943 and states, “these changes were allowed through the emergency war code in place during World War II.”¹² In order to complete this first-year project, I began conducting research about Portland’s War Code Housing Program and was surprised by the lack of information on the subject. Not only do historians writing about Portland and World War II housing make no mention of the program, but no published

information connects the addresses to the housing program or World War II. In order to find information about a property's participation in the War Code Housing Program, one would physically have to go to PARC and sort through the five file boxes of permit applications. Thus, I began the effort to manually convert the permit information into digital form usable as a resource for others to access, visually represent the data in GIS, and tell an overlooked story of a community effort to house men and women assisting in war industries.

HISTORIC CONTEXT

The United States' involvement in World War II drastically altered the landscape of urban America through in-migration to war-industry cities. A coordinated and well-executed Home Front can alter the entire course of a war, and the United States was aware of its need to mobilize the nation already in 1940. Federal Housing Administration employees readily acknowledged the failure to provide housing in critical war-industry cities during World War I.¹³ Instead of focusing on producing many units quickly they focused on quality of construction, resulting in too few units. They vowed to not repeat their mistakes the second time around and began to plan for in-migration of workers early on in the war effort.¹⁴ Eventually, a national housing crisis would be declared to provide housing for war-industry workers and their families.

It is estimated that four million workers migrated within the United States between 1940-1945 to work in a war-industry field, such as aircraft manufacturing, aluminum, steel, plastics, and shipbuilding.¹⁵ These booming industries required hundreds of thousands of new employees and recruited workers from across the country to the divergent industry hubs.¹⁶ Workers predominantly came from inland areas and the South as most war-industry hubs existed along the two coasts for transportation ease.¹⁷ Portland, a relatively small West Coast city in comparison

to San Francisco, Seattle, and Los Angeles, would become one of the largest war-industry hubs producing vital war materials.¹⁸

The federal government awarded Portland \$1.74 billion in War Contracts between 1940-1945.¹⁹ Portland attracted workers in a variety of war-related industries such as steel, aluminum plants, lumber, and chemical production, though the largest employer by far were the shipyards.²⁰ The Kaiser Shipyards employed over 100,000 people at the peak of production during World War II.²¹ Henry Kaiser, also known as the “Atlas of Industry,” created the Oregon Shipbuilding Corporation in 1940 prior to direct U.S. involvement in World War II. Kaiser operated three different shipbuilding yards: Oregonship, Vancouvership, and Swan Island. These three shipyards supplied vessels to the United States and its allies, providing critical equipment to the fight in Europe and later the Pacific. Kaiser’s shipyards were known for their speedy production. One ship, The Joseph N. Teal, took only a record-breaking ten days from the laying of the keel to its launch.²² The Oregonship Yard averaged an ocean-going vessel every other day from 1941-1945.²³ No other shipyard in the nation could match its pace. In order to recruit workers, companies placed advertisements in newspapers and at train stations. Some, like Henry Kaiser, even prepaid the train fare themselves.²⁴ Those who could not quickly find comfortable accommodations would be lured to other defense hubs boasting of better

conditions.²⁵ The need to retain workers in critical war-industry cities became a top priority and housing the most obvious solution to doing so.²⁶

President Franklin D. Roosevelt declared a state of emergency in January of 1941 and restructured the Federal Housing Department through multiple Executive Orders. Executive Order 9070 of February 1942 further streamlined the federal housing initiative by establishing the National Housing Agency, to which sixteen previously separate divisions would now report.^{27 28} C.F. Palmer, the Coordinator of Defense Housing, stated in February of 1942, “no war activity shall be held back by lack of housing...where the war calls for houses, we must supply houses.” Failure to expeditiously produce needed defense materials could result in the death of soldiers, the bombing of American cities, and loss of the war. Failure was not an option. Palmer described three main goals of the Division of Defense Housing: speed, economy, and thoughtful planning for the future.²⁹ These goals are outlined in the Directive for War-Time Construction issued jointly by the War and Navy Departments and the War Production Board December of 1942.³⁰ Other federal policies outlined include limitations on the selling or of rental prices of federally constructed units to prohibit outrageous costs for war-industry

workers.³¹ The federal government aimed to achieve these goals through oversight of localized housing departments, such as the Housing Authority of Portland.

Portland resisted using city planning as a tool prior to World War II and resented attempts of federal oversight. During the 1930s, Portland's elected officials and citizens continued to resist a central housing authority or public housing programs.³² In 1940, Portland citizens elected Mayor Earl Riley, an upper-class administrator who "disliked intervention in the private economy, opposed public housing, and showed little interest in land-use planning."³³ Mayor Earl Riley and Portland's private construction companies were overly confident in their ability to supply housing to defense workers until mid-July of 1942. A letter from a Portland builder and future member of the Housing Authority of Portland Board to Mayor Riley dated June, 1941 declares "...we might do it ourselves," and describes the builder's desire to "keep the Federal government out of control of the destinies of Portland" and the housing market.³⁴ This letter conveys several arguments against government intervention by Portland's local officials, planners, and individual contractors in the beginning phase of the Home Front effort. Portland was accustomed to minimum federal oversight and wanted things to remain that way despite a national emergency. Portland's individual contractors wanted the profits from construction projects and the ability to build them as they pleased. Portland planners did not want in-migrant workers to remain in Portland after the war concluded. They preferred temporary housing built

quickly which could then be deconstructed rather than permanent housing encouraging permanent settlement.³⁵ A letter between Portland's Inspector of Buildings and an executive at the National Lumber Manufacturers' Association dated December 10, 1941 continues to display the ambivalence of Portland's officials to the housing shortage. The inspector writes, "objection has been made to changing any of the codes," to facilitate faster construction as the changes might be seen as "permanent" allowances.³⁶ City officials did not want to alter building standards or seemingly encourage in-migrants to permanently settle in Portland by providing housing.

A day later, City Council created the Housing Authority of Portland (HAP) on December 11, 1941 to oversee all publicly-funded housing projects. The commission originally consisted of a realtor, a banker, an apartment owner, and a trade union leader.³⁷ Conservatives in Portland fearful of too much housing were appeased by "its origins in an ad hoc committee" and appointment of businessmen rather than planners.³⁸ HAP was slow to respond to Portland's needs during the first six months of 1942. Meeting minutes show lengthy debates about non-critical issues which drastically delayed construction and "exasperated officials of the National Housing Administrated" who knew the debate between 2,500 units versus 3,100 units was inconsequential as a month later HAP requested 10,000 additional units.³⁹ HAP looked foolish and unprepared to handle the task at hand.

By July of 1942, Portland officials acknowledged they had further exacerbated the housing crisis through their own lack of action. A letter dated July 23, 1942 from the Executive

Vice President of Willamette Iron and Steel Corporation, one of the major defense industries, to Mayor Riley details the desperation of defense industries to hire more workers and to provide those workers with housing and support services: “every day sorely needed workmen coming here from other towns are leaving again because of lack of housing facilities. Something must be done immediately to meet this emergency...” as new construction projects would take months to complete even if approved right away.⁴⁰ Flagel’s letter is the first evidence found recommending the use of internal conversions to house workers, as he claims to “...believe the citizens of Portland, if they fully realized the urgency of the situation, would be willing to make the sacrifices necessary to meet the present situation with facilities which are now available,” for use immediately⁴¹ Telegrams in the last week of July 1942 between Mayor Riley and federal employees of the National Housing Agency portray the pressure upon Mayor Riley to create more housing and enact policy changes.⁴²

On July 30, 1942, Mayor Riley amended Portland’s War Code to include Article 13 which relaxed the building code to create housing through conversions of the existing building stock and accessory dwelling units.⁴³ Article 13 contains twenty-two subsections detailing acceptable unit sizes, materials, amenities, and safety regulators.⁴⁴ Conversions required fewer

There are two different versions of the War Code available at PARC and each copy is slightly different than the other. For example, the text of subsection 22-1315 is missing from the 2012-35 version and the text in subsection

materials, cost less money, and could easily be altered back to their original state after the war. Owners willing to convert their properties received federal funds and renters received subsidies to ensure a fair price.⁴⁵ The federal government regulated the costs of conversion through established wage rates for the workers and material prices.⁴⁶ The City of Portland published letters and articles asking for contribution to the war effort through conversion of buildings and urged citizens to be a patriot and house a war-industry worker.⁴⁷

The conclusion of World War II in 1945 did not stop the use of the War Code Housing Program to create additional units. The language of the War Code Housing Program stated that it would not end until peace was achieved with all countries.⁴⁸ This allowed the program to continue issuing permits during the 1940s. The program remained relevant as records indicate approximately 650 permits were issued after the war's conclusion. An increase in permits issued in 1948 and 1949 is likely the result of Vanport flooding although no definitive evidence could be located. Portland amended Article 13 in May of 1950 to prohibit the issuing of War Code Housing permits. The program would formally end until 1956.

LITERATURE REVIEW

Little published information exists regarding Portland's War Code Housing Program. No previous historian digitized the original permit applications nor is there a website listing the addresses which utilized the Program. There are also very few references to the War Code as a housing program mentioned in historians' retelling of Portland's involvement in World War II. Historians have previously focused on Housing Authority of Portland (HAP) projects such as Vanport City, Columbia Villa, and others, with special emphasis placed recently on the flooding of Vanport in 1948 and the failure of the local government to protect its citizens. To compare, HAP created 19,088 housing units while the War Code Housing Program created 6,146 housing units.⁴⁹ Although the War Code Housing Program created fewer units, the Program greatly impacted the Home Front effort and should be more thoroughly documented and evaluated.

Portland's historians make little to no mention of the War Code Housing Program when discussing World War II. E. Kimbark MacColl, who has written three tomes about Portland's history through various lenses, does not even mention the War Code when discussing Portland and World War II housing over more than twenty pages of text.⁵⁰ MacColl mentions all twenty-five HAP projects throughout this section, but fails to mention citizens' effort to house workers in their own homes.⁵¹ MacColl misses the opportunity to include goodwill efforts by the citizens of Portland in his retelling of housing war-industry workers.

Carl Abbott, another Portland historian, also completely overlooks the War Code Housing Program in his retelling of city planning during World War II. In the article, “Planning for the Home Front in Seattle and Portland, 1940-45,” Abbott characterizes the struggle between private and public agendas for Portland’s housing crisis but makes no mention of the War Code Housing Program.⁵² Abbott’s article ignores the political skills of Mayor Riley’s and Commissioner Bowes’ pleas to Portland residents in 1942 and the ingenuity of certifying grassroots housing efforts instead of relying on private enterprise to close gaps in the housing supply. Abbott’s book *Portland in Three Centuries: the Place and the People* spends more time specifically discussing the creation of World War II housing.⁵³ Abbott details multiple housing projects including their construction, amenities, and eventual demise, but, once again, makes no mention of the War Code Housing Program or the creative utilization of existing building stock and accessory dwelling units as housing. Two other works by Abbott which were consulted are *Portland: Planning, Politics, and Growth in a Twentieth-Century City* and *Greater Portland: Urban Life and Landscape in the Pacific Northwest*.⁵⁴ Once again, these books touch on urban planning themes and make lengthy references to Portland’s public housing programs during World War II but continue to ignore the impact of the War Code Housing Program on available residential units.

A useful source of information on war housing efforts is an Oregon Secretary of State online exhibit about World War II. There is an entire section devoted to housing entitled “A Place of Their Own: Civilian Housing and Rent Control,” which goes into the most detail of any

identified source about the War Code Housing Program while still not directly naming the War Code.⁵⁵ Subtitles include headings such as “Share your Home!” and “Relaxed Building Codes Encourage Conversion,” with a link to the “City of Portland Housing Code Ordinance,” which opens Article 13 of the War Code. This online exhibit goes through the history of the creation of the War Code and provided a good list of sources to investigate while not ever actually using the phrase “War Code.”

Other accounts of Portland’s history also disregard the War Code when discussing World War II and housing. The article “It Takes More than Bullets: The WWII Homefront in Portland, Oregon” by George Kramer alludes to the War Code Housing Program while, once again, not directly naming the Program. This article is the result of mitigation for Columbia Villa, a HAP project. It meticulously details many aspects of the war effort in Portland including the major industries, housing, transportation, daily life, and the foreclosure of most industry sites after the war’s end.⁵⁶ The War Code is never specifically cited although references “private solutions” for housing and trailers are made.⁵⁷ This article proved useful in developing a narrative around Portland’s World War II history.

Heather Fryer is a social and cultural historian who has written about Portland and World War II through the lens of racial issues. The article “Race, Industry, and the Aesthetic of a Changing Community in World War II Portland,” is a fascinating study about creative efforts to prevent war-industry workers from living on the streets but it makes no mention of the War

Code.⁵⁸ Her book *Perimeters of Democracy: Inverse Utopias and the Wartime Social Landscape in the American West* examines the social landscape of multiple cities during various times of war.⁵⁹ Fryer's work primarily focuses on cultural and racial issues illuminated by perceived threats to Americans' safety, such as Japanese Internment Camps or the segregation of African-American workers in San Francisco. Fryer highlights the hypocritical nature of Vanport touted as an integrated city yet one with segregated streets chosen by members of the HAP. Fryer's analysis still does not further the research of temporary housing created by the War Code.

The preservationist Donna Graves wrote two significant context statements about Home Front efforts in Richmond, California during World War II. California had its own name for using vacant buildings and extra rooms as housing: California's Guest Worker Program. The first report is entitled "Mapping Richmond's World War II Home Front," and assisted in the creation of the Rosie the Riveter/World War II Home Front National Historical Park.⁶⁰ Graves does an excellent job mapping the various aspects of Home Front life in Richmond still in existence at the time of publication in 2004. This study was the precursor to her next piece which delves deeper into the issues of density and housing. Graves' next foray into Richmond's history is a Historic Context Statement for the Project PRISM.⁶¹ Graves notes that "Richmond residents housed migrants in rented rooms, garages, barns and even chicken coops," similar to

the experience in Portland.⁶² Also in the same vein was Richmond's fear of government intervention in city planning and creation of permanent homes for temporary workers.⁶³ Portland also initially resisted federal efforts to assist in the housing of war-industry workers, and both West Coast cities quickly realized the error of their ways.

A multiple-property documentation form with the theme World War II and the American Home Front also painted a broader picture of similar efforts across the nation. Housing plays a small part in the report with mentions of the population shift, growth of Portland, conversion of buildings to housing, and a slow federal response.⁶⁴ This study proved useful for developing overarching themes of World War II but did not contain very much information specific to Portland or the broader theme of housing war-industry workers in underutilized residential and commercial spaces.

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

The objective of this study is to develop a database used to examine War Code Housing projects in Portland and analyze their characteristics for applicability to present housing and density issues. This database was developed through a methodical examination of the primary source data for each housing permit and the entry of documented information into an Excel spreadsheet. The spreadsheet was then geocoded and placed on a GIS map for cartographic analysis. There is currently no searchable online source of information about the properties related to Portland's War Code Housing Program. This database provides that searchable documentation and can be used for further analysis, interpretation, as well as future planning.

Cartographic representation of the data in GIS allows users to interact with the data on a large or small scale, and assists users to visualize the scope of the War Code Housing Program. The data, citizens' willing participation, and the Program's impact could serve as a guide for planners and city officials as one historical example of combatting a housing shortage. A postpositivist methodological paradigm guided the research for this project of both quantitative and qualitative data.

GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION SYSTEMS BACKGROUND

A Geographical Information Systems (GIS) map is an interactive platform which allows users to pinpoint specific data attributes for geospatial, quantitative, and qualitative analysis. While GIS has been around for over thirty years, its widespread use by researchers across disciplines began more recently with the increased use of technology in everyday life. GIS is used by various branches of federal and local governments, historians, emergency services, and healthcare providers, to name a few. Today, almost any data involving a physical space can be mapped using GIS, creating a visual rendering of complex datasets. Popular mapping platforms

like Google Maps and Portland Maps utilize GIS technology and are easy for citizens of all educational levels to use.

GIS is an ideal platform for this project. An Excel table is often not the easiest way to read data as it can be difficult to comprehend the data quickly and succinctly. On the other hand, a map can feature 3,000 points of data on a single page and illuminate the desired information in a digestible format. This data will continue to be adaptable as it is stored both as an Excel spreadsheet and a GIS shapefile. The data can easily be added to existing maps or used as a base for future maps.

DATA COLLECTION

Critical to the success of this project was a systematic approach to collecting the data. This project encompasses over 3,000 unique data points each with 10-20 attributes. I chose Microsoft Excel as the data repository for a few reasons. Microsoft Excel is a widely-used software familiar to many people. It is a searchable tool which keeps data organized and the columns and rows can be easily manipulated, moved, hidden, etc. to examine the data through various filters. Microsoft Excel is a preferred database format for converting data into a GIS shapefile.

In order to keep my data entry process organized, I entered each data source completely before starting on the next. To begin, I manually typed the list of over 3,000 addresses from the Bureau of Development Services (BDS) using the four separate identifiers on the document: address, date, federally assigned permit number, and if a file exists at BDS. Because this source is ordered by street and then house number, it provided an organizational method early on and illuminated characteristics of development such as multiple permits issued to one address on the same day. This data source is a secondary source estimated to be from the 1980s with indicators

of primary sources in the BDS files.⁶⁵ It is important to note that this data does not include the suffix of the address, e.g. “Avenue” or “Street,” but only uncommon suffixes such as “Boulevard” and “Place.” I was able to confirm many such suffixes through cross-referencing in another source; however, some discrepancies may exist.

Next, I turned to the Portland Archives and Records Center War Code Index, a primary source of approximately 300 notecards housed in a shoebox-sized container. The notecards are organized by street, with each notecard listing addresses of properties on that street which were granted permits by date. Some streets have only one or two addresses receiving permits and the information is typed on one note card. Other streets have many properties receiving permits and the information spills over onto five or six typed notecards. The notecards contain the following identifiers: address, permit date, federally assigned permit number, locally assigned housing number, owner, and sometimes additional information regarding the site. While these notecards provide more information than the list at BDS, it is also much harder to interpret due to its creation as a living document. Many notecards contain conflicting information handwritten over the typed portions and the order of the addresses listed is by date and not house number, making examining sites with multiple permits more challenging. As this is the second data source entered into the database, I verified the previous information entered (address, date, and permit number) and added in the locally-assigned housing number, owner, and, if available, additional information such as previous use, size of conversion, and cost. This additional information is identified in the Excel spreadsheet and GIS attribute table as “Notes_PCA_Index.” For the

purpose of this project, I included my own personal observations and thoughts about this data source in a separate column which will not be visible in the GIS attribute table but will be accessible in the Excel spreadsheet.

Next, I entered the information from the original permit applications located at Portland Archives and Records Center. The permit applications are generally one to three pages of 8½” x 14” paper contained in a total of five file boxes. The permit applications are not organized by address like the first two sources; they are first sorted between “residential” and “trailer” permits and then further sorted by the first initial of the owner’s last name. The permit applications are still loosely organized by date as no one requested access to the boxes since their transfer to PARC in the 1980s. The format of the Permit Application varies depending on type of permit (residential or trailer) and date of issuance.

The format of residential permits evolved three times over the course of the War Code Housing Program. Initially the permit was very cluttered on a single page with limited space to handwrite the owners’ name, address, and date of the application. This format did not last long, as by the seventh permit issued there was a new application form. The second iteration of the residential permit application is clearer. The applications are two pages with dedicated lines to provide the requested handwritten information. The final version of the residential permit application, which came about in 1946, is better organized and more detailed, ranging between two and three pages in length. In addition to the information collected in the previous two iterations, there are additional spaces to write in mortgage information and a summary of the proposed alterations. As this is the final source of data entered into the database, I verified that all previously entered information was correct and added any additional information obtained.

The additional information is identified in the Excel spreadsheet and GIS attribute table as “Notes_PCA_Agreement.”

Trailer permits contain the least amount of information. Trailer permits contain the address, owner name, the option to indicate whether the trailer site is a “dwelling” or a “service station,” and the option to indicate whether the property is owned by “him,” “her,” or “them.” Not every applicant elected to designate the trailer site or ownership pronoun.

Permit applications are the most useful source of information as they contain the most data; however, they are the most difficult to research. Since permit applications are organized by the owner’s last name, it is quite difficult to find a permit for a specific address without already knowing the owner’s name. The created file aims to alleviate some of the research challenges by gathering all the primary source information into one database.

CALCULATING THE CONVERSION RATE

I developed an approach for determining the size of a conversion to calculate the total number of units created through the War Code Housing Program. In order to display this information, I inserted three columns of numeric data within Excel. The “existing unit” is the number of rented or owned spaces prior to a War Code issued permit. The “converted unit” is the number of rented or owned spaces after a War Code issued permit. The “additional unit” is the number of extra units created by dividing a space or adding an accessory structure through a War Code issued permit.

Most permit applications list the original function of the space/site such as “storeroom,” “garage,” or “single-family residence” and from this I was able to establish a base number for the existing unit. If it was a single-family residence or garage, the existing unit is 1; if it was a

duplex, the existing unit is 2. For the use of trailers and newly-constructed outbuildings, the existing unit is 0, as nothing previously existed in its place.

The next number is then the number of units existing after the permit. If a single-family residence added a basement apartment, the number of converted units is 2. If a garage was used as a residence, the number of converted units is 1. If a trailer was added to a site, the number of converted units is 1. If a single-family residence changed to a rooming house for ten boarders, the number of converted units is 11. The number of existing units after the permit proved to be the most difficult to ascertain, as many early permits list no information regarding the work done or the size of the converted space/site.

I determined the number of additional units created through a simple math equation of converted units minus existing units to ascertain the total number of additional units created. This resulting number is not the total number of War Code Housing units, but rather the potential increase in occupancy through the subdivision of a space. Many permits did not involve the creation of a new space but just the transformation of an existing one. For example, a single storeroom converting to a single apartment does not create an additional unit; it is a change in the use of a space from commercial unit to a housing unit. A single storeroom converting to two apartments is the creation of one additional unit; the space could be used by one occupant before, and now it is used by two occupants. Since future planners may look at the War Code Housing Program as a model of a successful internal conversion initiative, it is critical to establish the number of additional units created by the War Code Housing Program and not just how many previously existing buildings and spaces were used for housing by changing their function.

CLEANING THE DATA

In GIS, there is a process known as “cleaning” data or taking raw data and editing it for consistency and similar formatting. To document all steps taken and prevent any misrepresentation of the data, an original, unedited database exists, as does a “cleaned-up” database used for mapping. Permits often contain abbreviated names such as “Geo” for George or “Chas” for Charles which I elected to enter as the full name. Some permits contained only first and middle initials but could be cross-referenced with another permit listing the full name. Similarly, permits varied between listing male owners and joint owners but could be cross-referenced with other permits containing both names. Many permits were missing either a date or a housing number; however, because the local housing number was assigned sequentially, sorting the data by date or by housing number provided the missing piece of information

Discrepancies and errors are still possible when working with such a large dataset manually entered and cleaned by one individual. I strived to eliminate all guesswork while cleaning the data by only altering information verified across multiple sources and consistent with 1940s America, the time period when the primary sources were created.

GEOCODING THE DATA

I used a process called geocoding to convert the addresses in the Excel database into a GIS vector format. Geocoding is the process of converting street addresses into geographic coordinates, thereby creating a dataset that can be mapped using GIS. For this project, I used Metro’s Regional Land Information System (RLIS) address locator dataset since all my targeted addresses are within the Metro boundary. One of the challenges with my data is that it is now seventy years old. Some street names changed, some portions of streets or blocks disappeared for new construction such as the I-5 freeway, and many blocks within the downtown core

transformed from multi-parcel to a single building altering the address. When geocoding in the ArcMap GIS software, the locator will supply a report of “matched” addresses – those that had the same address in the RLIS dataset – and “unmatched” addresses – those that did not have an exact match and could not be placed. Each address result is also assigned a percentage of accuracy for the match helping to illuminate potential mistakes in the geocoding process.

On the first try, about one in six permit applications did not match. The report table quickly pinpointed spelling errors as well as altering the street name of “Union Avenue” to “Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard,” for example. On the second try, about one in ten permit applications did not match. The remaining unmatched permit applications existed in drastically changed areas such as Downtown, Albina, and St. Johns. Another hundred or so permits matched to incorrect addresses in Canby or Gresham. This is because the database I created did not specifically list a city name or zip code for each address, and therefore addresses would be perceived by the RLIS locator as a match anywhere within the Metro region. I manually selected locations in ArcMap for the unmatched and incorrectly matched addresses outside of Portland. After rectifying all errors within the geocoded data, I exported the data as a layer creating a GIS vector shapefile that could then be applied to many maps. I utilized symbology to create maps displaying the various attributes of data and analyze it geospatially.

I also edited the current RLIS Transit Streetcar dataset to recreate the historic streetcar route. I added the missing historic routes by drawing new lines and then snapping the lines to the RLIS streets and arterial datasets to ensure accuracy. I then exported the data to a new shapefile and added it as a layer to my maps.

CASE STUDIES – SE ANKENY AND SE BELMONT

I selected SE Ankeny Street and SE Belmont Street for several reasons. On each street, roughly ten to twenty permits were issued on each street providing a large enough sample to show a variety of conversions but a small enough sample for one individual to reasonably study within the scope of the project. SE Ankeny is a primarily residential road close to the major thoroughfare of Burnside. SE Belmont is mixed-use, with both commercial and residential properties. No portion of the case study falls within a protected area such as a National Register Historic District or Conservation District that would diminish the likelihood of design alterations or demolition. Individual properties may be designated and therefore required to adhere to policies regarding design review or demolition. These properties are noted in the case study. Prior to conducting a case study of the War Code Housing Program sites, I had no knowledge or hypothesis as to what I would find.

LIMITATIONS

Time and financial constraints limited the scope of this project. It was not possible to thoroughly research the approximately 2,400 individual sites which utilized the War Code Housing Program within the research period. Further research by the author or other curious individuals can continue to be incorporated into the Excel spreadsheet and GIS shapefile. There is a \$15.00 fee for each address researched at the Bureau of Development Services, meaning more than \$30,000 would be necessary to locate historic building plans and permits for all properties associated with the Program. Research centers such as the Portland Archives and Records Center and the Oregon Historical Society have limited research hours and very little of the primary source data is scanned or available online. A major outcome of this project is to

allow easy access to the data by organizing and publishing data from the applications in an online database searchable by anyone at any time.

The information obtained on the various permit applications and indices is often incomplete. There are four different versions of the permit application (three versions of the residential permit and one version of the trailer permit) resulting in different amounts of information recorded at the time of the permit application. No single property contains all of the different attributes identified through this research. The use of three data sources also created some conflicting information. Permit numbers, dates, spelling of owners' names, and the addresses sometimes varied between the data sources. I used the two unique identifiers of "permit number" and "housing number" to assist in clarifying discrepancies but could not always do so with one hundred percent certainty. I extended common abbreviations of first names to full names although it is possible that the full name is incorrect. I also included the full couple as the owner for all permits whenever the couple could be identified on another data source. This could be inaccurate as a married individual could own a property separately or have purchased the property prior to marriage.

Determining the conversion of a building or part of a building to housing is not always clear on the data sources. Property descriptions may not match today's language, e.g. "store" and "storeroom" appear to be used interchangeably. For example, a permit may say, "storeroom converted to single-family dwelling," which does not clarify whether the whole store is now a residence or only a part of the store. It is difficult to assign an "existing units" number to certain building types, such as a hotel. It is unclear whether the hotel simply allowed for the use of its rooms as housing, whether rooms were subdivided, or if spaces previously used for other purposes were changed to housing.

Another challenge with the representation of converted housing units is the size and function of the units. I made a conscious decision to count any sleeping space for a person as a unit, therefore a rooming house for no more than ten boarders becomes ten units. This could be construed as a misrepresentation of data since a boarding house or sleeping room is not the same as an apartment. In conjunction with this issue, permit applications do not clearly state whether the unit is used for a single person or a family, making the quantifiable number of people housed difficult to determine. It is impossible to say whether a boarding house with ten beds housed more people than a duplex converted to a fourplex since it is not known how many people lived in each fourplex unit.

Information about those occupying rental units permitted through the War Code Housing Program could not be located. Permit applications only listed the owner of the property and not the renter or the occupancy size of the unit. It is therefore nearly impossible to determine who or how many individuals lived in each unit that was created. This would be a fascinating project for a future researcher to attempt to unearth, as knowing more about the occupants could provide information about the size of units and demographic information of renters such as race, age, education level, and more. Census data could provide some information but as the War Code Housing Program started in 1942 and the last permit was issued in 1950. The 1940 census would not reflect war industry workers and the 1950 census would not reflect all of the permits already released and converted back to their previous size and function.

There is also an issue of access to the records. Private citizens conducting research can only thoroughly review the information presented to them as it is kept behind closed doors. This policy is in place to protect records from theft and preserve records from decay or corruption through improper handling or storage. Employees assisting researchers at BDS, PARC, and

OHS rotate regularly and each employee may have a different level of familiarity with the topic and the available records. This may result in staff retrieving varying amounts of pertinent material, especially if not clearly stating what material one is looking to find. By varying the description of desired materials slightly, I received vastly different documents from different employees. As I was dependent upon others to retrieve this information for me, it is all colored by human element: possible error on my part to not clearly articulate the information I sought, and potential error on the employee's part who may overlook a piece of information. In other instances, permit files could not be located despite records proving their existence, thereby creating a heightened sense of urgency to catalogue and digitize what information can be found.

DATA FINDINGS

The aggregate data from the 3,043 permits displays a history of collaboration and creativity between Portland residents and war-industry workers. In total, the War Code housing project created 6,146 new housing units of various sizes from 2,303 unique addresses. Of the 3,043 permits, 1,663 permits converted an existing building into residential units, 1,205 permits allowed for a trailer, and 175 permits allowed the construction of an accessory dwelling unit.

Each permit application is a unique row in the Excel spreadsheet and a unique point in the GIS shapefile. The data related to each permit application can be accessed in either format depending on the user's familiarity and comfort level. The following is a geospatial analysis of the data.

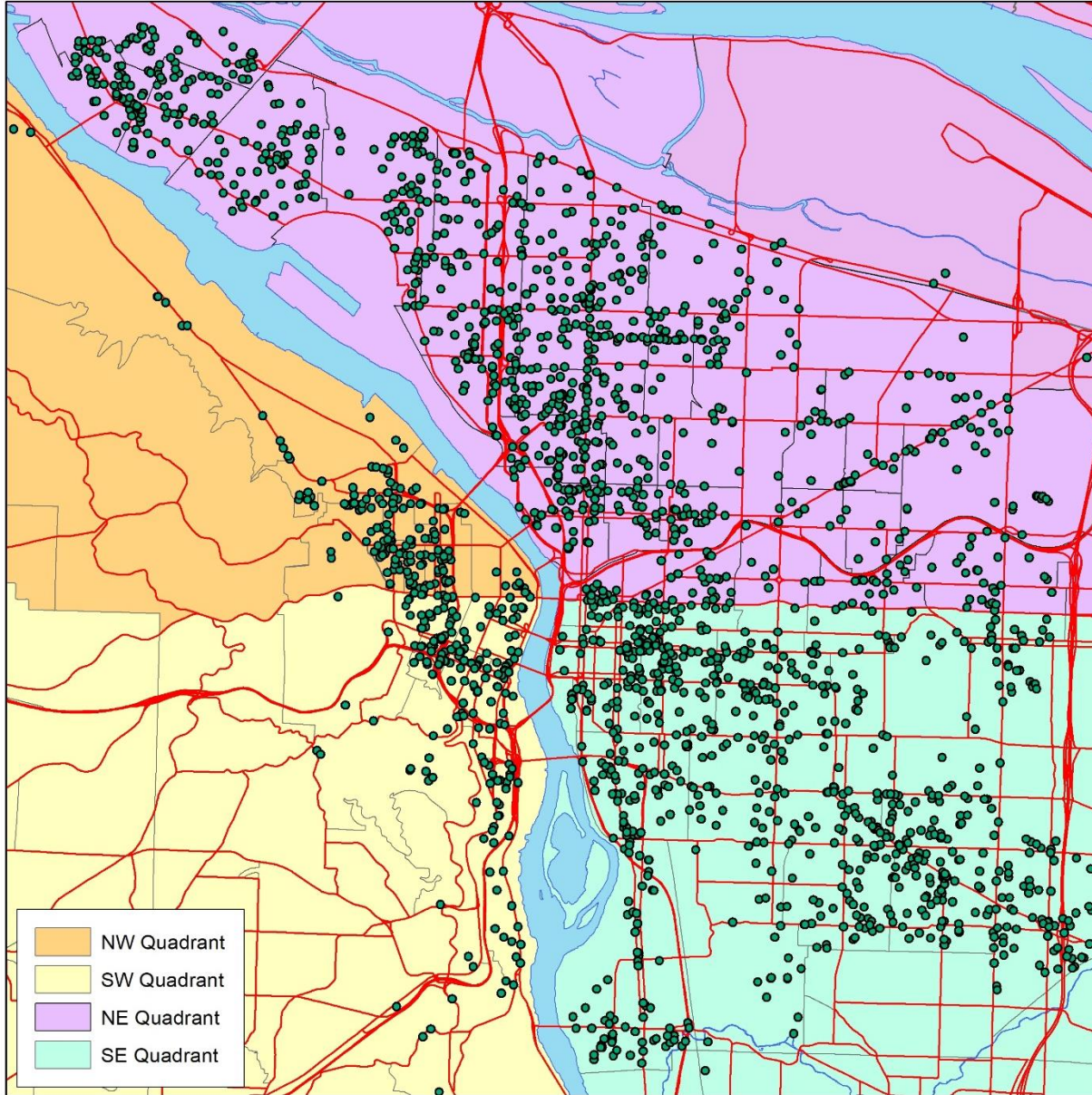


Figure 1: GIS Map displaying permits by Geographic Quadrant. Created by author.

GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION

The geographic distribution of War Code housing is directly related to the location of wartime industries and proximity to public transportation. Portland is generally described in four

quadrants divided to the north and south by Burnside Street and to the east and west by the Willamette River. Approximately 1,390 issued permit sites are in the northeast quadrant of Portland. Approximately 974 issued permit sites are in the southeast quadrant of Portland. Approximately 459 issued permit sites are in the northwest quadrant of Portland. Approximately 220 issued permit sites are in the southwest quadrant of Portland.

The reason more War Code Housing Program permits are located on the eastern side of Portland is threefold. Most war-industry job sites were in the northeastern quadrant of Portland, such as the Kaiser shipyards. Historic streetcar lines extended further into the eastern suburbs of Portland, facilitating transportation to and from outlying buildings able to house workers. The center of downtown in the 1940s was located on the west side of town and, while many hotels and commercial buildings on the west side converted to residential use, more single-family homes existed on the east side of town. Residential dwelling units were the predominant converted building type with slightly over half the permits approved belonging to already-existing residences. The commercial core of Portland still served a valuable purpose during the war years and could not transform to housing without losing other needed services.

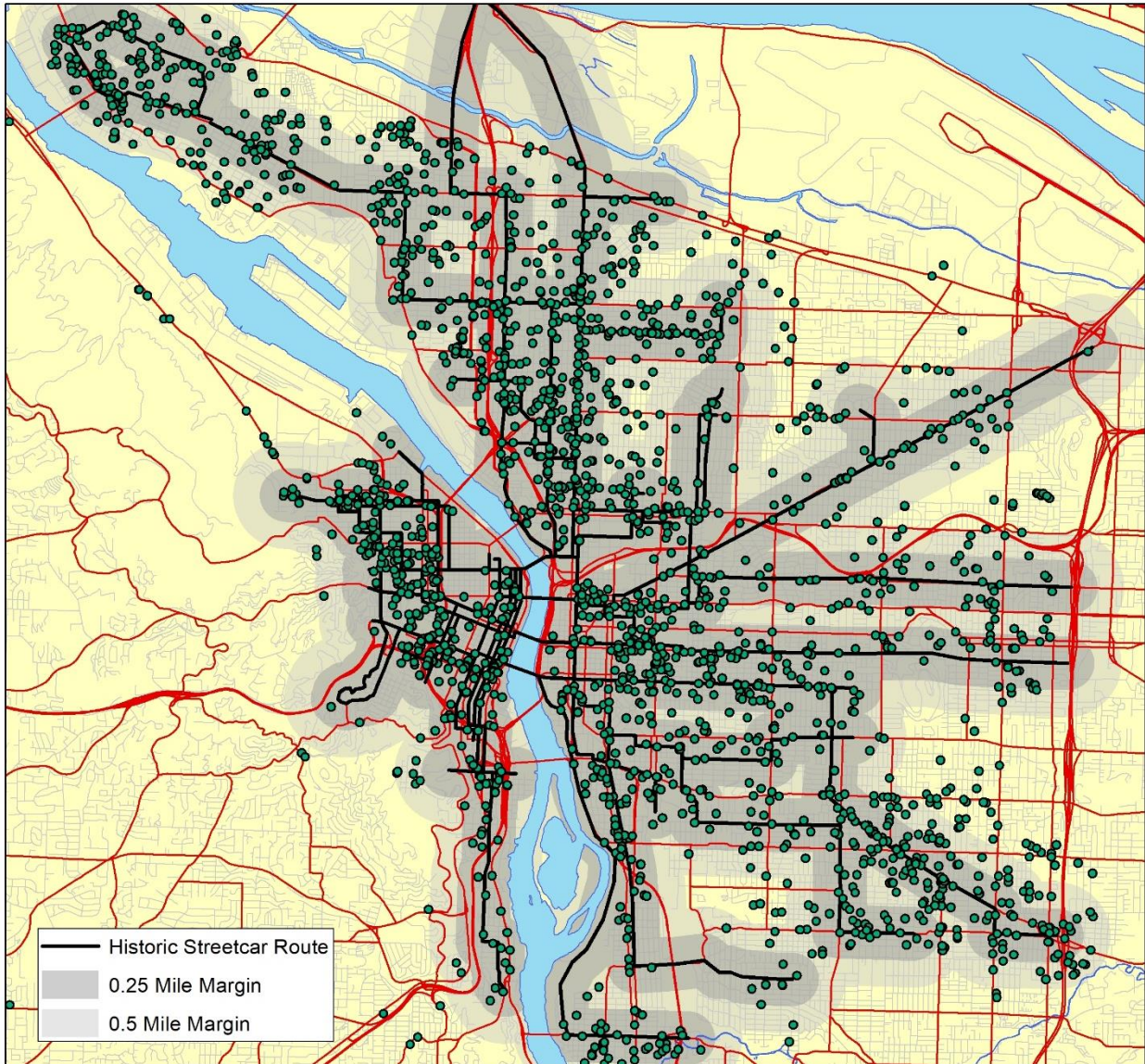


Figure 2: GIS Map displaying accessibility to Public Transit. Created by author.

PROXIMITY TO PUBLIC TRANSIT

An important factor of War Code permits is the proximity to public transit as automobile transport was unfeasible for most war-industry workers. Not only did the government ration

rubber and gasoline, but some industries like the Kaiser Shipyards employed over 100,000 making on-site parking implausible. Portland utilized streetcars as public transit beginning in 1872 and continuing until 1958, with ridership records peaking again during World War II.⁶⁶ In order to display the accessibility of public transit to sites, I recreated the historic streetcar line through the central city and placed a quarter mile and half mile buffer around each streetcar line.

Very few permits existed outside the half mile buffer of the streetcar line. This map does not depict the bus routes which would have potentially served the outlying permit sites. Historic bus routes are difficult to map as bus routes changed regularly and there is very little recorded about their routes.

The map shown above is a sound argument for development of dense, affordable housing close to existing public transit. For most war-industry workers, public transit was the only viable option to get to and from work. It is smart for city planners to utilize such historic examples as they develop future transit lines and urban pockets. Access to public transit promotes all five of the guiding principles within Portland's 2035 Comprehensive Plan and should be an integral discussion topic of every proposed multi-family dwelling.⁶⁷

New War Code Permits Issued by Year

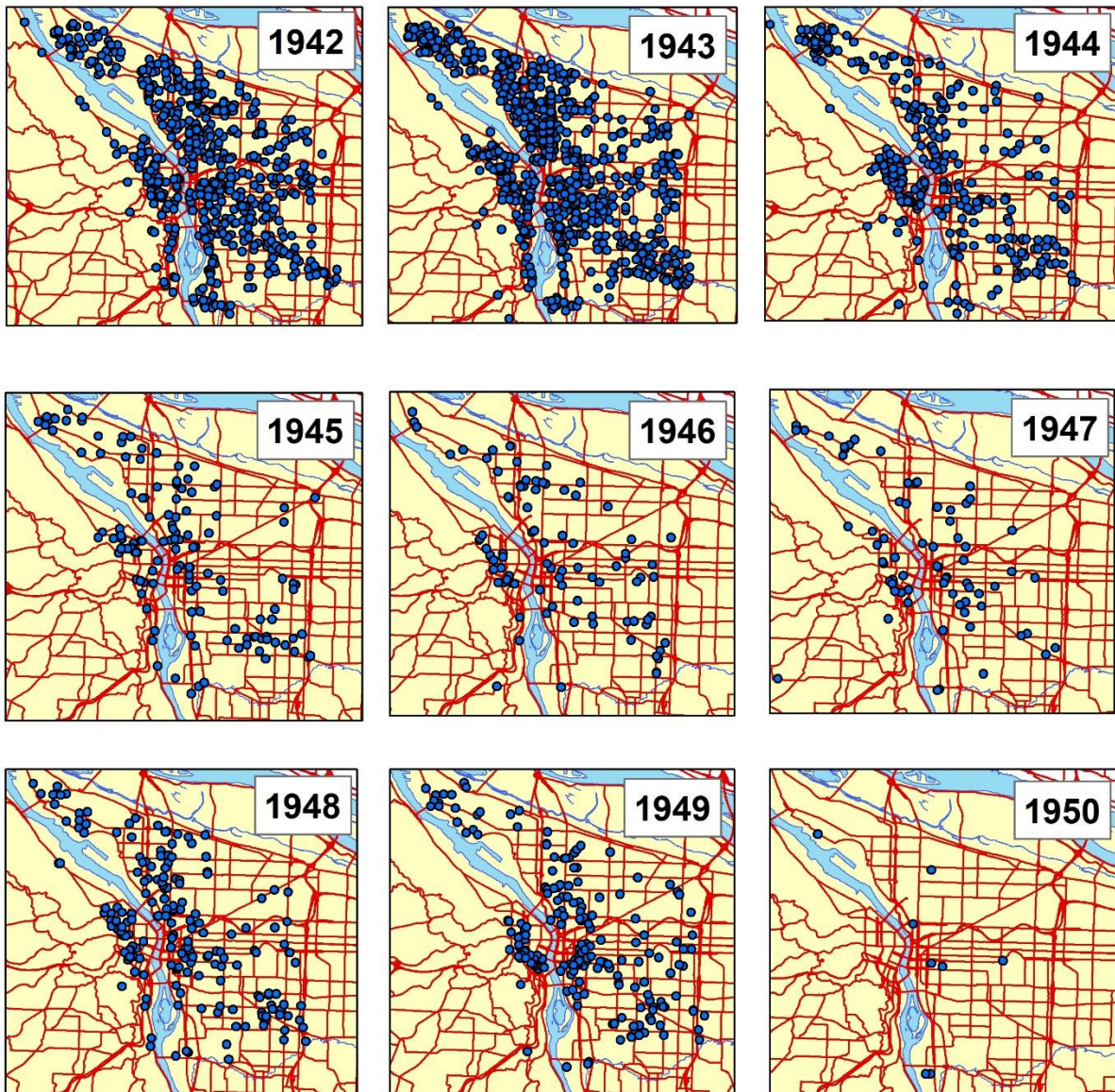


Figure 3: GIS Map of War Code Permits by Year. Created by author.

DATE

The War Code housing program issued permits between July of 1942 and February of 1950. Most permits were issued during World War II but a significant amount continued to be

issued afterwards, emphasizing the value of the program. The chart below demonstrates the rapid implementation of the program immediately following its creation July 30th of 1942. Nearly 700 permits were issued within the first six months. The program continues to drastically increase housing options through 1943 with more than fifty new permits approved each month.

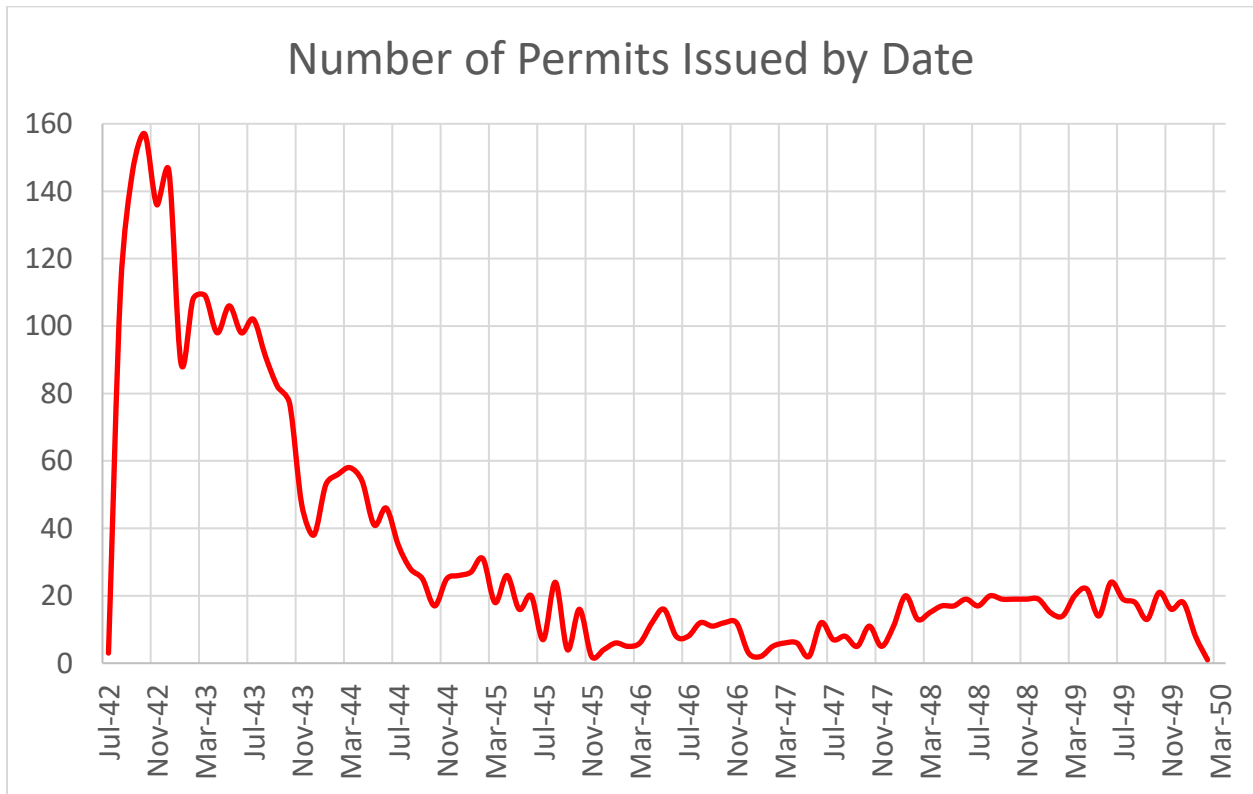


Figure 4: Chart of New Permits Issued by Date. Created by author.

There is a gradual decline in permits issued between 1944 and 1947 as the war concluded and housing was no longer a national emergency. In 1947 the least number of permits were issued at only 80 permits. There is an uptick of permits starting in the spring of 1948 as 214 new permits were issued. I could find no direct connection between the flooding of Vanport in May of 1948 and the increase in permits issued as I did not locate information about those renting War Code Housing units. It is likely that housing needs increased after the flood at Vanport and residents, once again, utilized government-sponsored programs to ease the situation. Further research

would need to be conducted to solidify this assumption. 1949 would also prove to be a strong year with the same number of 214 new permits issued. The program quickly comes to a halt in 1950 with only 9 new permits issued before March, although the program continued until 1956.

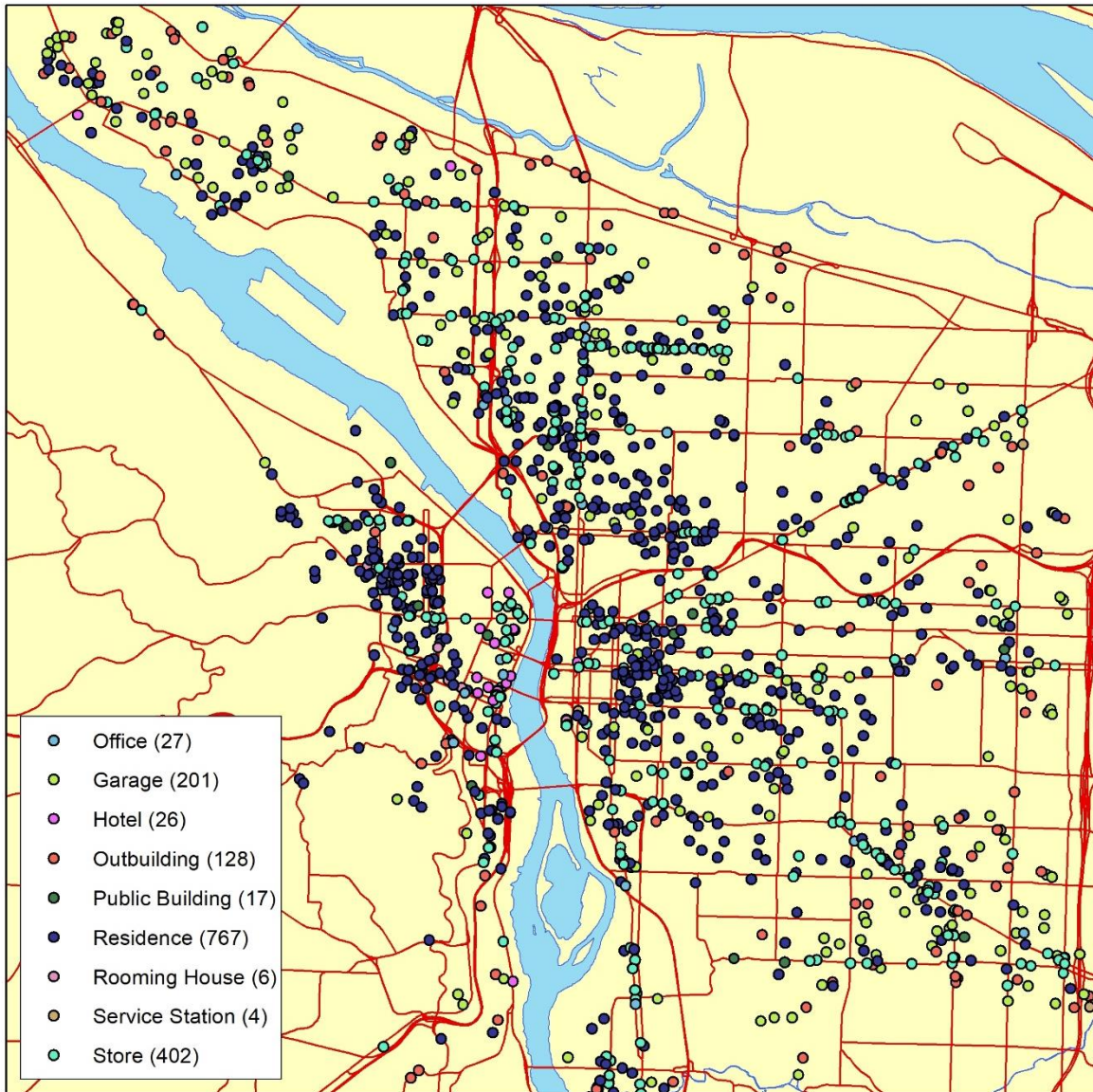


Figure 5: GIS Map of the Previous Building Use. Created by author.

CONVERSION TYPE AND SIZE

War Code permit applications are categorized as either trailer or residential, although residential is an incorrect label as it applies to all existing buildings. In order to better understand the previous uses of existing sites, residential permits have been further categorized by previous building use, i.e. store, dwelling, garage, etc. The total number of trailer permits issued is 1,205, or slightly over one-third of the program. The remaining two thirds are visually represented in the following map.

Almost half of the existing building stock which used the War Code Housing Program to increase available units were buildings already used for residential purposes. This category of “residence” is not broken down on the map between different types of residential buildings, such as single-family dwelling, duplex, or multi-family dwelling although that information can be found within the Excel dataset. Nevertheless, the sheer amount of residential properties increasing the occupancy of their structures illustrates the success of internal conversions. Permits for a residence, unlike a majority of the permits issued for stores or garages, involved the subdividing of the structure into multiple units. These units were not always spacious. Many did not include traditional amenities such as a private bathroom or a kitchen. What they did, however, is assist families and individuals in finding a safe living space and foster a sense of community through sharing hardship.

Most War Code permits noted the number of units before and after issuance of the permit, creating a way to measure the change in units. As previously mentioned, this is difficult to determine with precision as it is impossible to know the occupancy of each unit and therefore the effectiveness of the program. It is interesting to note the breakdown of spaces and visualize the configurations of buildings. In total, 812 sites simply required the alteration of a space from

a previous use to residential, i.e. a store to a residence. By adding a partition or splitting units between floors, an additional 574 sites created units by dividing one unit into two. 147 sites created units through division of a space into three units. 61 sites created units through division of a space into four units. 43 sites created units through division of a space into five units. 27 sites created units through division of a space into six units. 22 sites created units through the division of a space into seven units. 16 sites created units through the division of a space into 8 units. 13 sites created units through the division of a space into 9 units. 32 sites created units through the division of a space into ten units. And finally, 59 sites created units through the division of a space into more than ten units.

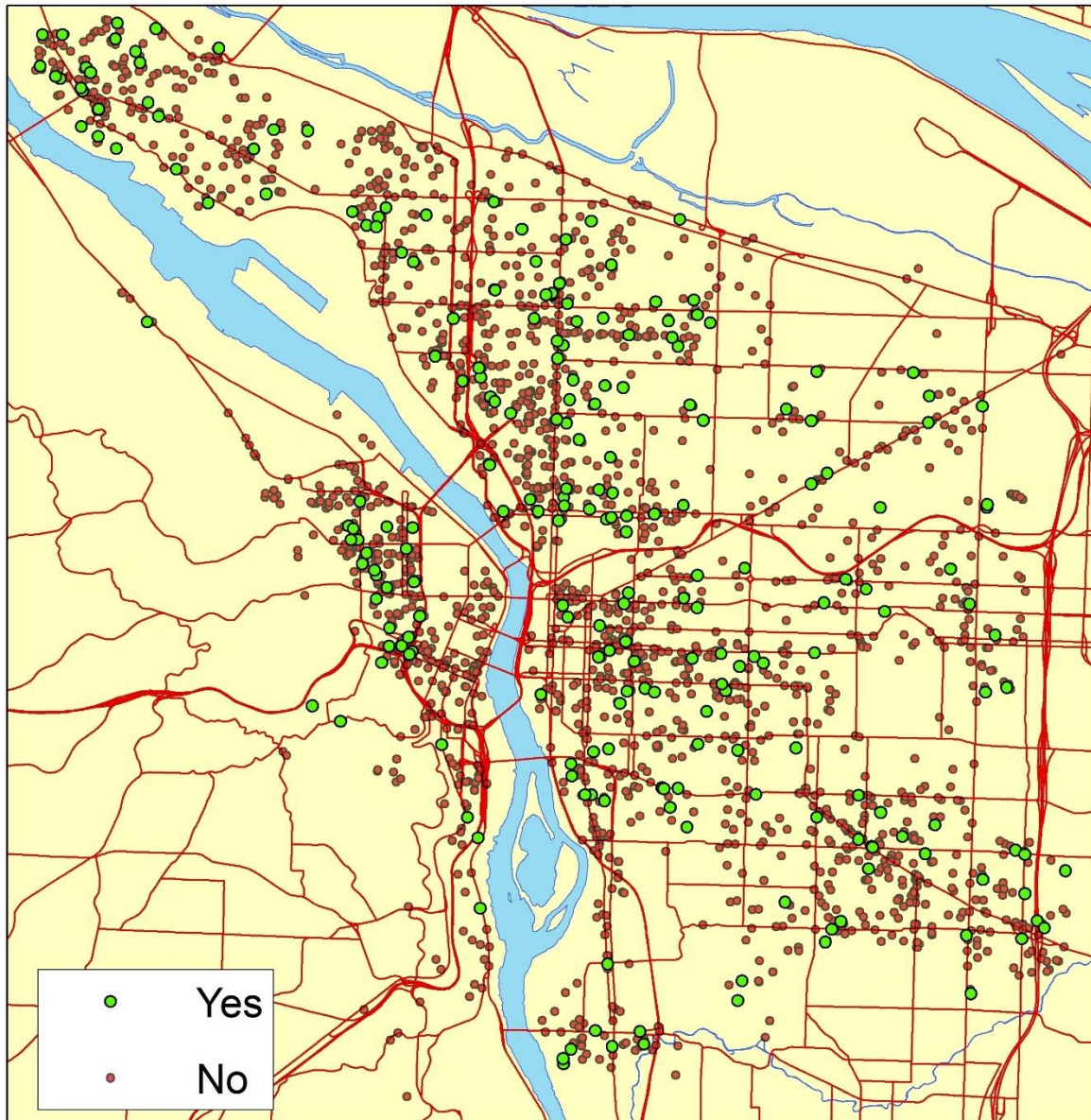


Figure 6: GIS Map illustrating sites of Female-owned Properties. Created by author.

FEMALE OWNERS

An area for further research is that of female homeownership during the 1940s in Portland. Trailer permit applications included an option to circle a pronoun related to ownership

of the property; although not every applicant elected to circle this pronoun, many women did, stimulating creation of this preliminary analysis. Residential permit applications did not include a specific place to circle a pronoun, but many female owners explicitly stated their demographic information on the line intended for describing the alterations. Through this data collection, 278 sites have been identified as having a female owner and more may exist. Of the 278 female owners, 118 are widows and 46 are single, unmarried women. The remaining 114 permit applications citing a female owner did not explicitly state the status of the individual.

REMAINING LEGACY

Many buildings converted to War Code housing remain today. Some remain in their converted state of housing while others returned to their original functions. Portland's long history of preservation and single-family zoning allowed many buildings to survive more than seventy years after World War II. The continuing existence of these buildings proves the value of good construction, adaptable building forms, and intriguing architectural forms.

Commercial and residential structures used as housing during World War II often were already considered "old" buildings. Permit applications demonstrate a continuous characterization of buildings from the late 1800s and first part of the twentieth century as old, rundown, and in need of repair. The War Code Housing Program provided an opportunity for owners of such dilapidated buildings to rehabilitate a portion or all of their building. The construction allowed under the War Code focused on changes that would increase potential housing. Enhancements such as updating or creating a bathroom, creating new windows or other means of egress, enclosing a front porch, or finishing a basement or attic were approved. These changes not only created a living space but provided a timely remodel to many older buildings. And, as dictated within the War Code permit, any changes would need to be removed after the permit expired unless owners proceeded to procure a permanent permit, thus ensuring another phase of construction at the conclusion of the Program.

Buildings that last more than a century often survive because they are adaptable. Whether it is the original open floor plan of a warehouse that can easily be partitioned into smaller units or a single-family residence with an unfinished basement and attic that can be subdivided into a triplex, buildings remain that change with the needs of the owner and surrounding community. The War Code Housing Program seized upon this very nature of

Portland's building stock to create residential units, and the plethora of remaining War Code building stock shows the continued value of adaptable building forms. Due to the time constraints of this project and policies regarding the viewing of building plans, it is not possible to identify every building converted to War Code Housing that remains today. But, from a small sampling of a few streets, one can see that much is still standing.

The analysis of two streets with multiple conversions demonstrates the retention of historic resources. The first street analyzed is SE Ankeny Street, a predominantly residential street one block south of Burnside Street, a major thoroughfare in the 1940s and today.

CASE STUDY – SE ANKENY

Nine residential properties were converted through the War Code Housing Program along SE Ankeny between 15th and 31st Avenues. It is important to note that this section of SE Ankeny is not a part of a historic or conservation district. The converted properties were either single-family homes or duplexes and ranged in architectural styles. From an initial count of twelve existing residential units in nine buildings, twenty units were added, bringing the total number of converted units to thirty-two. Today, six of the nine buildings remain.

The duplex at 1504 SE Ankeny Street converted to a triplex March of 1945 and remains a triplex today. The residence at 1504 SE Ankeny is a Queen Anne from 1888 clad in stucco and still in good condition. The War Code Index

notecard at Portland Archives and Records Center lists the addition of a unit in the basement costing twenty-five dollars. A permanent permit could not be identified but the building is still used as a triplex based off of a reconnaissance-level survey conducted by the author April of 2019. Three doors of entry are clearly marked, and three mail slots adorn the side of the building. This building does have a Historic Resource Inventory Form from 1984 but is classified as unranked.⁶⁸ A historic plumbing permit could also be found in relation to the War Code permit and it lists the building as a “1 story old frame dwelling” in need of work.⁶⁹

The single-family home at 1628 SE Ankeny Street converted to a triplex January of 1944 and reverted back to a single-family home at an unknown time. The residence at 1628 SE Ankeny is a Prairie Style from 1906 and in excellent condition. The Bureau of Development Services possesses the

floor plans from 1944 illustrating the conversion of the second story to two units with individual kitchens, closets, and a shared bath. The upstairs units are quite large at 234 square feet and 324 square feet respectively. There is a fourth space on the second floor labeled as a bedroom with a separate entrance disconnected from the two War Code apartments. It is unclear if this bedroom

continued to be used by the owners whom only retained one-bedroom downstairs or if this bedroom was used by the upstairs tenants. The building is not identified as a historic resource. Multiple historic plumbing permits could be located including one from 1923 that already describes the building as old.⁷⁰

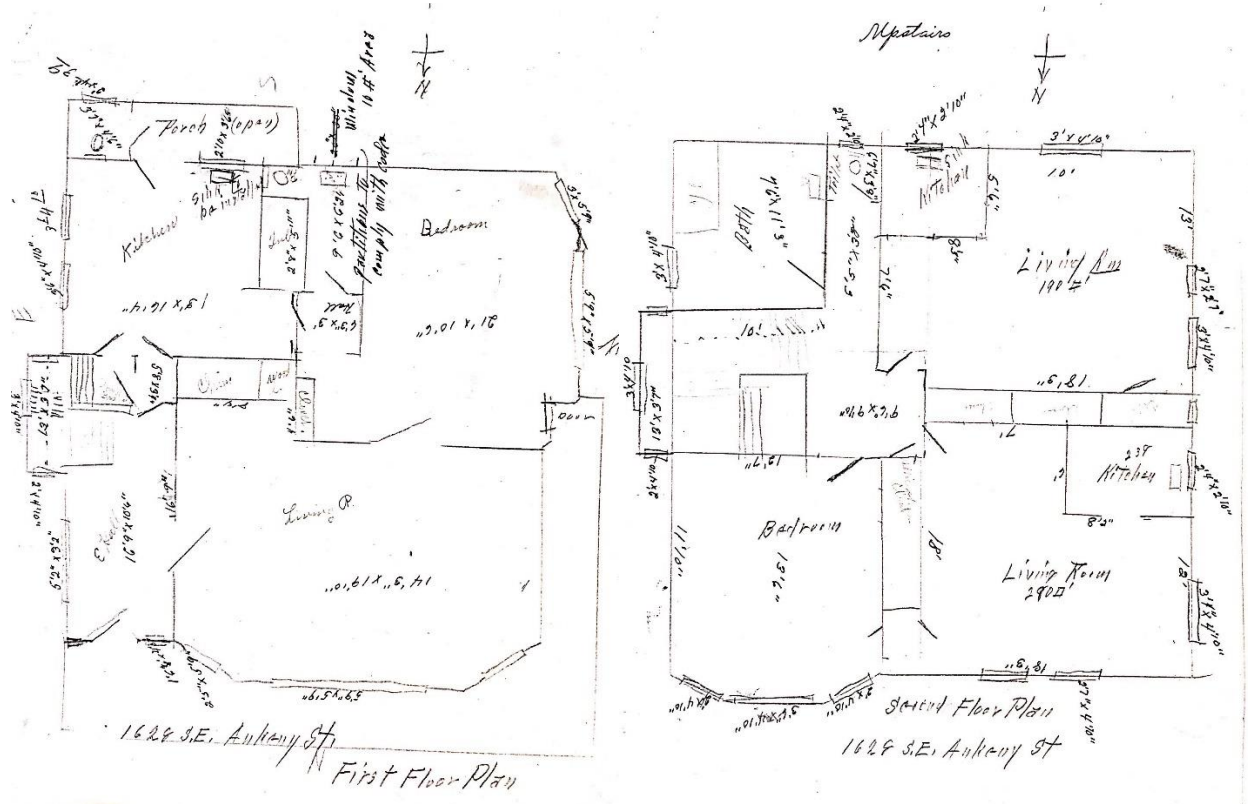


Figure 9: 1628 SE Ankeny Street Floor Plans, 1944. Drawings from Bureau of Development Services.

The single-family residence at 1906 SE Ankeny Street converted to four apartments and two sleeping rooms February of 1943 and is now a triplex. The residence at 1906 SE Ankeny is a Victorian Stick from 1900 and in good condition. The Bureau of Development Services possesses the floor plans from 1943 illustrating the alterations to the first and second floors (See below). The first floor did not change significantly although a few walls were removed or added to create a clear separation between Apartment A and the

communal spaces of the home, including the kitchen, dining room, and front room. The second floor is transformed into three apartments (Apartments B, C, and D) with large closets, a large bedroom with shared closet for the two occupants, and a shared bathroom for all upstairs units. Each apartment is around 120 square feet and the bedroom is 150 square feet. It is unclear when the building transitioned into a triplex. It is not identified as a historic resource.

The single-family residence at 2014 SE Ankeny Street converted to a two-family residence June of 1949 and reverted back to a single-family home at an unknown date. The building is a Queen Anne from 1899 and in excellent condition. The War Code Index notecard at Portland Archives and Records Center states the conversion cost \$300 to complete. There is a Historic Resource Inventory form assigning the residence with a rank of III for

architecture.⁷¹ No other information regarding the site could be located.

The duplex at 2345 SE Ankeny Street added a basement apartment in June of 1943 and remains that way today with the separate address of 2349 SE Ankeny Street creating the triplex. The building is Queen Anne from 1906 and in good condition. There is a Historic Resource Inventory form listing the building as unranked for significance.⁷² No other information regarding the site could be located.

The multi-family residence at 3087 SE Ankeny Street added an additional basement apartment February of 1943. This building as a U-shaped apartment complex in the California Mission style from 1928. It currently has 15 units. It is unclear if the one basement unit of the complex is the unit created in 1943 or if there was an additional unit no longer used for housing.

A woman owned this apartment complex at the time of its conversion. There is a Historic Resource Inventory form assigning the residence with a rank of II for architecture.⁷³ Historic Plumbing permits could be located but no other information could be ascertained.

All three of the sites no longer existing on Ankeny west of 15th Avenue were demolished and replaced by half- to full-block buildings. This represents the creeping development of the inner east side of Portland since the Great Recession. Both of the addresses located on SE Ankeny between 12th and 13th Avenues have been demolished to create large apartment buildings while the third between 14th and 15th is part of a larger religious complex.

1223 SE Ankeny was a single-family home that added two basement apartments February of 1943. It appears this block was demolished in 2012 to create a mixed-use building of commercial on the ground floor and senior apartments on the upper five floors.

1224-28 SE Ankeny was a duplex that converted to a fourplex April of 1943 and was released in October of 1948. It appears this block was demolished in 2016 to create a new four-story 27-unit apartment building.

The third site of 1434 SE Ankeny Street was a single-family home converted to three apartments and three sleeping rooms by a female owner. This site is now a large place of worship and community center for Imago Dei in relation to other parts of their campus along SE Ankeny.

CASE STUDY – SE BELMONT

The second street analyzed is SE Belmont Street, a residential and commercial thoroughfare that had a historic streetcar route along a portion of the road and remains a bustling street today. It is important to note that this area is not a part of a historic or conservation

district. Twenty permits for sixteen properties were issued along SE Belmont Street between 17th and 52nd Avenues. Nine of the properties were commercial prior to conversion and seven of the properties residential. These sixteen properties originally contained thirty units of commercial or residential space but through the War Code Housing Program functioned as fifty-four residential units. Of the sixteen converted properties, twelve remain today: seven commercial and five residential.

The single-family residence at 1728 SE Belmont Street converted to a duplex August of 1942 and then a triplex in October of 1942. This building is of the Italianate style from 1870 and

is in excellent condition. There is a Historic Resource Inventory form for the site assigning it a rank of I for architecture.⁷⁴ The site is also a Local Landmark. There are Historic Plumbing permits associated with the building.⁷⁵ No other information could be located.

The store at 2411 SE Belmont Street converted to residence in May of 1943 and reverted back to its previous use as a store at an unknown date. The building is a Streetcar-era Commercial building covered in corrugated metal with a flat roof built in 1934. There are Historic Plumbing permits associated with

the building.⁷⁶ No other information could be located.

The duplex at 2510 SE Belmont Street added an additional unit in January of 1943 and is now a fourplex with the address 2508-2512 SE Belmont Street. The building is of the Italianate Style from 1910 and in good condition. There are Historic Plumbing permits associated with the building.⁷⁷ No other information could be located.

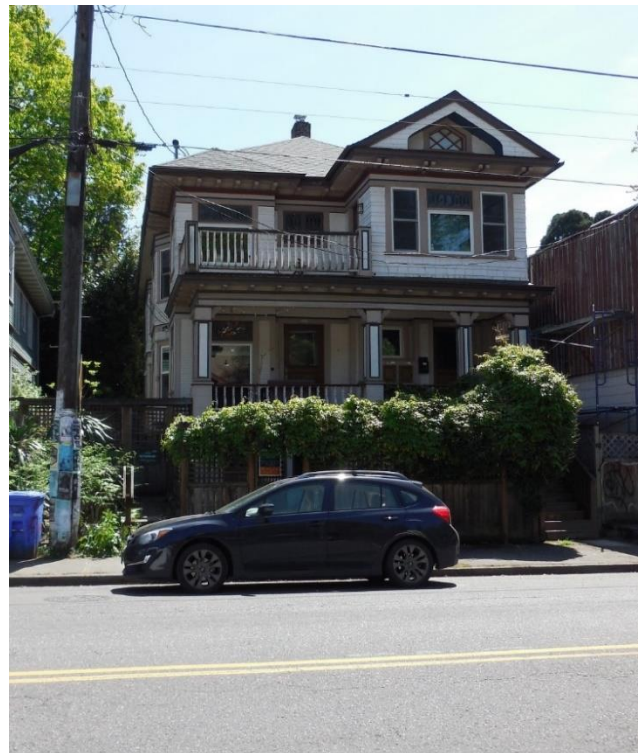


Figure 20: 2508-2512 SE Belmont Street. Photo by author.

The stores at 2622 SE Belmont Street and 2628 SE Belmont Street each transformed into a residential unit February of 1943 and reverted back to commercial use September of 1947. The building, listed as one address of 2622-2628 SE Belmont Street, is associated with two permit applications

of on different dates during February of 1943 and therefore associated with their two storefronts. The building is Streetcar-Era Commercial dating to 1911 and is in poor condition. This building lost integrity with the removal of the clerestory and storefront windows.

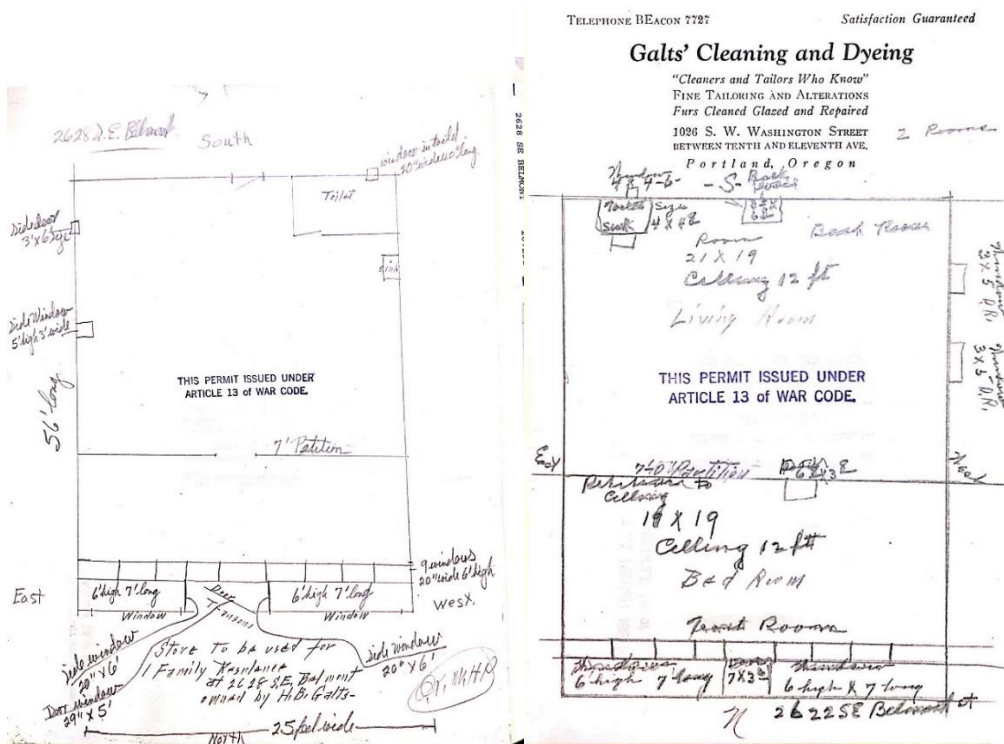


Figure 22: Building Plans for 2628 SE Belmont Street (left) and 2622 SE Belmont Street (right). Located at Bureau of Development Services.

Building plans submitted with the permit application show the lack of formality accepted by those approving the permits. The rendering for 2622 SE Belmont is drawn on a 4"x7" piece of paper with a dry-cleaning business letterhead, likely a notepad of the business used for writing down special instructions but in this case used to illustrate a residence. Building Permits show this building returned to its previous function as a tavern June of 1947 and continues to function as such today.

The mixed-use building at 2904 SE Belmont Street converted from nine units to sixteen units July of 1947 and appears to still be sixteen units with a restaurant below.⁷⁸

The current address is listed as 2900-2908 SE Belmont. The building is Streetcar-Era commercial from 1910 and is in good condition. No other information could be located.

The mixed-use building at 3127-3129 SE Belmont Street converted its store at 3129 SE Belmont St. to a residential unit in April of 1944 and reverted back to a store in November of 1948. The building, which is from 1887, has been significantly altered over time and cannot even be assigned a particular style. The lower portion tied to the 3129 address is closer to Streetcar-Era Commercial dominated by glass block windows while the upper portion tied to the 3127 address is Craftsman. The store is currently

vacant but the overall building is in good condition.

The building plans for 3129 SE Belmont are hard to decipher but one can clearly make out a range in the southeast corner of the main room, a sink, and a toilet in the southeast corner of the floor. Building permits show continuous remodels throughout the 1960s and 1980s as the store changed from a residence during the War to a restaurant and then to a broadcasting station.

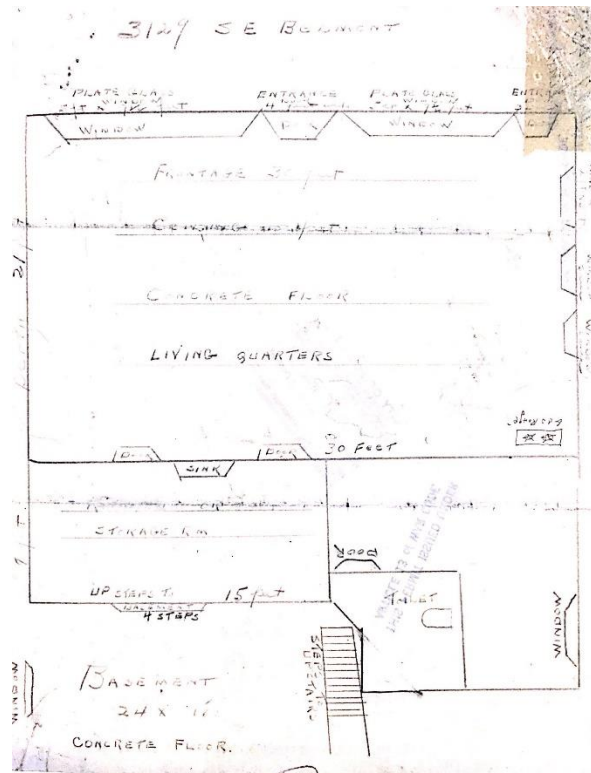


Figure 25: 3129 SE Belmont Street. Located at Bureau of Development Services.

The single-family home at 3138 SE Belmont Street converted to a fourplex February of 1944 and is currently a triplex. The building is a Queen Anne from 1895 and in excellent condition. There is a Historic Plumbing permit associated with the property.⁷⁹ No other information could be located.

The store at 3326 SE Belmont Street converted to a residential unit November of 1942 and reverted back to commercial use. The building is Streetcar-Era commercial from 1928 and in excellent condition. No other information could be located.

The mixed-use building at 3401-19 SE Belmont Street featured the conversion of two stores. 3409 SE Belmont converted August of 1942 into two residential units. 3415 SE Belmont converted December of 1942 into one residential unit and cost one hundred dollars. The building is a large Streetcar-Era commercial building from

1913 and in good condition. The building has lost some integrity with the removal of the clerestory windows and addition of HVAC units on the street façade. Historic Plumbing permits do exist but no other information could be located.⁸⁰

The single-family residence at 3450 SE Belmont Street converted to five apartments March of 1945 and today has been demolished for a large mixed-use building with the address 915 SE 35th Avenue. No other information about the site could be located.

The mixed-use building located at 4435-37 SE Belmont Street featured the conversion of one store unit at 4437 SE Belmont to residential use April of 1943. All units of 4435-4437 are now used as housing, although it is unclear how many units there are total. The apartment building is in good condition. No other information could be located.

The second story of the garage at 5141 SE Belmont Street was converted September of 1942 and the garage appears to still be in use as housing today. The garage is located at the site of 5133 SE Belmont but permits show that the garage at one point may have had a separate address. Due to the fact that this is an accessory dwelling unit, very little information is known about this

site. And since this is a garage located at the rear of the lot, the reconnaissance-level survey also did not provide much information. There are records of a Historic Plumbing permit attached to both the 5141 and 5133 address, verifying that this is indeed the correct site. The Historic

Plumbing permits demonstrate the construction of a garage during May of 1921 and the addition of a second story for a sleeping room to the garage September of 1922.⁸¹ A hastily installed chimney in December of 1922 would continue to plague the property through at least June of 1925 as inspectors continued to press the owner to fix or remove the chimney for safety. Permits do not show whether this issue was ever resolved, and the War Code issued permit provided little information besides the legality of a residence on the second story of the garage. The building appears to be in good condition.

The service station at 2003 SE Belmont Street which added a residential unit November of 1943 is still a gas station today. It is unclear if this building is the same building from before the 1940s, although given the style it is highly likely. No information about the site could be located.

The site of a dwelling conversion and trailer at 1335 SE Belmont Fall of 1942 is now the site of the Nature Conservancy and occupies more than a quarter of the block. The War Code permits state that a single-family home converted to 5 apartments and a trailer also could fit on the site. In comparison

to the remainder of the block, this lot is the only one with new development, demonstrating a likely state of disrepair when the Nature Conservancy took over the site in 1979.

Two store units transformed to housing units at the neighboring properties of 4500 SE Belmont Street and 4520 SE Belmont Street summer of 1944. Both of these buildings have since been demolished and new Colonial Revival commercial buildings from 1963 and 1972 respectively but in their place.

CASE STUDY ANALYSIS

The case studies of SE Ankeny and SE Belmont are small in comparison to the total number of addresses associated with the War Code Housing Program but do provide some insight into the legacy of the program. Both streets have a high retention rate of buildings (66% remaining along Ankeny and 75% remaining along Belmont) despite no outside force dictating preservation, proving the continued value of older buildings. Among those buildings preserved, many are still used as housing or remain in a subdivided state, demonstrating the continued value of various housing types. Four of the six remaining sites along SE Ankeny are still smaller residential units and five of the twelve remaining sites along SE Belmont are still smaller residential units. As both streets are located in southeast Portland, an area of Portland mostly spared from the large infrastructures projects of the 1960s and 1970s that demolished large swaths of single-family homes, it is unlikely that other areas of Portland may have as high a retention rate. For example, the buildings associated with the War Code Housing Program permits issued in southwest Portland are almost all gone as southwest Portland was involved in a large urban renewal project.

The case study can also show trends of later development. SE Ankeny conformed to the expected pattern: closer-in blocks of single-family homes and small stores were recently demolished to make way for large-scale housing and mixed-use buildings. This is on trend with Portland's desire to increase density near public transit and amenities. On the other hand, newer development along SE Belmont is from the late 1960s and 1970s and further away from the city center. I hypothesize that SE Belmont, a popular commercial street already in the 1940s, was already deemed an area ripe for development in the 1970s. Development within Portland has rarely been stagnant and commercial streets like Belmont continue to evolve each decade.

RELAXING THE BUILDING CODE

ANALYSIS OF EARLY BUILDING CODES

Portland's first building code of 1910 and modifications shortly after in 1918 set the standards for the city in terms of safety. The most attention is paid to the threat of fire as entire cities such as Chicago in 1871 and San Francisco in 1906 (following an earthquake) burned to the ground. The largest fire in Portland's history occurred in August of 1873 when a furniture shop downtown caught fire unexpectedly and burned through the city for roughly twelve hours, destroying over twenty-two blocks.⁸² Standards such as reinforcing masonry buildings or designing buildings to be easily accessible for persons of all abilities were not considerations during early iterations of Portland's building code. Therefore, this analysis of early building codes and War Code modifications focuses predominantly on mitigating fire hazards.

Fire is discussed in almost every Article in both the 1910 and 1918 War Codes in some way. When establishing the various classifications of buildings in "Part II: Buildings and Structures," the rankings start with "absolutely fireproof" and continue down to "semi-fireproof" and all the way to "frame buildings" entirely constructed of wood.⁸³ Each classification or grade of building is assigned limits to occupancy, height restrictions, and materials permitted in construction or alteration.⁸⁴ During this time in Portland, the only permissible materials for a completely fireproof building were "brick, porous or semi-porous terra cotta, or reinforced concrete...or other metal covering," which significantly limited the height of buildings if not using cast-iron or steel.⁸⁵ For public buildings with high occupancy such as a dance hall or

moving picture auditorium, an “Exit” sign was required, consisting of a lamp lighted by oil or electricity and emblazoned with the word “Exit” clearly visible.⁸⁶

Fire escapes are discussed at the end of the Building Codes of 1910 and 1918. The requirement of a fire escape is based upon a series of factors including building classification, building height, and square footage.⁸⁷ The example provided is for a Class VII Building, or one that is of timber construction. For Class I, II, and III buildings, or those either absolutely fireproof to semi-fireproof, a fire escape is only necessary in very large buildings, i.e. 3-4 stories with over 25,000 square feet per floor to 15-16 stories with over 5,000 square feet per floor. Only one additional escape needed to be added if increasing square footage by 33% or more.⁸⁸ The preceding requirements indicate minimal attention to the means of egress required for public buildings or private buildings with high occupancy. By 1918, the Building Code increased the need for exterior fire escapes in buildings taller than twelve stories regardless of square footage but decreased the need for an external fire escape in Class VII buildings by changing the requirement to three stories with over 7,500 square feet.⁸⁹

The 1910 and 1918 Building Codes also required the use of shutters, blinds, and doors to stop the spread of fire.⁹⁰ The 1918 Building Code goes into detail on fire doors, shutters, and metal frames for windows instead of wood frames. The particular use of cast-iron shutters in preventing the spread of fire can be attributed to increased attention to fire safety in 1918.⁹¹

Like every major urban center, Portland continued to experience fires both large and small each year. Technological updates in building materials such as gypsum lath board in the 1930s improved safety when used, but no building code update occurred. Documents show a discussion occurring as far back as 1933 between the Building Inspector, Portland's Mayor, and the National Lumber Manufacturer's Association regarding the need to update Portland's building code; however, no changes were made.⁹² Rapid construction of housing projects and the housing of war-industry workers in converted buildings forced a building code update in 1942 through the War Code.

WAR CODE MODIFICATIONS

The building code update is laid out in Article 13 of the 1942 War Code and "relaxed" existing codes to increase available housing for war industry workers. This "relaxation" is truly a misnomer as the new standards were more stringent than the outdated Building Code of 1918 still in effect until June of 1942. Article 13 (see Appendix A) included updates regarding building materials while relaxing the requirements for square footage of units, the allowed number of units in an individual building, and the allowance of garages, trailers, and outbuildings as housing.

Many subsections of Article 13 establish the approved forms of housing. Section 22-1302 establishes the minimum floor area required for the various types of rooms created through the War Code Housing Program. This subsection prevents the overcrowding of small rooms, therefore lowering the life-safety risk to occupants as overcrowding can prevent safe egress. For example, a studio apartment cannot be smaller than 100 square feet for a single individual or 150 square feet for two people; however, if a unit possesses the minimum of 150 square feet already

established, an additional bed may be added for each 40 square feet of additional space.⁹³ Subsections 22-1315 and 22-1316 detail stipulations for the use of commercial spaces, garages, and trailers as these building types had different compulsory floor areas, proximity to other structures, and access to bathroom facilities.⁹⁴ For example, the location and use of trailers on lots, including the proximity of trailers to each other, installation of metal cans for combustible trash, and the prohibition of gasoline stoves all helped to prevent the spread of a potential fire.⁹⁵ Section 22-1305 codifies the requirements for sanitary conveniences to serve no more than 12 individuals and requires easy accessibility. A lack of proper sanitary conveniences could result in the spread of disease, a risk no one wanted to take.

Other subsections of the Article 13 identify mandatory building materials within War Code Housing units. Section 22-1306 demands the floor of water closets must be covered in a waterproof material or two coats of paint. Section 22-1311 requires corridors in multi-dwelling residences to cover the walls and ceilings with wood lath and plaster or other material equally fire resistant.⁹⁶ This requirement proved difficult for some owners and the Appeals Board rejected many permits for failure to comply with this subsection. Section 22-1315 requires “plastered partitions or gypsum boards attached to wood studs, or partitions having a greater fire resistance” in converted commercial buildings.⁹⁷

Article 13 also dictates administrative processes related to housing. Section 22-1317 relays the cost to obtain a building permit for each type of unit. Sections 22-1318 and 1319 establish the Emergency Housing Board and Appellate Division of the Housing Code

Commission. Section 22-1320 establishes the limited duration of approved housing units to the “present national emergency” and that the building will be returned to its previous state “within six months after the termination of the present wars against the United States and a declaration of peace,” is signed.⁹⁸ In attempting to regulate the Program’s existence, Portland extended the applicable implementation of the War Code Housing Program by linking it to peace agreements. No one could predict the complex state of affairs in Europe and the Pacific at the conclusion of the war as nations looked to avoid the system of reparations from World War I that arguably led to World War II while still demanding some reconciliation measures. It took years for peace treaties to be negotiated. Although not all parties had signed peace treaties, Article 13 was amended May of 1950 to no longer issue permits after June of 1950.⁹⁹

Most importantly, many subsections discuss life-safety for tenants through various requirements. Sections 22-1303, 22-1304, and 22-1307 state necessary light, ventilation, and ceiling requirements for all War Code Housing Program units, something especially important as many rooms were carved out of existing spaces. Windows are required, or at least a skylight or glass panel in a door, in all rooms used for living purposes to provide light and ventilation.¹⁰⁰ Permissible ceiling heights are only allowed to be 10% less than in the previous code for living rooms and bathrooms and within garages and basements at least a minimum of seven feet.¹⁰¹ Cooking appliances are not allowed in a closet. Section 22-1309 prohibits the use of the third story of a frame building as living space such as a bedroom or living room which is stricter than the 1910 and 1918 codes.¹⁰² Article 13 is also the first mention of a “Means of Egress” for

dwellings more than one story in height and requires at least two exits be available to each dwelling unit. This is a significant increase from the 1910 and 1918 Building Codes that required only two interior stairwells for some buildings.¹⁰³ This is particularly important because it essentially mandates the use of exterior fire escapes in apartments as one exit would be the door and the other the window.

The 1942 Building Code and influx of residents does not appear to have significantly exposed Portland's buildings and its residents to increased risk of fire. Newspaper articles from the *Oregonian* between 1942-1946 do not show an increase in building fires and actually encouraged a discussion about fire prevention amongst families. A search for the words "flame" and "fire" in the years of 1942-1946 of the *Oregonian* only displayed twelve building fires within those four years.¹⁰⁴

REJECTED PERMIT APPLICATIONS

The City rejected some permit applications over the course of the War Code Housing Program. Meeting minutes from the Board of Appeals provides detailed insight into the various reasons for rejection. The Appellate Board met weekly to discuss potential alterations needed to approve a project for construction, often with the Fire Chief in attendance. The following three examples provide a glimpse into the process and dilemmas faced by board members.

The owners of 2131 NW Glisan desired to convert their fourplex into eight apartment units in July of 1943. The list of problems cited in the appeal is quite lengthy with seven deficiencies, including inadequate area for each unit, inadequate side yards, lack of ventilation and light, and lack of egress from units. The meeting minutes candidly describe the

conversations between board members and building owners, including a declaration that, “if this was not an emergency he (Oscar Wayman, Chairman of the Appellate Division of the Housing Code Commission) feels sure that the Division would not consider this case at all,” due to the plethora of problems.¹⁰⁵ The case was then reheard in August of 1943 and provisionally approved as a conversion to seven apartment units. It was then brought back to the appeals board in November of 1943 at the request of the owners to return to a plan of eight apartment units. The appeal was granted with the provision that the exterior doors be made to swing outward ensuring a better means of egress. Previous issues related to the size of units were dropped due to the otherwise sound nature of the building and the Board’s desire to approve additional housing.¹⁰⁶

Another rejected permit was for the conversion of a hospital at 616 NW 18th Avenue into twenty apartments in September of 1943. Although all building code issues with the application were resolved, the permit was still denied based on the premise that hospital beds were also needed at the time. The discussion among board members illustrates some of the challenges facing the City at the time. One commissioner claims it would be “foolish” to convert a hospital to housing and it is the “responsibility” of the Commission to think of the whole city.¹⁰⁷

Another commissioner counters back that it is not the Commission’s “business” to determine whether another use is of higher need but to simply determine whether the permit complies with

code.¹⁰⁸ This appellate process was not distant from the situation like many of the National Housing Agency employees in Washington, DC urging more housing; they were Portland residents striving to do what they thought best for their city and its residents.

The use of a restaurant building as three apartments and seven basement sleeping rooms was rejected in April of 1942 prior to the existence of the War Code Housing Program. The location of the building along NW St. Helens Road is important as it was extremely close to the West Oregon Lumber Company, and executives within the company purchased the site earlier in 1942 with the express intent of using it as housing. A letter from the Personnel Director of West Oregon Lumber Company was read at the appellate hearing as further evidence justifying the need of this housing complex.¹⁰⁹ In the end the permit was denied due to fire concerns, as the ceilings, floors, and walls did not meet the requirement for lath and plaster, nor was the yard adequately sized for means of egress.¹¹⁰ It is not clear if the owners applied (and were again rejected) for a permit after the creation of the War Code Housing Program and relaxation of building code standards, but no permit was ever issued for the site.

In conclusion, Article 13 of the War Code of 1942 was not a significant relaxation of the building code. The building codes of 1910 and 1918 were outdated and did not reflect recent advances in building materials. This temporary measure was only intended to last through the war years and permit the needed construction to house war-industry workers until a more formal code could be adopted later.

POTENTIAL BUILDING CODE MODIFICATIONS

Current Building Code and Fire Code Standards are much more complex than earlier twentieth century editions. The Building Codes of 1910, 1918, and 1942 are all less than two hundred pages while today's code is several thousand pages. This is a result of both increased options, such as building materials, and of new requirements added to the code. New safety standards like reinforcing masonry buildings and equity measures like the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 complicate the reuse of older existing buildings by requiring compliance with standards nonexistent and unforeseen at the time of the building's construction. In order to further the goals of preservation, density, and affordable housing, Portland needs to reexamine its Building and Fire Code for potential exemptions applicable to older existing structures.

The City of Portland's Fire Code ratified in 2016 follows the International Fire Code Standards and is listed as Portland's Building Code regarding Title 31: Fire Regulation. The Fire Code is a lengthy 67 chapters covering everything from dry cleaning centers and fruit and crop ripening to liquefied petroleum gases. For the purposes of this study, the research focus is on Chapter 3: General Requirements; Chapter 6: Building Services and Systems; Chapter 7: Fire and Smoke Protection Features; Chapter 9: Fire Protection Systems, Chapter 10: Means of Egress; and Chapter 11: Fire and Life Safety Requirements for Existing Buildings. Chapter 3 is an example of common-sense standards now required to be placed in writing. General Requirements include the prohibition of large open flames and smoking near highly combustible materials, storage of goods, and intentionally creating hazards for firefighters.¹¹¹ Chapter 6

discusses systems usually found in commercial buildings, such as hood vents and elevators, while also detailing requirements for battery and electrical failure.¹¹² Chapter 7 lists the requirements for construction to be fire-resistant.¹¹³ Chapter 9 details fire protections systems required in new construction, such as automatic sprinklers regulated by number of units and square footage, standpipe systems, portable fire extinguishers, fire alarm detection systems, and individual smoke alarms.¹¹⁴ Chapter 10 highlights the various means of egress required for all buildings except detached single-family homes or townhouses less than three stores above grade plane.¹¹⁵ Notable updates include exit ramps compliant with ADA standards, grandstands and bleachers, and lighting. Chapter 11 discusses necessary updates to existing buildings to fulfill fire and life safety requirements such as means of egress, sprinkler systems, and smoke alarms.¹¹⁶ It is important to note that there are special exemptions for historic buildings under Section R119: Historic Buildings of the Oregon Residential Specialty Code from 2017. It states:

repairs, alterations and additions necessary for the preservation, restoration, rehabilitation or continued use of an historical building may be made without conforming to all the requirements of this code when authorized by the building official, provided: 1. The building has been officially designated an historic building; 2. Unsafe conditions are corrected; 3. The restored building will be no more hazardous based on life, fire safety and sanitation than the existing building; 4. The building official seeks the advice of the State of Oregon Historic Preservation Office.¹¹⁷

This does allow for the reuse of historical buildings without complying with all requirements listed in Portland's Fire Code, but with a few caveats. The current system for designation as a historic resource in Oregon is broken as it requires owner consent and is directly tied to the National Register of Historic Places. The National Register is generally an honorific designation; in Oregon, it is connected to land use. Future legislation may modify Portland's system for local historic designation to be more easily obtained, as well as require design and demolition review to the resource. The exemption is reliant upon approval by a building official, so it may not gain approval depending on the interpretation of said official. It would be best to codify a few exemptions for all historic resources and existing buildings to prevent wasting unnecessary time reviewing similar permit applications or redesign efforts doomed to fail.

Portland's current fire code discourages the conversion of single-family homes or duplexes to multi-family dwelling units because of fire sprinkler requirements. Current code requires a NFPA 13R fire sprinkler system for any residential building housing more than two families and four stories or less.¹¹⁸ The NFPA 13R fire sprinkler system requires a separate piping system that supports a minimum of ten minutes of water supply.¹¹⁹ This poses a huge financial challenge to developers of existing sites. It also requires garages to contain a sprinkler. In comparison, the less stringent NFPA 13D fire sprinkler system currently permitted in one and two family dwellings does not require a separate sprinkler system or a garage sprinkler and still provides seven minutes of water supply to allow for safe egress.¹²⁰ The NFPA 13D fire sprinkler

system is less likely to protect the home from damage. Allowing for NFPA 13D fire sprinkler systems in residences with up to four units would further encourage internal conversions.

Portland's requirement of commercial-grade fire alarms in residential buildings with more than two units also stymies the use of internal conversions to create density. A commercial-grade fire alarm requires an interconnected alarm system emitting both visual and auditory alarms.¹²¹ The alarm can sense both heat and smoke and the central control panel will communicate the location of the fire to the Fire Department. This very high-tech system is clearly necessary for large buildings with a high number of occupants but is arguably not necessary for dwellings with four or fewer units. Residential-grade fire alarms will still notify occupants of a fire and these buildings would likely be small enough to not cause confusion from the Fire Department as to the location of the fire.

Another inhibitor to internal conversions is the requirement of a commercial-grade elevator in multi-family dwellings with more than four units.¹²² In parts of the country and the world, an elevator is not even a requirement in residential buildings, let alone a commercial-grade elevator. Commercial-grade elevators are more expensive, require more area, and require maintenance more regularly. Commercial-grade elevators do provide accessibility for wheelchairs and have a higher weight limit than residential elevators. While one should not advocate for a multitude of buildings limiting accessibility to the upper floors, it is not unreasonable for a small, two- or three-story multi-family building to have only a residential-grade elevator only.

This list of suggestions is certainly not all inclusive but is a starting point for reexamining building and fire code standards for historic resources and small multi-family dwellings. If Portland wishes to densify without demolition, such allowances will need to be made.

POLICY AMENDMENTS

CURRENT ZONING

Portland’s current zoning code is not serving the growing city well. “Current zoning in nearly half of the city’s land area limits development to a single house,” on a large lot.¹²³ In fact, no area between the Willamette River and I-205 is zoned for High Density Residential despite the east portion of Portland containing much developable land close to amenities. In order to fix these challenges prohibiting densification, city planners are currently considering four proposals in various stages of development each aiming to address one portion of the larger issue.

BETTER HOUSING BY DESIGN

Better Housing by Design is an update to Portland’s zoning code that revises development and design standards for multi-dwelling residential zones outside the Central City. The goals of this project are to increase affordability of households, design for people of all ages and abilities, create open space and green elements, keep context and building characteristics in mind, and create street and pedestrian connections in alignment with the 2035 Comprehensive Plan.¹²⁴ The zoning code changes proposed by Better Housing by Design only apply in a few specified neighborhoods and major transit corridors, such as the Alphabet District and SE Powell Boulevard. These areas are targeted because of the existing infrastructure such as public transit,

schools, grocery stores, and amenities. It is projected that more than 23,000 new housing units will be created in multi-dwelling zones outside the Central City by 2035.¹²⁵

Better Housing by Design promotes creating four new multi-dwelling residential zones, based not upon number of units but upon building scale.¹²⁶ The zones are designed to create a buffer between existing single-family zoned areas and newer high-density areas through gradually increasing floor area ratios (FAR).¹²⁷ RM1 is a low-scale transitional zone with an FAR of 1 to 1; RM2 is a medium-scale zone allowing up to four stories with an FAR of 1.5 to 1; RM3 is high density zone with an FAR of 2 to 1; and RM4 is a high density zone with an FAR of 4 to 1.¹²⁸ These new zones would include specifications about building design, accessibility, green space, and connectivity to the surrounding areas. Bonus FAR may be allowed for affordable units or if transferring FAR from a historic resource.¹²⁹

Better Housing by Design is a crucial step in the larger picture, updating multi-dwelling zones for new construction; however, it does not address conversion of existing buildings into multi-dwelling units. It does promote the transfer of FAR from Historic Resources to new development, therefore offering a financial incentive to historic resources, but it is a onetime only deal.

RESIDENTIAL INFILL PROJECT

The Residential Infill Project (RIP) will alter zoning code by increasing development options within single-family neighborhoods and aims to grow the supply of available housing units through infill. The three proposed amendments reduce the scale of houses, create more

housing options, and allow for further development on narrow lots.¹³⁰ These proposals are in tandem with the goals of density and preservation but are mostly designed to apply to new construction with little incentives for preservation.

The first amendment is to reduce the scale of newly constructed houses. It is a reactionary measure to prevent the demolition of small homes and replace them with much larger buildings disproportionate to the surrounding buildings. The proposal changes the allowed size of a building to be based on floor area ratio, measures the height of the building from the lowest grade, increases the setback from ten to fifteen feet, and slightly alters allowed building design.¹³¹ Although this is an attempt to reduce scale, the lack of further discussion regarding building design will allow incompatible large development to continue. For example, there is no mention of the roof shape or slope. Since a certain height of the building is required, this proposal would allow for the construction of large block homes with flat roofs to maximize FAR.

The second amendment looks to create more housing opportunities through an overlay zone, increasing density through infill. There are four proposed structures allowable within the overlay zone, including two different models of homes with ADUs, a duplex, and a triplex on a corner lot. This overlay zone would only apply to residential properties within the core of the city, close to public transit, and close to amenities.¹³² An additional bonus of 0.1 FAR would be allowed for existing structures looking to increase density through ADUs, although the proposal explicitly discourages internal conversions.¹³³ An entire page of the Discussion Draft details the “uniquely challenging and costly” nature of internal conversions while explaining that structures

“may require extensive work to upgrade the construction to meet current building code requirements,” and should only be undertaken by those with “specialized knowledge.”¹³⁴ The page does list the exceptions to code requirements and flexibility of a few provisions, but overall conveys that RIP believes infill can only be achieved through new construction.

The third and final amendment is to create more housing through further development on already-developed lots. The draft proposes a small FAR bonus of 0.1 for affordable housing, promotes the implementation of cottage cluster development to build multiple houses on one site, eliminate garage requirements, and rezone narrow lots to permit more development between and behind existing homes.¹³⁵ All of these amendments state they promote retaining existing structures on lots but do not propose ways to do so.

RIP began as a decent piece of legislation that was then transformed into an amendment lacking design and promoting the very thing it aims to prevent: demolition. RIP received bad press coverage in local newspapers and is not supported by many groups that initially championed the amendment in 2015.¹³⁶ BDS estimates the program would only result in about 85 projects each year, a small number in comparison to the stated need of 123,000 units by 2035.¹³⁷

DESIGN OVERLAY ZONE AMENDMENT

The Design Overlay Zone Amendment (DOZA) updates the existing zoning code for design review within high-density areas. The goal of DOZA is to “ensure quality, people oriented development in our most populated, growing and vibrant places” in alignment with the 2035 Comprehensive Plan and Climate Action Plan.¹³⁸ DOZA updates the locations where the design overlay applies, revises the process for reviewing projects into two clear tracts, establishes clear standards and guidelines for evaluating projects, and clarifies administrative rules.¹³⁹

Design overlay applies to centers of civic life, most often mixed-use and multi-dwelling zones, within Portland. Projections of Portland’s population estimate a growth of 123,000 households by 2035 with 61% of the projected necessary new housing units likely falling within the proposed design overlay zone.¹⁴⁰ It is critical that this increase in dwelling units be done thoughtfully and in relation to the existing fabric of the city. Buildings out of context and out of character with their surrounding environment stand out and create an undesirable streetscape, potentially turning a profitable location into an undesirable one. The design overlay focuses on pattern areas such as Central City and Gateway, town and neighborhood centers, civic and neighborhood corridors, and transit stations.¹⁴¹ These updates allow the city to be growth-

oriented and forward-thinking in planning efforts while incorporating the community into the design process.¹⁴²

The Design Commission identified three tenets to guide future design: context, public realm, and quality.¹⁴³ These tenets shape how the imprecise guidelines established by city planners can be translated to enforceable design standards such as site planning, building massing, street frontage, and façade for enforcement by reviewers.¹⁴⁴ In order to gain approval of either an alteration or a new development project, there are certain required standards plus a host of other optional standards. One can pick and choose from the “menu” of optional standards to reach the necessary number of “points,” or standards met, and thus gain approval of the project. Required standards are design characteristics critical to achieving a people-oriented center and include items like main entrance location, roof pitch, weather protection, and building materials.¹⁴⁵ Optional standards include items like bird-glazing windows, pedestrian roll-up door, murals, Eco roof, and large common outdoor area.¹⁴⁶ Often these optional standards provide a greater benefit to the public and the environment but can be more difficult to achieve due to financial costs, which is why there is a list of over thirty options from which developers may choose.

DOZA recognizes the value of older buildings but does not provide clear incentives for preserving them. The current language of DOZA addresses preserving part of a structure as an alteration or addition and therefore lowering the level of design oversight, accepting fewer

standards than new construction, and allowing a greater flexibility in materials to incorporate the existing materials.¹⁴⁷ Three of the optional standards on the “menu” to fulfill design requirements are related to preserving buildings and facades but designers may choose to reach their necessary point total in other, often less expensive ways.¹⁴⁸ The first preservation-related design standard is the preservation of more than 50 percent of the existing façade of a certain sized building, resulting in three points.¹⁴⁹ The second is the vertical extension of existing building columns on an alteration or addition, continuing the vertical pattern and helping blend the new with the old.¹⁵⁰ This is worth only one point. The last is placement of a plaque on buildings more than fifty years old and is worth one point.¹⁵¹ As one can see from the examples above, optional standards involving preservation vary widely in cost of implementation and point yield.

DOZA is a crucial update among many. The implementation of smart design in our most heavily trafficked areas and in our pinpointed areas of growth will create friendly, walkable pockets within the larger city of Portland. The amendment falls short, though, in its incorporation of existing resources to alterations and new development. The draft minimizes preservation incentives and appears to promote demolition and new construction to achieve 2035 Comprehensive Goals. The design overlay certainly does not apply to the entire city but does guide design policies in often historical areas such as the Central City and transit corridors established by the electric streetcars in the early twentieth century.

HISTORIC RESOURCES CODE PROJECT

The Historic Resources Code Project (HRCP) aims to update aspects related to historic resources in Portland’s zoning code including inventorying and designating resources, the protections placed on designated resources, incentives for preservation, and administrative updates. The city’s historic resources code has not been comprehensively evaluated since 1995. Certain updates in the HRCP are an integral piece of the dense and affordable housing discussion through three incentives located in Chapter 33.445.710 C: Incentives.

HRCP allows the transfer of density and floor area ratio (FAR) from historic resources to other buildings. Many older buildings and historic resources are not maximizing the full potential of their FAR and therefore are attractive to developers. This incentive allows the transfer of FAR to another site in multi-dwelling zones, commercial/mixed use zones, employment zones, and the Central City.¹⁵² This means that a historic resource could sell its additional density to another property nearby. Transferring FAR to other sites protects the existing historic resource from demolition, provides a large, one-time revenue stream to the historic resource, and allows the density to get used at a different site possibly more compatible to larger developments.

HRCP establishes no maximum limit on the number of dwelling units on the site of a Landmark or within a District zoned residentially as long as the historic resource is not demolished to do so.¹⁵³ By allowing Landmarks and Districts to be developed rather than be demolished, owners can maximize the resources potential while preserving the historic fabric. Not all older buildings are small or located on small lots; many are quite large with the potential

for internal conversions and with large backyards able to accommodate one or more accessory dwelling units. There is no limit on the housing types allowed, implying that dwelling units could be created through internal conversions, alterations, additions, or detached structures.¹⁵⁴

HRCP promotes adaptive reuse through new extensive uses permitted in various zones throughout the city. Permitted uses range from services like daycare and retail space to office, manufacturing, production, and major event entertainment.¹⁵⁵ Not all uses are allowed in every zone, as one would not want to encourage a major event space in a residential neighborhood, but overall the code encourages utilizing existing structures for new functions.

Although the stated goals of HRCP are not explicitly density or affordable housing but rather the continued preservation of historic resources, it is still a necessary component of the discussion and most closely related to the relaxations of building code under Article 13 of the War Code. HRCP incentivizes creatively increasing the number of dwelling units on a site and permits a structure to change uses, which were both critical components of War Code Housing Program. The case studies of SE Ankeny and SE Belmont illustrate that many of the remaining War Code Housing Program structures are already designated as historic resources or are eligible to be designated as historic resources. The HRCP would, in part, readopt policies that made these buildings so useful in the 1940s and make them more valuable today.

CONCLUSIONS

Portland's use of internal conversions, accessory dwelling units, and trailers provided immediate housing during a national emergency. The relaxation of building code allowed for smaller traditional housing forms and creative new housing forms. The code thoughtfully mandated the use of more recent building materials which increased the safety of occupants. Densification occurred close to public transit and existing amenities. The creation of more units occurred without the demolition of existing buildings and required fewer raw materials than new construction. Historic buildings are often defining features along streets and in neighborhoods, and this program promoted the preservation of such buildings and allowed for additional uses based on current need. And although created approximately seventy-five years ago, if it were to exist today, the War Code Housing Program would adhere to many of the goals outlined in Portland's 2035 Comprehensive Plan. City officials should look to such a historical example before making decisions about preservation and densification.

This terminal project scratches the surface of potential research about these buildings. Due to financial and time constraints, a thorough analysis of each site issued a permit could not be conducted. The case studies along SE Ankeny and SE Belmont show that many of these buildings still exist today and in their converted housing state. A complete examination of each site's history and digitization of records located at BDS should occur. Remaining converted sites should be included on an updated Historic Resource Inventory of Portland and protected by design and demolition review. This dataset provides homeowners, residents, city officials, and future researchers more information about each property than exists today. This dataset can be accessed online at the following website: pdxwarcodehousing.wordpress.com. The website will

be updated periodically with further information, and users of the data are encouraged to provide information they locate as well.

While Portland is not in a heightened wartime state, the city is facing an ongoing housing shortage that officials are struggling to address. Current policy allows the market to control nearly all aspects of new development, and thus new construction is often McMansions and luxury apartments likely to have the highest rate of return. Areas zoned for more modest multi-family dwelling units are outside the central city and further away from critical infrastructure. Many proposals are on the table to address these issues, but it is unclear when these proposals will be adopted, if they are adopted at all. A multi-pronged approach will most effectively address the housing issue by modifying the zoning code, historic resources code, building code, and fire code.

Portland could meet the current intense need for additional housing through internal conversions and accessory dwelling units. The War Code Housing Program created more than 6,000 housing units, and that during a time of rationing construction materials. In 2016, the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability commissioned a report to ascertain the viability of internal conversions.¹⁵⁶ The report discusses many of the same topics as this terminal project, including fire-sprinkler suppression systems and accessibility challenges.¹⁵⁷ The study was supposed to further the Residential Infill Project goals but instead got drowned out by new construction. The city should return to this report and conduct more before condoning the demolition of existing buildings in the name of densification. The building forms created through internal conversions (duplex, triplex, fourplex) are already proposed in zoning code updates for new construction.

The reuse of existing buildings and preservation of historic resources are not inherently at odds with affordable housing and density. The War Code Housing Program was a successful marriage of the two in 1940s Portland. Surely a similar solution can be found today, and there already is a guide for officials to follow. As then Commissioner Bill Bowes asked Portland residents in 1942, “What are you doing, Mr. and Mrs. Portland, about the extra room or family facility you have in your home...” today’s City Council could ask Portland residents whether they would like additional income through tenants in their home or backyard.¹⁵⁸ A similar program could spur the development Portland needs while preserving Portland’s unique historic fabric.

APPENDIX A: Article 13 of the 1942 War Code of the City of Portland

Article 13. Relaxing in certain particulars the housing and other codes and ordinances.

Section 22-1301. SCOPE OF ARTICLE. It is hereby determined that the application of the provisions hereof will be more in the interest of public safety, health and welfare than full compliance with the provisions of the zoning ordinance and the housing, building and other codes, therefore the provisions hereof wherever applicable shall supersede the provisions of any and all codes and ordinances of the city of Portland insofar as the provisions hereof apply, and during the time mentioned in section 22-1320 hereof the use or alteration of buildings and dwellings and the construction of new buildings designed to be used as apartments or housekeeping rooms or as single family dwellings may be in accordance with the regulations of the following sections, and the regulations of existing housing, building and other codes and ordinances if in conflict with the regulations of this article shall not apply to property which shall have been brought under the provisions hereof. In other particulars the buildings brought under the provisions of this article shall comply with the regulations of the housing, building and other codes and ordinances and nothing contained in this article shall be deemed to allow any person to construct, maintain or repair any premises without obtaining permits for such work as provided in the appropriate codes.

Section 22-1302. MINIMUM FLOOR AREAS. For buildings covered by this ordinance the minimum floor areas shall be as follows:

For a one-room apartment or housekeeping room, one hundred (100) square feet if for one person occupancy; one hundred fifty (150) square feet if for not more than two (2) persons.

For a kitchen, fifty (50) square feet.

For a bedroom in an apartment or family unit having two or more rooms, eighty (80) square feet.

It is provided that any apartment or housekeeping room unit having more than one room shall have one room with floor area of at least one hundred (100) square feet.

It is provided that in a one-room apartment or housekeeping room having less than one hundred fifty (150) square feet floor area, there shall be not more than one single bed.

In a one-room apartment or housekeeping room having one hundred fifty (150) square feet of floor area, there shall be not more than two (2) single beds or equivalent.

For each unit of floor area of forty (40) square feet in excess of one hundred fifty (150) square feet, a single bed may be added.

22-1301 to 22-1302

For an apartment or housekeeping room unit or family unit having more than one room, the number of beds shall be regulated the same as for a one-room apartment or housekeeping room, except the aggregate floor area of the rooms shall be used, not including the area of corridors and hallways.

It is further provided that no corridor or hallway shall be used for sleeping purposes.

It is to be understood that a single bed shall not exceed forty-two (42) inches in width and that a bed exceeding forty-two (42) inches in width shall be considered a double bed.

In determining the number of beds permitted, it shall be considered that two single beds equal one double bed.

Section 22-1303. LIGHT AND VENTILATION. All rooms used for living purposes shall have windows as required by the housing code but a tolerance not exceeding ten (10%) per cent will be allowed.

Windows used for the lighting and ventilating of living rooms and toilet rooms, if not opening directly on a street, yard or court as required by the housing code, shall not be considered as providing required window area unless such window opens directly to the outer air and is at least five (5) feet away from any wall of any building or fence.

A door opening to the outside having glass panels may have the glass area counted as window area provided that the acceptable glass area of the door shall not exceed one-third ($1/3$) of the minimum required window area.

The area of a skylight may be counted as window area if ventilation is adequately provided for.

Section 22-1304. CEILING HEIGHT. In the alteration or conversion of existing buildings to provide apartments, housekeeping room units or family units, the ceiling height of living rooms and of bath and toilet rooms above the cellar or basement shall be as required in the housing code but a tolerance of ten per cent (10%) will be allowed. For living rooms and toilet rooms in basements or cellars, see section 22-1306.

The ceiling heights for converted garages and shacks are excepted from the provision of this section, and the ceiling heights for the same are covered in section 22-1316.

Section 22-1305. SANITARY CONVENIENCES.

- (a) Within each apartment or housekeeping room unit in an existing building, there shall be provided a sink and a water closet; or in apartments or housekeeping room units not so arranged, sinks and water closets shall be provided as given in the following paragraphs:

22-1302 to 22-1305

No room, whether in an apartment, housekeeping unit or an independent sleeping room, in a basement or cellar, shall be used for living purposes of any kind if the floor of said room is below the level of the adjoining ground, unless each apartment, housekeeping unit or independent sleeping room has a door not less than two feet six inches (2'6") in width and six feet eight inches (6'8") in height, opening directly to the outside of the building, and there is a stair or ramp of wood or concrete extending from the space outside the door up to the grade. Any such ramp shall have a slope not greater than one (1) foot vertical to five (5) feet horizontal.

Any such housekeeping unit, apartment or independent sleeping room shall be lighted and ventilated as required by section 22-1303 hereof and no independent sleeping room or room of such apartment or housekeeping unit shall have the floor more than five (5) feet below the level of the adjoining ground.

The waterproof membrane called for in the housing code if concrete floors are laid on the ground will not be required for rooms in existing buildings, when such rooms are used for living purposes or are changed from other uses to living purposes or as bath or toilet rooms, provided such rooms are not damp in wet weather.

Partitions shall not be of light, flimsy or highly combustible material.

Section 22-1309. FRAME BUILDING THIRD STORY ROOMS. In a dwelling covered by this article and used for multiple dwelling purposes, no room above the second story of a frame building shall be used as a living room, bed room, housekeeping room or for any other living purpose.

Section 22-1310. MEANS OF EGRESS. In a dwelling covered by this article there shall be for each story above the first, at least two means of egress available for each apartment or housekeeping unit, and further provided that if the second story be the top story the second means of egress will not be required unless there are more than two apartments or housekeeping units in this story or more than ten (10) roomers and/or boarders lodged in the dwelling.

These means of egress shall be separated as widely as is practicable.

Where the number of apartments or housekeeping units above the first story does not exceed ten (10), one means of egress shall be by stair not less than three (3) feet in width and the second means of egress shall be a stair not less than two feet six inches (2'6") in width, an exterior wood stair not less than two (2) feet in width, or a fire escape.

The arrangement of the means of egress shall be made satisfactory to the Fire Marshal, who shall approve same if reasonably safe, and disallow if not reasonably safe, under the particular circumstances.

22-1308 to 22-1310

- (b) For apartments or housekeeping rooms in existing buildings not complying with paragraph (a), the following regulations shall apply:

When a water closet is conveniently located, it may serve not to exceed twelve (12) persons living in apartments or housekeeping rooms and the number of persons assumed to be served shall be the same as are allowed by the floor area regulations of section 22-1302.

There shall also be provided sinks for such apartments or housekeeping rooms on the same basis as provided for toilets.

- (c) Where there is in a basement or cellar a family unit or sleeping rooms independent of a family unit, a water closet in the first story may serve not to exceed three (3) such sleeping rooms or one (1) such family unit if the water closet is conveniently accessible. Under other conditions the water closet shall be in the basement or cellar.
- (d) For multiple dwellings covered by this article, there shall be provided at least one (1) bath tub or shower conveniently accessible and at least one (1) laundry tray in a location convenient for all family units, but such bath tub or shower and laundry tray shall not be required for converted stores, office or commercial buildings. See section 22-1315.

Section 22-1306. FLOORS OF BATH AND TOILET ROOMS. Bath and toilet rooms in existing buildings installed or used in connection with apartments or housekeeping room units, shall have floors and base of waterproof material as required by the housing code, or shall have the floor covered with linoleum, laid with waterproof cement.

In place of the foregoing, where the bath and toilet rooms have a floor of wood, if it is in good condition, it will be permissible to cover the floor with two (2) coats of lead and oil paint.

Section 22-1307. ROOM IN WHICH COOKING IS DONE. No room in connection with which cooking is done shall have a gas or electric plate or range or any cooking stove in a closet.

No electric fan or hood over the cooking stove, plate or range shall be required.

In a one-room family unit, a kitchen cabinet as required for a one-room family unit by the housing code shall not be required.

Section 22-1308. CELLAR OR BASEMENT ROOMS. In a dwelling covered by this article, any room used for living purposes shall have a ceiling height not less than seven (7) feet.

No room, whether in an apartment, housekeeping unit or an independent sleeping room, in a basement or cellar, shall be used for living purposes of any kind if the floor of said room is below the level of the adjoining ground, unless each apartment, housekeeping unit or independent sleeping room has a door not less than two feet six inches (2'6") in width and six feet eight inches (6'8") in height, opening directly to the outside of the building, and there is a stair or ramp of wood or concrete extending from the space outside the door up to the grade. Any such ramp shall have a slope not greater than one (1) foot vertical to five (5) feet horizontal.

Any such housekeeping unit, apartment or independent sleeping room shall be lighted and ventilated as required by section 22-1303 hereof and no independent sleeping room or room of such apartment or housekeeping unit shall have the floor more than five (5) feet below the level of the adjoining ground.

The waterproof membrane called for in the housing code if concrete floors are laid on the ground will not be required for rooms in existing buildings, when such rooms are used for living purposes or are changed from other uses to living purposes or as bath or toilet rooms, provided such rooms are not damp in wet weather.

Partitions shall not be of light, flimsy or highly combustible material.

Section 22-1309. FRAME BUILDING THIRD STORY ROOMS. In a dwelling covered by this article and used for multiple dwelling purposes, no room above the second story of a frame building shall be used as a living room, bed room, housekeeping room or for any other living purpose.

Section 22-1310. MEANS OF EGRESS. In a dwelling covered by this article there shall be for each story above the first, at least two means of egress available for each apartment or housekeeping unit, and further provided that if the second story be the top story the second means of egress will not be required unless there are more than two apartments or housekeeping units in this story or more than ten (10) roomers and/or boarders lodged in the dwelling.

These means of egress shall be separated as widely as is practicable.

Where the number of apartments or housekeeping units above the first story does not exceed ten (10), one means of egress shall be by stair not less than three (3) feet in width and the second means of egress shall be a stair not less than two feet six inches (2'6") in width, an exterior wood stair not less than two (2) feet in width, or a fire escape.

The arrangement of the means of egress shall be made satisfactory to the Fire Marshal, who shall approve same if reasonably safe, and disallow if not reasonably safe, under the particular circumstances.

22-1308 to 22-1310

Where not otherwise regulated in this article, the regulations for egress and stairs contained in the building code and in the housing code shall govern.

For means of egress from store, office or commercial buildings converted to dwelling use, see also section 22-1315.

Section 22-1311. CORRIDOR PROTECTION.

In any multiple dwelling covered by this article, except for store, office or commercial buildings converted to dwelling use (see section 22-1315), any corridor used by the public in the first story or in any story above, shall have its walls and ceiling covered with wood lath and plaster or other covering of equal or better fire resisting value. The spread of fire along the corridor, as well as into or from the corridor, shall be taken into consideration in determining fire resisting value.

The width of corridors in multiple dwellings covered by this article shall not be less than two feet six inches (2'6") for a corridor serving ten (10) or less family units, three (3) feet for more than ten (10) but less than sixteen (16) family units, and three feet six inches (3'6") for over sixteen (16) family units.

Section 22-1312. LOT COVERAGE, HEATER ROOMS, BASEMENT OR CELLAR CEILING PROTECTION, AND ZONING REGULATIONS.

Note: Section 22-1312 amended by ordinance No. 79446, passed and effective December 16, 1943.

- (a) Buildings may be converted for living purposes or altered to provide additional living quarters even though the lot area covered is in excess of that allowed by the housing code.
- (b) Heater room enclosures as required by the building code will not be required for existing heating plants of buildings altered under the terms of this ordinance.
- (c) Basement or cellar ceiling protection as required by the housing and building codes shall not be required for existing buildings altered under the terms of this ordinance.
- (d) Zoning regulations as covered in the housing code and zoning ordinance need not be complied with for existing buildings used or altered under the terms of this ordinance. This exemption shall not apply to the use of adjacent lands for additional garages or parking space.

Section 22-1313. NEW BUILDINGS.

Buildings constructed under the regulations of the existing building and housing codes, in full compliance with the regulations for a hotel or lodging house, may be used for housekeeping room purposes, if such rooms comply with sections 22-1302, 22-1303, 22-1305, and 22-1307 hereof.

Section 22-1314. ROOMERS IN SINGLE FAMILY DWELLINGS.

In a single family dwelling the number of roomers or boarders lodged shall not exceed ten (10) and no one shall be lodged above the second story.

22-1310 to 22-1314

Section 22-1315. STORE, OFFICE OR COMMERCIAL BUILDINGS CONVERTED TO DWELLING USES.

- (a) Existing buildings arranged for store, office and other commercial uses, if converted for family living units shall comply with the following regulations:

No living unit shall be located in the cellar or basement, on a balcony or a mezzanine floor.

Partitions separating one room from another in a family unit may extend from floor to ceiling if such room is lighted and ventilated by windows or skylights complying with section 22-1303, but living rooms not so arranged shall have separating them dwarf partitions not exceeding seven (7) feet in height with a distance from the top of the partition to the ceiling not less than two (2) feet.

Partitions separating one family unit from another or from a corridor shall be full height extending from floor to ceiling.

For converted buildings which have living quarters only in the first story, the partitions of the living quarters shall be of wood or better construction, with partitions separating one unit from another or one unit from a corridor, if of wood, constructed with two (2) thicknesses of wood with joints broken.

For converted buildings which have living quarters above the first story, new full height partitions utilized for living quarters in any story, shall be plastered partitions or gypsum boards attached to wood studs, or partitions having a greater fire resistance. No composition wall boards shall be used unless approved by the bureau of buildings and the fire marshal as being equally as good as the partitions above allowed.

The floor area of rooms enclosed by either full height or dwarf partitions shall conform with section 22-1302. Only as much space may be used for living purposes as may be properly lighted and ventilated by windows and skylights. The floor area used for living purposes shall not exceed eight times the area of the windows and skylights serving such floor area. At least forty-five (45%) per cent of the required area of windows and skylights shall be openable for ventilation. In lighting living rooms there may be utilized windows on or near a lot line provided that no other building on the same or adjoining property comes within five (5) feet of such window.

The basement ceiling is not required to be covered with plaster board and plaster or metal lath and plaster.

Sanitary conveniences shall be provided as required in section 22-1305, or existing toilet facilities if not located in a room with light and ventilation as required by the housing code may be used if such facilities comply with the regulations of the building code for the toilet room of a store, office or commercial building.

Laundry trays, bath tubs and showers are not required.

The regulations of section 22-1310 for means of egress shall be complied with.

Each family unit in the first story shall have a door opening directly to the outside of the building, or if not so arranged, the entrance door to a family unit shall open on to a public corridor which has two means of egress so arranged that it is possible from any entrance door of a family unit to go in either direction to a safe place of egress.

Stove pipes shall not run across a corridor. No chimney shall serve more than two family units.

(b) Dormitory rooms utilized for living purposes.

When a store, office or commercial building is converted for living uses and dormitory rooms are utilized, it shall be understood that a dormitory is a room, either undivided or divided into cubicles, which room is occupied by more than four (4) persons not related.

The area of the dormitory room shall comply with the regulations of section 22-1302.

Toilet facilities shall be provided on a basis of one (1) toilet and one (1) wash basin or sink for each group of fifteen (15) bunks or beds or fraction over a group.

Dormitory rooms shall be so arranged that there is cross ventilation and if the dormitory is divided into cubicles, the separation between the cubicles shall be by means of dwarf partitions not exceeding seven (7) feet in height.

A dormitory room shall comply with the regulations of section 22-1303 for light and ventilation, and section 22-1304, for ceiling height.

No cooking shall be allowed in a dormitory room.

The floor area of a cubicle in a dormitory shall be not less than sixty (60) square feet.

Section 22-1316. USE OF SMALL GARAGES AND SMALL SHACK BUILDINGS FOR DWELLING PURPOSES.

- (a) Converted to a family unit. Where small garages or small shack buildings are converted to a family unit, the following regulations shall govern:

The minimum floor area of the building shall be one hundred eighty (180) square feet.

The room sizes and window areas shall comply with the regulations of Sections 22-1302 and 22-1303.

The ceiling height of rooms used for living purposes shall average at least seven feet six inches (7' 6"). No portion of the building or room shall count as usable for living purposes if the ceiling height is less than seven (7) feet.

The walls of the building may be on or close to the lot line provided that there is at least five (5) feet of space from any window in such wall and any building on the same or the adjoining lot.

A sink and a water closet shall be provided in the building.

The floor may be of concrete laid on the ground without a waterproof membrane.

In other particulars the regulations of this article shall be applied.

- (b) Converted for Sleeping Rooms. When a small garage or shack building is converted for sleeping purposes only, the regulations of paragraph (a) shall be complied with except the minimum floor area shall be ninety (90) square feet, and not more than one (1) room is required, and if a water closet and wash basin are not provided within the building, the building shall be operated as an accessory to a dwelling on the same lot, in which dwelling there shall be conveniently accessible a water closet and wash basin for the occupants of the converted garage or shack.
- (c) Access Strip. The access strip required by the Housing Code is not required for a building covered by this section.

Section 22-1316.1 AUTOMOBILE TRAILERS USED FOR LIVING AND SLEEPING PURPOSES.

Note: Section 22-1316.1 added by Ordinance No. 77813 passed and effective September 10, 1942 and amended by Ordinance No. 77995, passed and effective November 5, 1942.

- (a) The number of trailers that may be located on the same lot with a dwelling and used for living or sleeping purposes, shall be limited to two (2) to a dwelling, provided that the lot on which such dwelling is located shall be not less in area than four thousand (4000) square feet for two trailers and three thousand three hundred (3300) square feet for one trailer. There shall be provided in the dwelling on the lot, at least one (1) toilet, one (1) sink, one (1) bath tub or shower and one (1) laundry tray.

A trailer shall be parked not closer to a street than the walls of the dwelling on the same lot which are closest to the street lot line and the trailer shall be not closer than ten (10) feet to any building or to any other trailer. The occupant of the dwelling shall pay a minimum water fee for the dwelling and for each trailer.

- (b) Trailers used for living or sleeping purposes may be located on the same property with a gasoline filling station under the following conditions:

The number of such trailers shall not exceed two (2) for each water closet located in the filling station and available for use by the trailer occupants. Separate toilet facilities shall be provided for each sex.

A trailer shall be located not closer than ten (10) feet to any other trailer or to any building of frame construction; or closer than five (5) feet to a rear or side lot line; or closer than twenty (20) feet to a street lot line if in a Class I, Class I Special or a Class II residential zone as established by the Zoning Ordinance.

There shall be in the filling station as many wash basins or sinks made available for the use of the trailer occupants as the number of water closets.

Note: Section 22-1316.1 (c) amended by Ordinance No. 78377 passed and effective February 11, 1943.

- (c) The following regulations shall apply both to trailers located on the same lot with a dwelling, as covered in paragraph (a) and to trailers on the same lot with a filling station, as covered in paragraph (b):

22-1316.1 (a) to (c)

The sanitary conveniences accessible to the occupants of the trailers shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.

The sanitary conveniences required by this Section for the use of the occupants of the trailers shall be accessible twenty-four hours a day.

The number of persons occupying the trailers and the residence or the filling station on the same lot shall not exceed twelve (12) for each water closet provided on the premises and accessible for use of such occupants.

The use of patented or chemical closets within a trailer is prohibited and any such closet shall be sealed.

Sinks, showers, wash basins, bath tubs or ice boxes inside a trailer shall not be used unless the waste water disposal has been arranged for in a manner approved by the Bureau of Health. This waste water shall be disposed of in such a manner that it will not be allowed to overflow or fall upon the ground.

The occupant of the dwelling or the manager of the filling station shall be responsible for the proper maintenance of these sanitary conveniences.

For the disposal of garbage and combustible waste materials, metal garbage cans equipped with close fitting metal covers shall be provided, not less than one (1) such can for two (2) trailers.

The electrical connections to and electrical wiring in a trailer shall comply with the present electrical code of the City of Portland and no electrical connection shall be made to a trailer without the approval of and a permit from the Electrical Division.

The use of gasoline stoves for cooking or heating purposes is prohibited. Other types of cooking or heating facilities, such as gas plate, wood stove, kerosene stove, may be used if properly installed and approved by the Fire Marshal.

No trailer shall be used for living or sleeping purposes unless a permit shall have first been obtained from the Bureau of Buildings by the occupant of the dwelling on the same lot or by the manager of the filling station lot on which the trailer is located. Such permit shall be posted in a conspicuous place on the trailer. For permit

Fees see Section 22-1317. In connection with the application for such permit, there shall be furnished a plot plan showing the location of the dwelling or filling station and the location of all trailers on the lot, the address of the lot, the name of the occupant of the dwelling or manager of the filling station; the names of the occupants of the trailer, the license number of the trailer; a list of the sanitary facilities provided in the dwelling or in the filling station for use of the occupants of the trailer; and the type of heating and cooking facilities within the trailer. The life of the permit shall be only for the duration of the present war emergency and the time limit agreement covered in Section 22-1320 shall be signed by the occupant of the dwelling or the manager of the filling station. If, after issuance of a permit, the trailer authorized thereunder is moved from the premises, such permit shall be void and another trailer may not be located on the premises until a new permit shall have been issued. The permit for a trailer may be revoked by the Health Inspector in the event of unsatisfactory sanitary maintenance. If the occupant of the dwelling or manager of the filling station is changed, a new permit and agreement to cover each trailer is required.

- (d) In connection with a filling station utilized by trailers for sleeping or living purposes, the filling station may be itself utilized for living or sleeping purposes, provided it complies with the regulations of this article for a dwelling.

Section 22-1317. BUILDING PERMIT.

Note: Section 22-1317 amended by Ordinance No. 78277, passed and effective February 11, 1943.

A building permit shall be taken out for the construction, conversion, alteration or use of any building coming under the terms of this ordinance even though no construction work is involved. The fee for a permit issued under the regulations of this article shall be in accordance with the following schedule:

<u>For each new or additional sleeping room not a part of a family unit</u>	<u>.50</u>

22-1316.1 (c) to 22-1317

<u>Dormitory for fifteen (15) or less persons</u>	3.00
<u>For each unit of ten (10) persons or part thereof over the first unit of fifteen (15)</u>	1.00
<u>Shack or garage converted to one family unit</u>	2.00
<u>Shack or garage converted for sleeping room only</u>	1.50
<u>Trailer, each</u>	1.50
<u>Minimum fee</u>	1.50

The owner shall furnish to the Bureau of Buildings information in duplicate as to the present uses of the existing building and as to the proposed uses. The owner shall also furnish any other information needed to apply properly the regulations of this article.

Generally, the information furnished shall consist of sketch floor plans of each floor used for living purposes, giving dimensions of rooms, size of windows, number, location and width of stairs, corridors and fire escapes, and the number and location of plumbing fixtures. Any changes in partitions or other construction shall be clearly indicated.

When a permit is issued, one copy of the plans and other information shall be returned to the owner and the other copy shall be retained by the Bureau of Buildings.

No sketch or plan need be furnished if the Inspector of Buildings finds that it is not needed. If no sketch or plan is furnished the permit shall show all alteration and/or new construction and, if a plan or sketch is furnished, all alterations and/or new construction shall be indicated thereon.

A separate record shall be kept of the permits issued under the regulations of this article.

Note: Section 22-1317 amended by adding following paragraph by ordinance no. 78593, passed and effective April 8, 1943.

In cases where governmental authorities propose to erect, improve or alter structures upon property owned or controlled by the government or any of its governmental agencies and decline to comply with the ordinance provisions of the city, during the present war period and for six months after a formal declaration of peace the Bureau of Buildings is hereby authorized to entertain consideration of such applications and accompanying plans and indicate the points of noncompliance, and suggest compliance, but if the government authorities nevertheless propose to proceed without complying, the Bureau of Buildings may issue a permit therefor but such permit shall have stamped thereon the following:

This permit is a courtesy permit to the United States Government or one of its governmental agencies for construction as indicated herein but this construction does not fully comply with city of Portland ordinance requirements, and the city therefore assumes no moral or other responsibility for the consequences of such noncompliance.

The Bureau of Buildings shall also endorse a reference to this ordinance. On building permits heretofore issued under circumstances like the above the Bureau of Buildings shall make a similar endorsement upon the copy of permit in the possession of said bureau.

22-1317

Section 22-1318. EMERGENCY HOUSING BOARD.

Note: Article 13 revised and amended by Ordinance No. 77600 passed and effective July 30, 1942.

An emergency housing board is hereby created, consisting of the chief of the bureau of buildings, the chief of the bureau of health, and the chief of the bureau of fire, or such other persons as may be delegated to represent such chiefs.

The emergency housing board hereby is given authority to allow deviations from the regulations of this article or of any ordinance or code provision during the time covered by this article, provided the decision of the board is unanimous, and it appears that such deviation will not constitute a menace to the public health or safety for the time this article is to be in effect and such deviation is necessary to provide additional housing facilities.

A permanent record of all decisions by said board shall be kept but the appeals to and action of the board may be informal except that it shall be in writing and signed by each member of the board. Where the board acts favorably on a case, a copy of the decision of the board shall be attached to the application for a building permit.

Where an appeal is not acted upon favorably, the appellant may lay the case before the appellate division of the housing code commission as provided by section 22-1319 hereof.

Section 22-1319. APPELLATE DIVISION OF THE HOUSING CODE COMMISSION. Any person whose application for a building permit or for a use permit has been disallowed after consideration by the emergency housing board, may appeal to the appellate division of the housing code commission.

The appellate division of the housing code commission shall be granted the same authority to allow deviations from the regulations of this article as are granted to it by ordinance no. 77483, the housing code, in connection with the regulations of the housing code.

The housing code commission shall be granted authority to decide review appeals of cases covered by this article on the same basis as is set forth in the housing code covering review appeals.

Appeals shall be made in the same manner as provided for in the housing code. It is to be understood, however, that the authority granted to the appellate division or the housing code commission does not cover the provisions of section 22-1320 (limit of time).

22-1318 to 22-1319

Section 22-1320. LIMIT OF TIME, AGREEMENT, ETC.

Note: Section 22-1320 added by Ordinance No. 77600, amended by Ordinance No. 82424 and Ordinance No. 88397, passed and effective December 23, 1948/

The provisions of this article shall be applicable only during the duration of the present national emergency and the owner or agent in charge of any premises coming under the regulations of this article or desiring so to do shall first sign an agreement approved by the City Attorney as to form that within six months after the termination of the present wars against the United States and a declaration of peace the owner or agent in charge shall change the premises and its use to comply with the housing, building and/or other codes and ordinances applicable at that time to existing or new buildings or that he shall cause the building or other improvement to be demolished or removed beyond the city limits and the permitted use to be discontinued or if the use of the building previous to the changes allowed under this article was a legal use under the then existing codes, to remodel the building or other improvement so as to restore the same to its previous use and condition.

No permit for the use, construction, renovation, alteration or change of any building or other improvement under the terms of this article shall be issued until the agreement above provided for shall have been executed, approved by the City Attorney, as to form and filed with the County Clerk of Multnomah County, Oregon, for record in the Deed Records of said county. The provisions of said agreement shall be made covenants running with the land. The fee for recording shall be paid by the owner of the building or by his agent. In case an unsatisfied mortgage, lien or other claim shall be against the property, a statement shall be attached to and made a part thereof signed by the mortgagee, licensee or other claimant indicating that he approves of the agreement and makes his mortgage, lien or other claim subject thereto. No permit for a building construction, alteration or use of premises under the terms of this article shall be issued until said agreement shall have been executed as above stated and filed with the County Clerk. Said agreement shall be deemed to be attached to the premises irrespective of any change of ownership or any mortgage or other lien or claim against the property.

It shall be unlawful for any person claiming to be the owner of such premises or entitled to sell the same to employ any agent for the sale of such property or to ratify any act of any agent in connection with the sale thereof, without having first received a written statement from such agent that he has been advised of the

existence of such permit. It shall be unlawful for any such person or agent to receive any earnest money on the sale of or to sell or encumber such property, without first obtaining and filing with the Bureau of Buildings of the City of Portland a written statement from the purchaser or person taking an encumbrance, that he has been informed of the existence of such permit and that he agrees to assume the liabilities imposed by this ordinance.

Nothing contained herein shall be taken or deemed to create any vested right and no action or expenditure of money or other act or thing shall estop or prevent the city from enforcing a removal or alteration of the premises and change of use to conform with the City codes and ordinances at the expiration of the time as herein provided.

The penal provisions of this code as recited in section 22-201 shall be applicable to any case where the provisions of this section are not complied with as herein provided.

Section 22-1321. REPEAL. Ordinance No. 77150, entitled "An Ordinance to amend ordinance no. 76947, the war code, passed by the council March 26, 1942, by adding thereto a new article to be known as article 13 and relating to the relaxing in certain particulars of the housing code and other codes and ordinances relating to buildings during the war emergency, and declaring an emergency", passed by the council May 7, 1942, is hereby repealed.

22-1320 to 22-1321.

Section 22-1322. MINOR DEVIATIONS, WHEN MAY BE ALLOWED.

Note: Section 22-1322 added by ordinance no. 78974, passed and effective July 29, 1943.

The Director of Bureau of Building Inspection and one assistant to be designated by him, such designation to be in writing and a counterpart thereof filed with the City Auditor, are hereby authorized to allow until July 15, 1944, minor deviations as herein provided in the matter of issuing building permits for changing, altering, or using existing buildings, provided that such deviation be initialed on the margin of the application for permit by said Director or by an assistant designated by him. In cases where the assistant approves the deviation, the initials of the Director shall be placed on the margin followed by the word "By" and the initials of the assistant. The deviations which may be thus allowed are as follows:

1. Window area deficiency not exceeding four square feet or in any case 20 per cent of the required area.
2. Allow one-half of the required window area for room to be located under the roof of an existing unenclosed porch or cornice.
3. Allow a deficiency of 5 per cent in a bedroom floor area.
4. Allow a deficiency of not to exceed 20 square feet in the required area of 150 square feet in one living room of an apartment, or a deficiency not to exceed 20 square feet in the area of a one-room apartment.
5. Allow a deficiency of six inches in the width of an existing room to be arranged for kitchen uses.
6. In Multiple dwellings with not to exceed four apartments, to allow the omission of the plasterboard and plaster protection of walls and ceilings in first and second story corridors if all inside stairs leading from the first to the second floor are either enclosed or are provided with a stair shut-off.

The enclosure or shut-off shall consist of a partition or partitions arranged to shut off the first story from the second story so that the spread of fire will be prevented and the partitions shall be covered on one side if an existing partition and on both sides if a new partition with plasterboard and plaster with doors of the enclosure or shut-off either fire doors, kalamein doors, or solid slab doors not less than 1-3/4 inch in thickness, equipped with self-closing devices.

Note: Article 13 added by ordinance no. 77150, passed May 7, 1942, and revised and amended by ordinance no. 77600, passed and effective July 30, 1942.

22-1322

Section 22-1323. CANCELLING ALTERATION AGREEMENTS.

Note: Section 22-1323 added by Ordinance No. 81387, passed and effective August 30, 1945.7

The Building Inspections Director is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the City a suitable document approved by the City Attorney as to form for cancelling and terminating the effect of any agreement entered into pursuant to the provisions of section 22-1320; provided that he shall find that the owner has fully performed the terms and provisions of said agreement on his part.

Section 22-1324. FURTHER ISSUANCE OF PERMITS UNDER THIS ARTICLE PROHIBITED ON AND AFTER JUNE 1, 1950.

Note: Section 22-1324 added by Ordinance No. 91650, passed May 16, 1950, effective June 16, 1950.7

Notwithstanding the provisions contained in this article authorizing issuance of permits including acceptance of agreements in conformity with Section 22-1320 on and after June 1, 1950, such agreements shall not be accepted and no further permits shall be issued under the terms and provisions of this article. From and after said date, construction, alteration and use shall be in accord with the terms and provisions of the Housing Code and other codes and ordinances of the City and full compliance therewith shall be mandatory, but this shall not be deemed to affect permits already issued nor agreements already accepted under this article.
